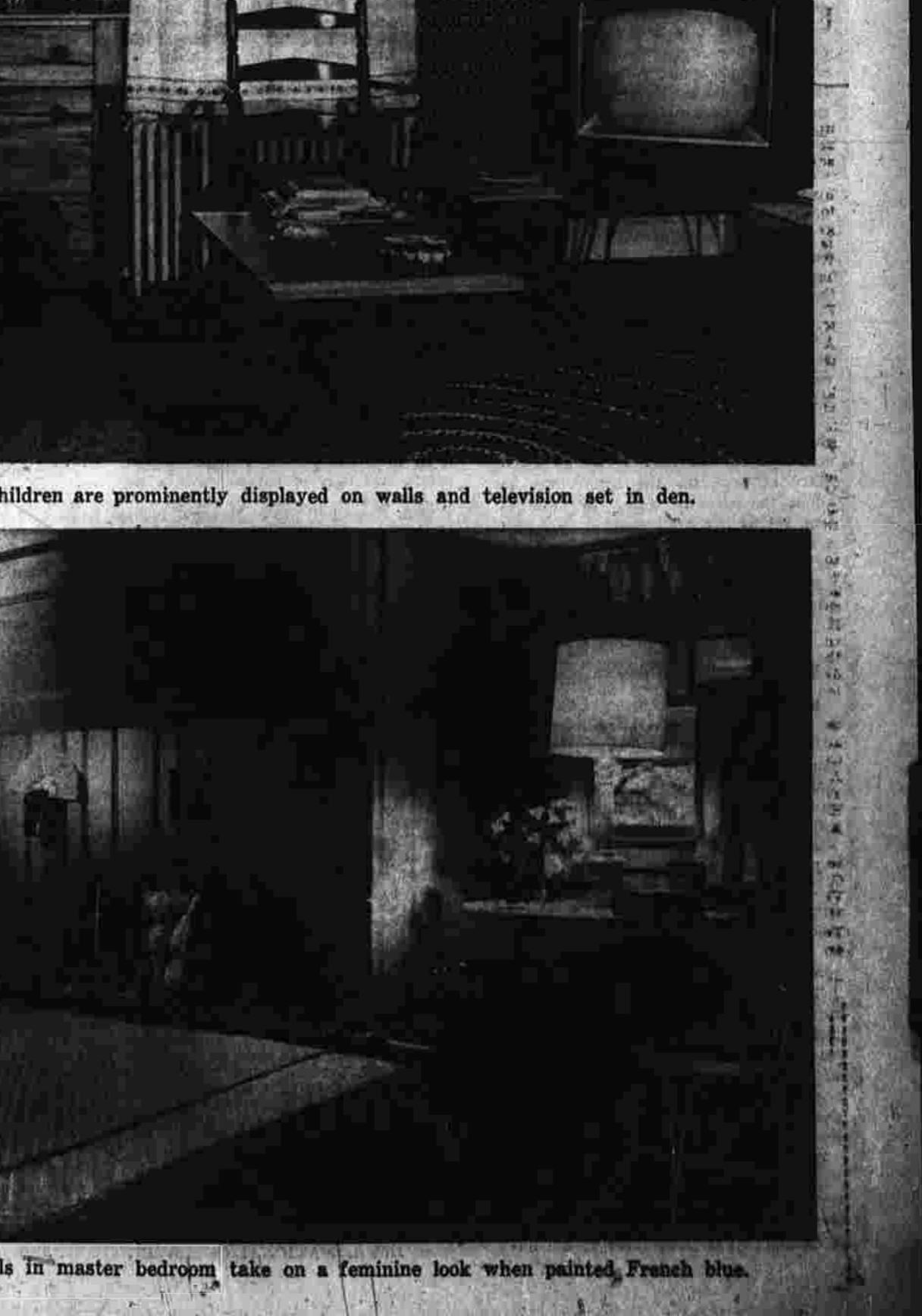

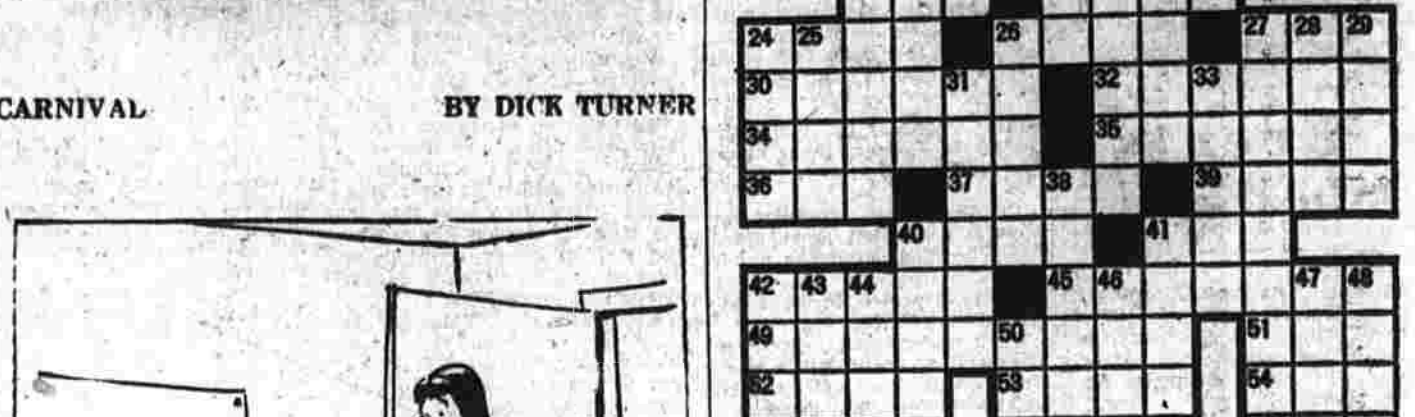

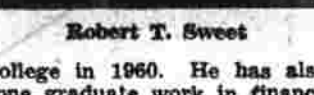

HOLLYWOOD (NEA) — Van Williams has made a disturbing discovery. He can walk down the streets of major cities in several countries and be recognized as a star of Burleside 6. Yet his name is not known among the industry's big-shots.

"I have a good friend who has great stature in the movies," handsome, green-eyed Van said. "We went to Las Vegas together and hardly anyone recognized him. They knew me though. Yet he could walk into any movie studio in town and get a part. I can't. Television is a matter of impressing the public. For movies you have to impress Hollywood."

I want to become a good actor, and work my way into feature films. Where else can you go and get paid for getting that experience before the cameras, and a chance to learn what goes on in the technical side?"

"The only trouble is, nobody's personality came through. Warner wanted us like a bunch of fish, so if one of us kicked up our heels, we could be replaced easily."

Olympic Preview Scheduled Monday

Olympics and Olympians past and present will be featured in "Olympic Preview," a one-hour color special on NBC-TV Monday from 10-11 p.m.

One of the stars of the 1960 Olympics, decathlon champion Rafer Johnson, will join with Bud Palmer, Jim Simpson and Bill Henry as commentators for the show. The four also form the broadcasting team for NBC-TV's two-week coverage of the 1964 Summer Olympic Games in Tokyo starting Oct. 10.

NBC-TV plans to cover the opening ceremonies live via the new Syncom III satellite (1 to 3 a.m.; 2 p.m. Japanese time that same day), and will present exclusive taped telecasts of Olympic events each evening while the Games are in progress, with 18 telecasts totaling 14 1/2 hours.

Motion picture film of the 1900 Games in Paris — the II Olympiad — will be shown during the historical segment of "Olympic Preview." The 64-year-old film was discovered in the National Archives in Washington, D.C., by Dick Auerbach, associate producer of NBC-TV's Olympic coverage.

Former Olympic champions to be seen in film clips include Paavo Nurmi, Johnny Weissmuller, Buster Crabbe, Babe Didrikson and Jesse Owens. Film and still pictures will review the origin of the Ancient Olympic Games in Greece and the modern-era revival by French Baron Pierre de Coubertin, leading to the first Olympic Games of the present cycle at Athens in 1896.

Other highlights of "Olympic Preview" will include: The closing ceremonies of the 1960 Games in Rome, with Avery Brundage, President of the International Olympic Committee, calling upon athletes of all countries to assemble at Tokyo for the 1964 Games;

Japan's preparations for staging the Olympics with construction of stadiums, pools, living quarters, highways and other facilities;

A report from Olympic Village by John Rich, NBC News correspondent in Tokyo;

Rafer Johnson reflecting on what it's like to compete in the Olympics;

Film clips of some of the outstanding contestants expected to compete this year, including C. K. Yang of Nationalist China, the favorite in the decathlon and 1960 runner-up to Johnson; Abebe Bikila of Ethiopia, defending champion in the marathon, who ran the 36 miles in bare feet four years ago; Peter Snell of New Zealand, 800-meter champion in 1960; Valery Brumel of Russia, world record-holder in the high jump, and swimmer Donna de Varona, the baby of the U.S. Olympic team in 1960 when she was 13-years-old;

The lighting of the Olympic torch at Olympia in Greece;

A roundtable discussion by the four commentators of new events in the 1964 Games, the records most likely to be broken and the overall schedule from Oct. 10 to 24.

Argentine-Born Rey Busy in TV Roles

HOLLYWOOD (NEA) — If Argentine actor Alejandro Rey hadn't been hungry in Las Vegas, he probably wouldn't be in Hollywood today.

Rey, a 37-year veteran of acting, is an intense, sensitive young man with huge brown eyes and flashing white teeth, who has played leading roles on the Buenos Aires stage in everything from Tennessee Williams' "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof" to Robert Anderson's "Tosca and Sympathy" to Lorca's "Blood Wedding." He has also starred in films and on television in Argentina and in Spain, where he spent several years.

Three years ago he flew back home from Europe for a 10-day visit which stretched into 10 months, during which he made two movies. Then he planned to return to Europe, but preceded it with a long sight-seeing trip that took in New York, parts of Canada, Chicago, St. Louis, the Grand Canyon and Las Vegas. All this despite the fact that Alejandro couldn't speak a word of English.

Today, in his accented, but excellent English, he recalls his problems ordering food in Las Vegas. "I didn't know how, I tried to speak French to the waiter, but that didn't help. Some people who spoke French and English helped me. We began to talk, they found I was an actor, and they suggested that I go to Hollywood to see Paul Kohner, an agent who speaks Spanish."

Rey, who never went to high school ("We have a high percentage of literacy — 97 per cent — in Argentina, even though many of us don't go to high school") has become so proficient in English in the three years he has lived in Hollywood that he reads books at the rate of one a day. And retains nearly everything he reads.

Oddly, his English in ordinary conversation has less accent than when he is performing. "You have to get in character. When you do, it's a fantastic experience. When I was doing that Naked City, I became the lonely Puerto Rican. One time I looked into a mirror and was shocked, because I saw

myself instead of the character I was in my mind. "But to get in character, you have to learn the words, then forget them. I don't think of the words when I act, so my English is worse. But character is the thing that breaks the barrier of language."
