### Debate Opens On Episcopal Affiliation

ST. LOUIS, Mo. (AP) — Debate on the controversial question of Protestant Episcopal Church involvement in the National Council of Churches begins today at the 114th Episcopal General Convention.

The question is should there be more, less, or no affiliation with the National Council of Churches. A report by the convention's Joint Commission on Ecumenical Relations recommends increased participation in the council. Opposition will come from some Southern dioceses and some Anglo-Catholic or high church Episcopalians.

The Southern diocese opposes the recommendation because of statements attributed to the council, which supports the civil rights movement.

Members of the diocese of Mississippi have offered a resolution asking that the council "refrain from the issuance of statements or pronouncements... without the presence and vote of a substantial majority of the membership of the respective bodies."

The Mississippi resolution also asks that the council stop "issuing statements or pronouncements which advocate or oppose specific political action."

High churchmen are against Episcopal involvement in the council because it is an organization of Protestant churches and high churchmen prefer to be known as Catholic.

The report on the council was ordered by the last Episcopal convention three years ago in Detroit. The report said that charges of alleged Communist sympathies of the council's officers and committees are false.

Members of the commission said increased participation by the Episcopal Church in the council "can strengthen Christian influence in American and world society."

The three applicants who are asking variances must show that a hardship exists that is peculiar to their property and which may be relieved by relaxing the zoning regulations.

The hardship must be found in the shape or topography of the property in question.

Keane Signs With Yankees... NEW YORK (AP) — Johnny Keane was named manager of the New York Yankees today.

Keane, who resigned as manager of the St. Louis Cardinals only 19 hours after leading them to World Series victory over the Yankees, succeeds Yogi Berra, who was fired despite winning a pennant in his first year as manager.

Keane is the 18th Yankee manager and his fourth in the last five years. General Manager Ralph Houk, who announced Keane's signing at a press conference today, said the 32-year-old Keane had been given a one-year contract.

Terms were not disclosed but it is believed Keane will receive around \$45,000.

Events In State Changes Seen For Lawyers... HARTFORD (AP) — A possible fundamental change in the legal profession was seen today in a seminar on legal education at the Sturtevant-Hilton.

The change would involve a revision of bar association canons of ethics to conform with the conditions now prevalent in legal work.

Joseph H. Weisberger, associate justice of the Rhode Island supreme court, told the attorneys attending a morning seminar of an amendment to the Connecticut Bar Association "any canon which is unenforceable and does not represent a consensus of the bar in realistic application should be amended."

In discussing this proposition one lawyer raised the possibility of going so far as to change the concept of the profession. This would be to change the concept of legal practice from a means of livelihood to a profession.

He suggested specifically that the bar be organized as a corporation. This would give it the right to sue and be sued.

Body Will Lie in State For National Services... NEW YORK (AP) — Herbert Clark Hoover, 81st president of the United States, died today at the age of 90.

His death followed a recurrence of massive gastro-intestinal hemorrhage which he had suffered in 1957.

The staunch old statesman, whose life spanned a varied career of engineering, high office and humanitarian service, had kept busy almost to the last.

Hoover's two sons were at his bedside when he died. He was taken by train to Washington, where he will lie in state in the rotunda of the national Capitol.

Following services there, his body will be flown to West Franch, Iowa, where the final services will be held at 10 a.m. today in the National Park at the site of the small college where he was born.

Repeatedly, and sometimes almost miraculously, in his later years, he had fought off serious ailments.

No former president except John Adams, the nation's second president who died at 90, had reached such an advanced age. Adams lived 90 years and two months.

Hoover, who passed that mark in 1964, said in a birthday message that the key to America's endurance is its freedom.

"Freedom is the open window through which pours the light of the human spirit and of human dignity," he said. "As a president, I have always been proud to have my share in the great struggle to bring to the world a more just and more humane order."
