"But the choice must be made," the Des Moines Register then went on, "on the broad question of who is likely to provide the abler leadership for this nation. Mr. Johnson has made a good record in his short time in the White House. He has been energetic in dealing with domestic problems. He has been firm but prudent in foreign affairs. He has exhibited rare political

ability in working with Congress." It is easy to understand that independent or Republican newspapers, coming out for President Johnson, should voice such reservations. And the point they all make is clear enough; had the Republican choice offered them been something different, their own de-

cision would have been much more free. As for us, in this space, we can agree that President Johnson's weaknesses are indeed well known, and seem fated even to live after him. But it seems to us that it can also be recalled that this same Lyndon Johnson began attracting, and kept on attracting, favorable positive comment in the independent and the Republican newspapers of the country both before and after some of his weaknesses had become headline mate-

Lyndon Johnson first became a favorite of the Republican and independent press of the nation during the years. from 1954 to 1960 when he served as leader of the Democratic majority in the United States Senate under the Presidency of one Dwight Eisenhower. And Lyndon Johnson became something of a non-partisan hero during those years for the finest of reasons. He brought a new cult of legislative responsibility to the operation of the political opposition; he cooperated with the moderate Republican in the White House for good purposes. And it ought especially to be remembered that there was at least one incident in the Eisetnhower years when an opposition leader in the Senate might have zeroed in on the Republican administration in the White House over a mistake and an embarrassment in the realm of world policy, and when Lyndon Johnson conspicuously and deliberately chose, instead, to support the Republi-

formance, for its indefatigable energy, for its display of both vigor and restraint, for its expertness in dealing with the legislative branch, for its sense of where to locate the restraining chain n front of foreign policy brinks. And were it not for the fact that there is a political campaign going on, and were it not for the fact that President Johnson has so far refused to condemn personally the conduct of two individuals who have been associated with his career and who have stained it by their association. Lyndon Johnson would be rating highly with a great majority of newspapers and Americans today, in the office of President.

There have been human weaknesses and frailties and sicknesses and corruption in association with the White House before. They are part of the political gossip of our time and the folklore of the past. Every touch of any such thing is to be regretted. But it can seldom be evaluated lastingly in the midst of a campaign.

There has not very often been in the White House a positive ability of the type Lyndon Johnson has been able to sustain there in his first partial year. That positive demonstration is something to keep in mind, too, along with the imperfections that may also belong to Lyndon Johnson. And if it is kept in mind, the choice itself has to come out positive. There is strong, ample reason to hope Lyndon Johnson will be a good President, for all the people, for the next four years.
