

It must be a very pleasant thing to be le to perform good works that can fine publicly before men. What one acishes can become a matter of pubnotice and record; there can be public ribute to the people who have helped a good thing happen; justification for the setivity involved and what it may cost an be established publicly.

Then there is another kind of "doing d" which has to operate under slightdifferent and more interesting rules. is a kind of activity which is forbid-, by its own very nature, from takany of its results and presenting em in dramatic, compelling feshion to e public. It can advertise its lump sum eds, but not its specific accomplishments. Those who work in such a field save to keep themselves next to anonymous. They can never expect salutations congratulations on their greatest vicries. If they ever succeed in such a peroic task as saving a human life, they have to keep discreetly silent about it and they can never even let the identity

of the life saved become known. This kind of activity—the kind which must of necessity hide itself under a nushed goes on in every pastorate in nchester. It goes on in every school Manchester. It can be found as part of many a family or neighborhood friend-

onal and organized channels. The Child Guidance Clinic, the Diocesan Buand the Children's Services of ecticut are all three agencies engaged, behind their necessary doors of etion, in the business of saving huann lives in Manchester.

The prime emphasis of these agencies not on the physical side of saving lives. They deal in the shadowy realm of sychological disturbance, of incipient Sinces of mind and soul, of those conlagions which can't be touched with anlibiotic or scalpel.

Most of us never know much about the work these three agencies do among us. They could be next door, and we might not know it. They could be in our own me, and next door might never know
