Rockville-Vernon High School Courses Eyed; Masker Quits School Board

Edward Masker, a seven-year member and former chairman of the Vernon Board of Education, resigned last night at a curriculum meeting of the board at Rockville High School.

Masker, who served last year as chairman, gave no reason for the move. Walter Campbell, of Wilson L.A. an employee of Pratt and Whitney Aircraft, was selected to replace Masker.

Campbell was present at the meeting and assumed his new post immediately.

The board's action in accepting Masker's resignation and accepting Campbell was unanimous and no comments were made by any of the members.

The agenda of last night's meeting was to discuss non-college preparatory curriculum for the high school.

Allen L. Dresser, assistant superintendent of schools, recommended the following curriculum changes be made:

Drop the school music structure course, due to the small number of participants. Dresser noted that only seven pupils are enrolled in the course at the present time.

Drop Electricity II, which also has only seven students enrolled.

Create a Metals II course, since there is only one class of metalworking, and there are presently 30 students enrolled.

Make Biology a required subject for sophomores in the college course.

Add shop as an elective for seniors enrolled in college preparatory courses.

Finally, Dresser recommended changing the shop course to Math II, since the fundamentals of mathematics are useful in many fields, "more useful than shop math which the pupil might never use," he said.

Martha Fagan, recently appointed principal of the high school, noted that as far as course changes are concerned, "The demands for pupils for the changes do not indicate anything is wrong. We are not imposing changes on students."

Fagan, a veteran teacher and administrator at the high school, presented a comprehensive program designed to aid non-college course pupils who do not "always sit" in the present curriculum.

Fagan's proposal included:

- Explore the work study program part of the curriculum.
- Institute a night school course leading to a high school degree.
- Institute distributive education courses, regarding wholesaling and retailing, in the 11th and 12th grades.
- Determine the attitudes of students toward apprenticeship training offered by the state.
- Investigate the interests, needs and abilities of students with the view of instituting more levels of education.
- Have teachers tell of the educational values of each of their subjects, and have the teachers show students how each subject is of value in making a living.

Recognize the individual value in mental health and mental stability, and the socio-economic background of each student.

Evaluate the value of extra-curricular activities.

Reduce the class size in some of the non-college courses.

Bring closer cooperation between the junior high school and the senior high school programs.

Start teaching students the value of good working habits.

Fagan noted: "There is nothing wrong with high school graduates going to work. Somehow we must restore dignity to this concept." He observed that about 60 per cent of Rockville-Vernon High School pupils are enrolled in non-college courses.

The course of study offered by the school is a combination of industrial arts, agriculture, home economics and college preparatory courses.

Rockville-Vernon Federal Sewer Aid Seen by St. Onge

Federal relief for two of Vermont's biggest problems may be available, Rep. William St. Onge said today. Onge, congressman for the second Connecticut District, said yesterday.

St. Onge noted that aid for the construction of sewers in rural Vermont is now possible through two federal agencies, who offer up to 50 per cent assistance.

He also noted that during the last session of the Congress, federal aid to cities and towns for the construction of elementary schools.

Vernon is faced with both problems. The board of education recently decided that a new grammar school is needed, and double sessions in town may be a reality soon.

Sewerage problems in Vermont's Fire Districts has also been a matter of much discussion. Earlier this month a federal grant of more than \$12,000 was announced so the town could launch a primary survey of sewerage needs.

Under the present program only a pro-rated share of the funds, based upon actual construction, must be paid back. If the sewer plan is actually constructed, then the money for the study must be repaid to the government.

"The Area Development Administration, which provided the recent study grant to Vermont," St. Onge said, "can finance up to 50 per cent of the sewer construction. The amount of funds is the key point in whether or not Vermont may receive some federal assistance, when the construction of sewers in the district begins."

"This is a relatively new program," St. Onge said, "and it depends upon the future action of Congress whether additional funds are available."

"The program also depends upon the economic situation of the country," he continued. "With unemployment lowering as it has been, funds are being reduced for such programs because the need is being reduced."

Rep. St. Onge observed, however, that another federal agency, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare makes available up to 10 per cent of the construction costs of sewer projects. "Admittedly, these funds," St. Onge said, "is through the State Water Resources Commission which allocates funds to various communities."

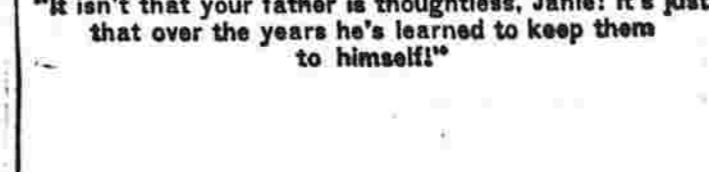

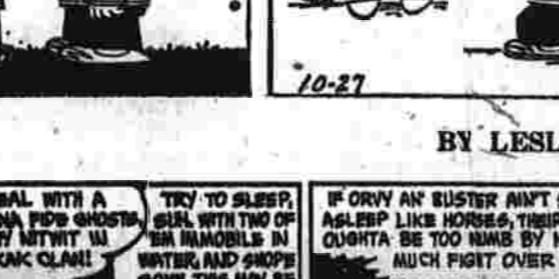
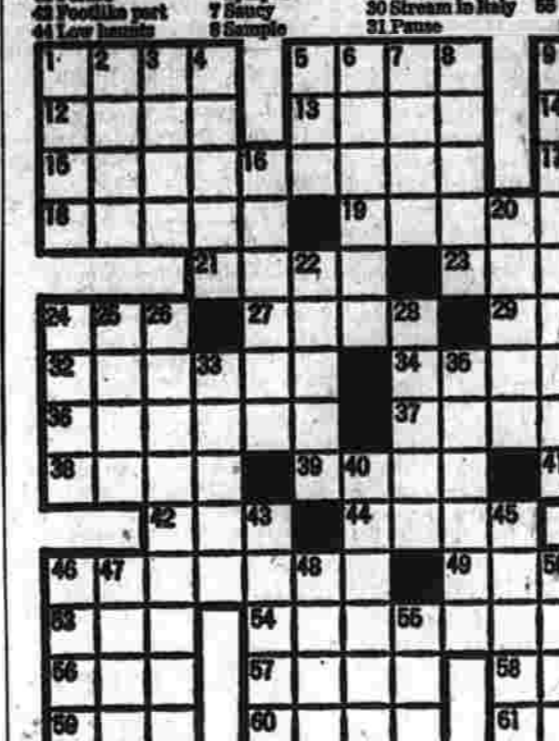
