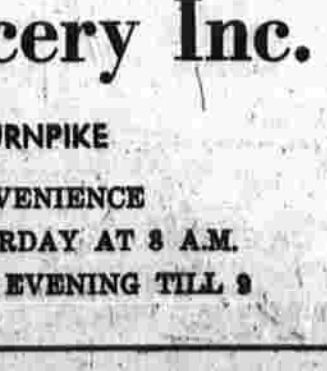

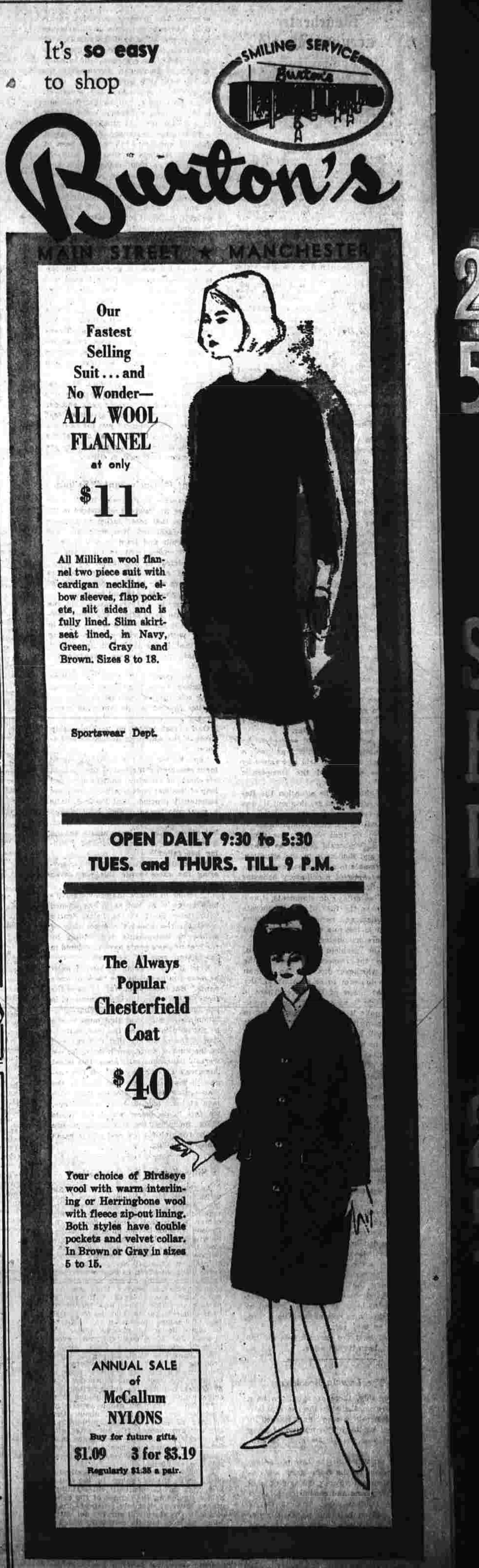

man. The prosecution, which apparently had obtained some of its evidence against the Gallos by illegal means, such as wiretapping, was glad to get these guilty pleas. The sentences will be handed out in December. Presumably the Gallos will still keep behaving themselves until then. And the sentence, when they come, can be for from one to three years, which may enforce their confinement in Brooklyn for that much longer. This mass surrender of one great gang of murderers—there have been at least 15 slayings in the war with the Profetas since 1960—makes a new kind of history for American jurisprudence. It has one rather ironic twist. The Gallos, it seems, were on the weaker and the losing side of the Brooklyn gang wars. The Profetas always seemed to wind up killing more Gallos and maintaining themselves as the big boss of the Brooklyn underworld. Presumably the Profetas are quite content to have the law step in and ratify the victory already won by Profetas guns and at least a truce to the vendetta type of war waged by the mad Gallos, who would apparently rather die than live in the same home as the Profetas. But the ugly question is: Having taken care of the weaker, losing Gallos, for an interval at least, what does the law do to the bigger and more powerful and more successful Profetas? That is not a real question. The real issue is that the law did manage, for once, to round up a whole gang and get it into one courtroom and give it at least some token punishment just for existing.
