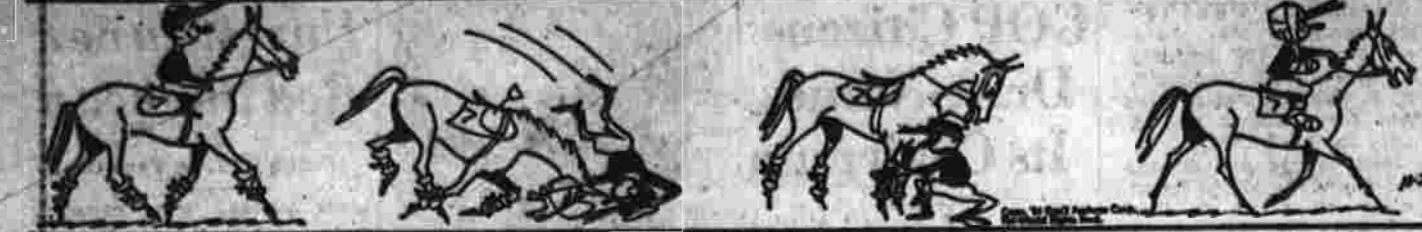

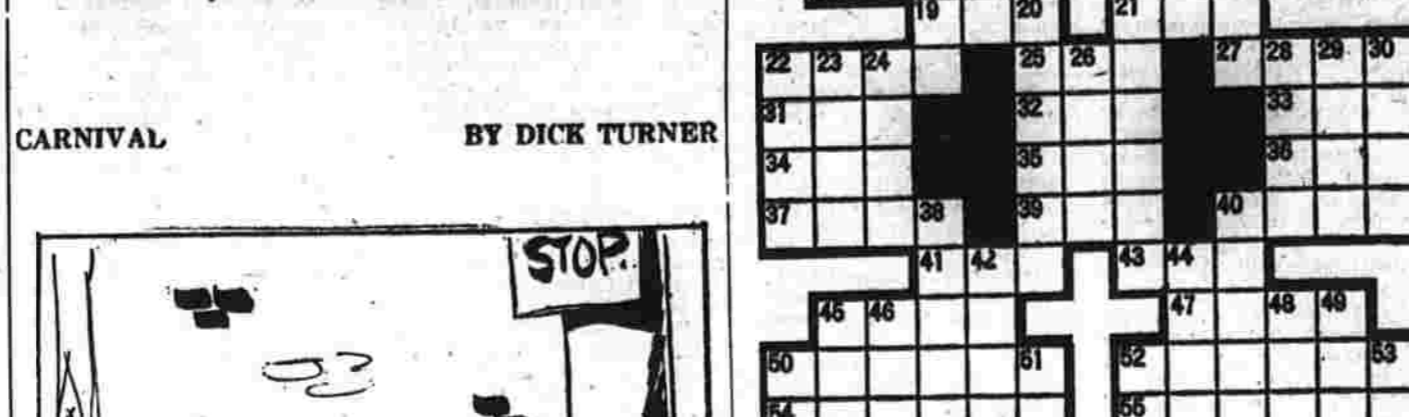

25th Year
Borge-U.S. Romance

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Victor Borge will soon be marking the 25th anniversary of a long-blooming romance between himself and the United States of America.

It began back in 1940 when the Danish piano-humorist and Adolf Hitler decided to disagree. "And look what happened to him!" Borge is fond of pointing out. Borge recently was back in Hollywood to emcee a couple of Hollywood Palace shows and to pick up some handsome fees for local engagements with his one-man show. In between, he paused to reflect in his Chateau Marmont penthouse suite about the changes in his life during the past quarter-century.

"I had been enemy No. 1 of the small but active Nazi party in Denmark," he recalled. "They constantly attacked me on the front pages of their newspaper because I spoke my mind about Hitler. I knew the invasion was coming and I would be on the liquidation list, so I took an engagement in Sweden."

The Germans did invade Denmark, and Borge's return was demanded. He replied that he had contracts to fulfill, and he managed to have his wife join him. Because she was an American citizen, he managed to join her on the last transport ship leaving from northern Europe.

Borge is fond of recalling his equipment for conversation when he arrived in New York. "My English consisted of what I remembered from school 15 years before," he said. "Mostly it was 'I am, you are, he is, etc.'"

But Borge is a fast study, and he soon learned the language—and the customs. He had his first engagement at a charity affair in Palm Beach, Fla., filling in when Hildegarde became ill. He was a hit from the start and played a date at a Palm Beach night club. He was wary, however, of appearances before small audiences.

He realized his material, such as phonetic punctuation and playing the "Blue Danube" backwards, might easily be lifted by other entertainers. He wanted to establish it with a

mass audience so it would be identified forever as his own. Borge decided to go to California, where living might be cheaper and there was a chance of getting into the movies. Through Danish friends he got an audition before Rudy Vallee, who helped place him on Bing Crosby's Kraft Music Hall. He was a guest star for a whole year, and his American career was launched.

The Dane will be marking his silver anniversary by returning his one-man show to Broadway; he opens at the Golden Theater Nov. 9. There's no telling how long he'll stay.

"The last time I played New York, I went in for a few weeks and stayed three years," he remarked.

Monster with Talent

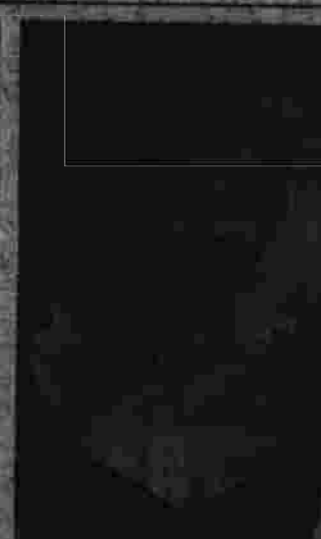
Actually, Gwynne is far from average.

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—How long can "Wagon Train" keep rolling along? Scout Robert Fuller hopes it will go on and on, but he admits that this may be the critical season.

"Eight years is an awfully long time for a series to be on television," he conceded. "And we're up against some powerhouse competition this season. I must say that we haven't let up at all. Unlike some television cowpokes who could hardly wait to get out of the saddle, Bob Fuller likes it where he is. He's not exactly a newcomer to the field, having gone for four years in "Laramie" into "Wagon Train" last season with only a 30-day breather.

"I like Westerns; I like the people I work with and I like working outdoors," said Fuller, who spends every weekend camping with his wife and 6-month-old son.

"I like the way the public reacts, too. When I go out on tours, people have immediate recognition, and they talk to me like an old friend. They tell me, 'The next bad guy you meet, get him for me.' It makes you feel like a million dollars."

What would he like to do if "Wagon Train" does vanish into the sunset? "Another Western series,"

But she admitted that she enjoyed getting back into the routine, even though she was "pushed" into the Palace date.

By whom? "By Phil," she said, referring to her corn-pone hubby, Phil Harris. He likes to see her keep her hand in the entertainment scene.

The Harrises were pioneers among the Hollywood expatriates who have settled permanently in Palm Springs. Phil and Alice landed there 14 years ago. She admitted the danger of living year-around in a resort town — friends from the city are apt to drop in any time expecting to party.

Alice left the homestead three years ago to make her first film in 14 years, "State Fair." It marked a return to 20th Century-Fox, where she had made all her musicals — "On the Avenue," "Sing, Baby, Sing," "Alexander's Ragtime Band," "Rose of Washington Square," "Hello, Frisco, Hello," etc.

"I never saw 'State Fair' so I don't know how the picture turned out," Alice commented. "It was fun seeing the people I used to work with in the old days — the ones who were left. But I didn't enjoy working the way I used to. Everything is so out and dried now."

Alice, now thrice a grandmother, says she and Phil will

continue living on the desert — at least until the smog comes. "I see it hanging over the mountains," she said. "I suppose it will get to us eventually. Then I don't know what we'll do."

Brian Kelly Has Warmed To 'Flipper'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — When Brian Kelly's agent suggested the actor try out for a television series based on "Flipper," Kelly replied, "What's a flipper?"

The agent educated Kelly about the MGM box office success starring a high-I.Q. dolphin.

"Are you crazy?" Kelly replied. "Me do a series with a dolphin, two kids and a lot of fish? Nobody would ever know I was in it."

The agent prevailed and escorted Kelly to MGM for a chat with producer Ivan Tors and his staff. The actor warmed to the project when he heard their interpretation, but he insisted "I won't play him as the usual type of television father whom everyone pushes around and who wants only to see that his family is happy," he said. "This guy will have to be a real disciplinarian. The kids must know that if they don't toe the mark, they'll get taken behind the woodshed."

On that basis — and with some salutary terms — Brian Kelly signed for "Flipper." You can see the results on NBC tonight and every Saturday. Judging from the ratings, the series has hope of surviving the season.

That's fine with Kelly, despite the competition of the small fry and funny folk and a hammy pelican to boot. He figures there is still enough footage over for him. He likes to stress that "Flipper" is suitable for the whole family, not just the kiddies.

"I think adults will be interested in the research aspects of the work with dolphins," said Kelly. "The United States government is spending a total of \$750,000 for research with dolphins this year alone, and I believe scientists are close to a major breakthrough."

"Already they have detected 1,400 different sounds the dolphins exchange. There can be no doubt that they communicate with sounds among each other."

Kelly is the son of Harry F. Kelly, former governor of Michigan and now chief justice of the State Supreme Court. He aimed for a career in law and politics but got deflected by school drama.

He is the husband of actress Laura Devon, formerly of the Richard Boone stock company. Between her work in Hollywood and his in Miami and the Bahamas, the pair will keep the airlines happy.
