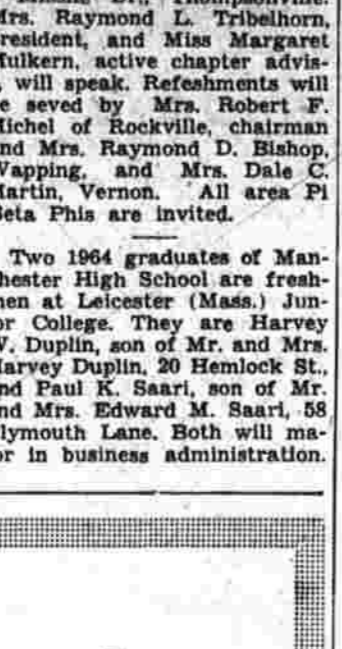

Threat to School in Queens

NEW YORK (AP) — A bomb threat against evacuation of pupils today from an elementary public school that is the center of an integration fight.

The children were sent out of P.S. 149 in Jackson Heights, Queens, shortly before noon as a precaution. They were to return to classes later in the afternoon.

The day school was established by the Parents and Teachers Association for children whose parents refused to be bused away from their neighborhood in the integration program.

The Parents and Taxpayers Coordinating Council announced today receipt of a letter from Sen. Barry Goldwater, which urged the school to be closed.

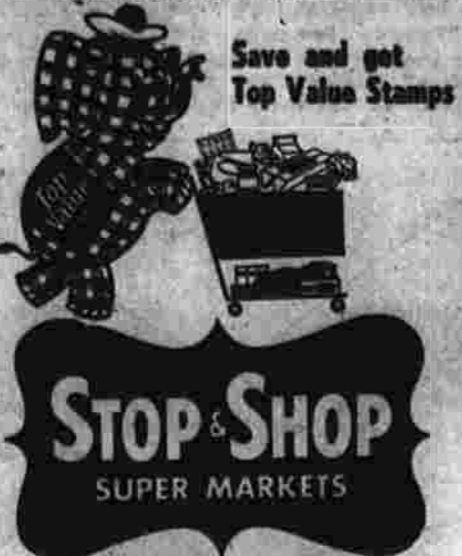

Chicago Whites Balk At Integration Try

CHICAGO (AP)—An attempt by a high school teacher to integrate a South Side neighborhood near the home of Mayor Richard J. Daley is meeting stiff opposition from white residents. John Walsh, 37 and white, purchased an old two-story house in the predominantly white working-class section and rented an apartment to Paul Jones, a Negro college student, and Ocala Buntin, a native of South America.

Their arrival last week touched off several nights of demonstrations which resulted in 12 arrests for disturbing the peace and inciting a riot.

The culmination came Tuesday when, according to Walsh, the real estate agent who sold him the house evicted the pair and rented the apartment to two white men.

But Walsh, who admits he purchased the house to integrate the neighborhood, said he would go to court and ask that the white tenants be evicted. "My sole intention," Walsh said, "was to show the rest of the people of the United States and the rest of the world that in the third largest city in the United States a Negro gentleman can live in the same block as the mayor."

Daley lives two blocks from Walsh's building.

"Two, four, six, eight. We don't want to integrate," teenagers in the crowd chanted Monday night. Adults also took part in the protest.

"We don't want them. They have their own neighborhood. Let them stay there," one man said. Demonstrators expressed their resentment freely, but were hostile to newsmen and declined to be identified.

Residents of the area are primarily of Lithuanian, Polish and Irish extraction. They say they resent what they feel is an organized attempt to force integration on them.

"It's block-busting, pure and simple," one woman declared. "But we're not going to panic. We're not selling."

Monday night some 600 per-

sons of the neighborhood are in the habit of dancing, listening to the radio and watching television. Mrs. Ellis is a member of the League of Women Voters and the Women's Auxiliary to Manchester Memorial Hospital. Her hobby is collecting dolls and raising house plants.

Mrs. Ellis is on the executive board of the Highland Park School PTA and the board of directors of L.U. Junior Museum. She said that all of her activities her work with children at Bunce Center is the most rewarding.

Walsh, who holds membership in numerous civil rights organizations, said he didn't intend to embarrass the mayor, but felt Daley should have acted more forcefully in suppressing the demonstration.

He has no intention of backing down now because "I think it would be a bad thing for the people of the neighborhood to think they can keep their neighborhood white by using intimidation."

range, four-motored Soviet "Bear" bombers to maintain a continuous surveillance of 20 NATO missile ships.

This would assume ideal weather for visual identification at close range.

The study group estimated it would take 150 of the Bears to search out the ships and attack them if they had 30 hours or longer to do so.

To search, locate and attack Bear-type planes, the study would be at sea at a given time with the five others in port at special bases in the Mediterranean and the Atlantic.

The military study found that nature provides a built-in defense for the force. In addition to the vast oceans it would roam, the military group noted, there are some 12,000 miles of NATO coastline along which the ships could be dispersed. Also, shallow waters and inland water systems provide an element of natural defense against submarines.

The military experts held that the long endurance and speed of the proposed vessels, their design permitting them to look at sea like many cargo ships, and freedom of movement provided by their long-range missiles all contributed to the safety of the force from searching Communist planes and craft.

It was decided that under normal cold war conditions "surprise is not a serious threat because the high Soviet force level required for fast search of a large area is readily detected."
