**Walter Sartre Gives Reasons for Rejection**

PARIS (AP) — Jean-Paul Sartre says he turned down the 1964 Nobel Prize for literature to remain free in his efforts to express evaluation and esteem to the French people. "It is not the same thing to sign myself 'Jean-Paul Sartre' or 'Jean-Paul Sartre, Nobel Prize winner,'" he told newsmen at the Swedish Embassy. "I had warned the academy early this week that he would refuse the award."

Sartre said he realized the Nobel Prize was not in itself a Western bloc award, but he called it "a distinction reserved for writers of the West or for rebels from the East."

He had warned the academy early this week that he would refuse the award.

Soviet author Boris Pasternak reluctantly turned down the award in 1958 after a blistering denunciation by the Soviet government. British playwright George Bernard Shaw accepted the award in 1925 but donated the money to a British-Swedish literary foundation.

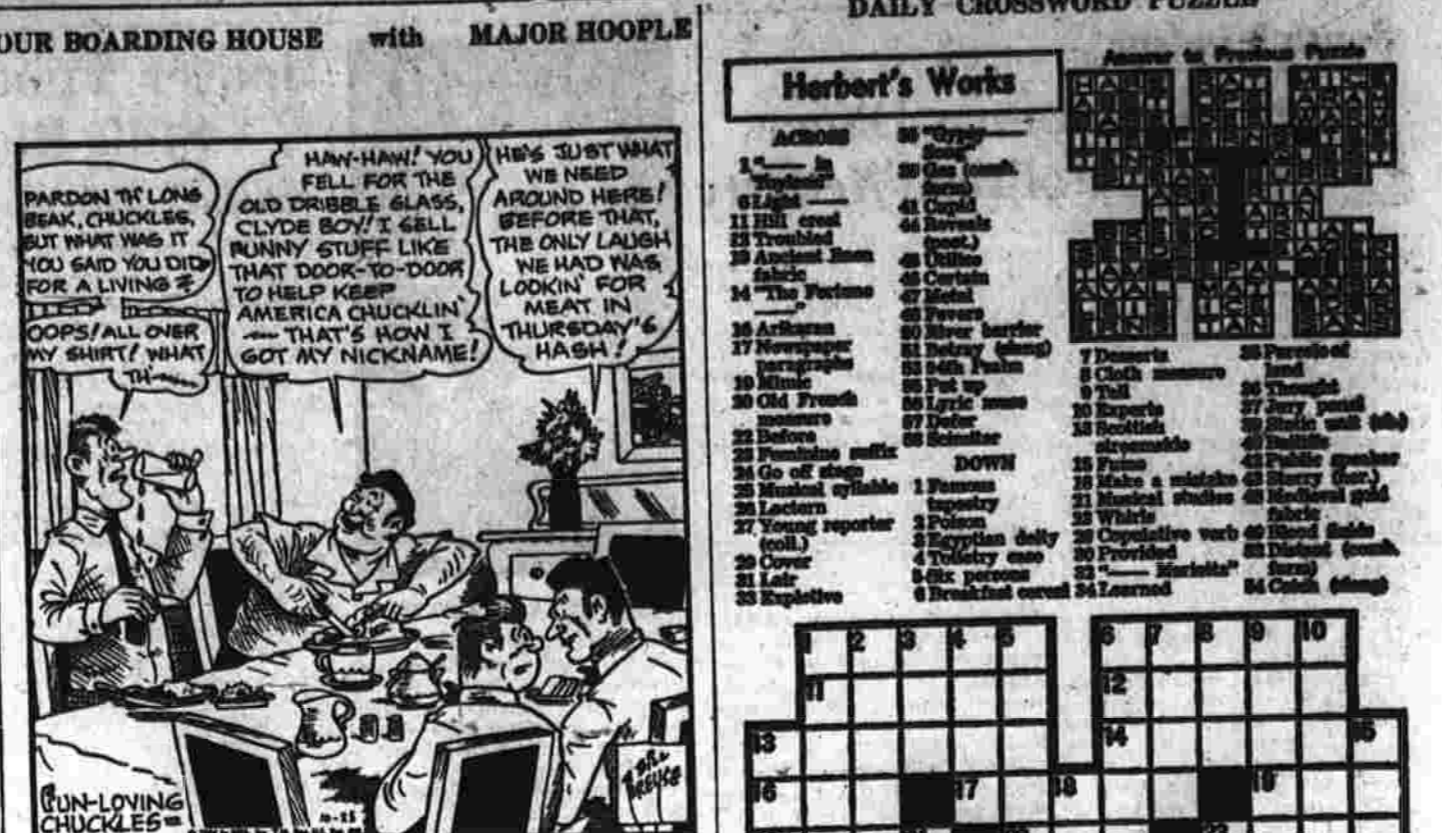
