Events have deprived us of any alter-In order to urge the election of Senafor Barry Goldwater, The Herald would have to abandon what it has hitherto usidered right positions on many poli-

cies and issues. For us, as it must be for millions of Americans, this campaign has become the campaign of no choice.

It would be a relief if it were a matber of being Republicans or Democrats. It would be healthy and stimulating if it were a red hot political war between two political philosophies, one of which could be called conservative and the other liberal.

It could even be a fairly normal campaign if it were a contest between two

It has become none of these things Thoughtful Americans, we think, must even resist the temptation to label it a business of trying to select the lesser of two evils. The way out is not that easy. The American people, in this election of 1984, are fighting for their own sense of balance, perhaps for their sanity as a nation and a society.

We are all in some kind of obscure combat with the darker side of our own Yet we sense that we are fighting to

be able to hold our heads high in the world, and to continue to be able to look at one another, free and easy in our membership in one American soelety, home of diversities.

The trouble came with a nomination at San Francisco. It was not the nomination of a particular man, not the nomination of a particular faction, not the nomination of a particular philosophy. It seemed, rather, the nomination of an apparatus for revolution, as completely equipped in variety of personnel, totality of aim, ruthlessness of tactic and empty sanctimony of slogan as any musical comedy plot to take over some mythical kingdom of Ruritania.

This fanciful apparatus for revolution took its victory at San Francisco with a mock trampling of its enemies which seemed needless to ordinary observers, but which seemed part of the ritual for uch an extremist fantasy. This same apparatus for revolution has since hased up and down the organization orridors of the Republican party, seeking to add a palace coup to its convenion takeover.

Tet, however unreal it may all seem, regular Republicans, and just plain Americans have to regard this movement with the beginnings of fear. For the elaborate fantasy, if it should work, threatens to rule the American people with a slanted absolutism. . . . .

The nature of this movement, the strategies it is willing to adopt, the way it evaluates the intelligence of the votes it seeks, the extent to which it hopes to brew the weaknesses of us all into some adhesive binding the innocent and the well-intentioned to its own debatable purposes, were all held in some deliberate restraint during the middle portion of the campaign.
