ers of men who match their steadistness of purpose with an honest, orkmanlike ability of the type that wilds, with its reliable persistence, nievements that last and count. These the careers Connecticut always eventually elevates into its own

non-partisan permanent hall of political onor-are the careers of men who can depended upon, in crisis, to put servee above self, public above party, principle ahead of opportunity. There are Connecticut voters of this

generation who have had the privilege of the late Wilbur L. Cross, in the person of Raymond E. Baldwin, our retired hief Justice, our former United States ter, our former Governor. It is time to recognize that the serv-

ice and career of John Davis Lodge may some day be accorded an equally igh non-partisan ranking in this Land Bteady Habita.

The public service of John Davis Lodge began in the year 1946, with his lection to Congress from the Fourth field County. He was reelected in 1948. these four years in the House at Washington, Lodge identified himself with a group of young Republican moderates who, without being rebels, deroted themselves to the ambitious task of trying to do something to modernize nd liberalize and make more progresgive and positive the image the Repub-Mean party was presenting to the Amercan people at that time.

The principles this group of young Republican Congressmen worked out for themselves and pushed forward for se consideration of their own party fore fruit, later on, when they became the groundwork for a national campaign, waged with a great moderate

It was as a Republican Governor of Connecticut, rather than as a Congressman, that John Davis Lodge played his key role in that national achievegent. He became Connecticut's first our year term Governor in 1950. There were kindred spirits among some of the ther Republican governors of the ime; another grouping of Republican moderates came about; they too helped got the stage and determine the outsome at the Republican National Conention which nominated Dwight D. Eienhower for the Presidency.

Meanwhile, as Governor of this state for four years, John Lodge was achievag an administration which for skill and efficiency of executive direction, sudgetary soundness, and steady imrovement and expansion of the state's anitarian service has since been nized by many students of govment performance as a unique period in Connecticut history.

It was also to the honor of John odge as Governor, even though it may not have been kind to him in his immenate political fortunes, that he fought ad routed certain political professionis of both parties. It was his decision, against the real wishes of some the professionals in his own party. hich called the bluff of opposition ionals and turned what was supsed to be a game of pass the political nek into the actual enactment of the ate's first legislation banning dual he for legislators. It was the decision John Lodge, both as Governor and leader of his own party, which interoen the Democratic state machine

and a faction of his own party, and which, by such action, refused to license schemes for double-machine plunder o the state's resources.

If, as some political theorists have held, the subsequent loss of the governorship by John Lodge was not merely a tribute to the great popular appeal of Abe Ribicoff on his way up, but also a result of the lingering vengeance of Republican politicians whose pies had been spoiled, the Lodge record was still one of honor, and the benefit was still to the state.

The loss of the governorship to Ribl coff in 1954 was by a small margin, but it was final. And while Ribico went on to his own dazzling career as scene, John Lodge found that the man he had championed at Chicago in 1952 had a friendly memory for honor and for capability. He accepted President Eisenhower's appointment as Ambassador to Spain. Service in this post, with its window on the problems of Europe, concluded the Lodge public record to date, but, like everything else in his career since 1946, added to the experience and qualification he now brings to his quest for an opportunity to serve the state of Connecticut and the nation in the United States Senate.

To this story of a career, there should be added some statement of the policy positions and convictions it has developed. It is unashamedly middle of the road in domestic affairs. It has a keen sense of the realities

in the dangerous world of today, but it includes in these realities an awareness of the importance of the United Nations as the last best hope of earth. It is a career which, whatever its level in whatever field, aims at the ideal first, and then seeks, as the proper science of politics, the best and closest practical approach to it.

For such reasons, and in such ways, the career of John Davis Lodge stands already close to the stature of one of Connecticut's great modern public servants. It will be a proper honor to him, and an honor back to Connecticut, if he should become, on next Tuesday, our new United States Senator.

Our political independence is of deep value to us. o continue endorsing presidential lidates, as we have done several times in the last three decades, would carry us deeper into the political arena than we feel it is wise to go.

Our conviction is supported by the particularly close relationship that pre-vails between The Christian Science Monitor and many of its readers. We to not and we must not tell our readers how to vote. Most of them, being sturd ndividualists, wouldn't do what we told them anyway. Even when we endorsed candidates in the past, we have always reiterated the fact that we were seeking to direct nobody's vote. We have re-peatedly emphasized that citizens must think these things through for them-selves. To make the relationship even more correct we now feel we must re-frain from an endorsement.

Our political coverage in the news columns will remain objective and evenhanded. Our commentary columns are plainly identifiable as such. Our editorlals represent the conclusions of the paper itself on the issues involved.

We are poignantly aware of the in-tense emotions which this year's cam-paign have aroused. Most newspapers in the United States, from all acounts, are hearing from their readers this year with especial pungency and earnestness. Sometimes the letters are not even from readers. One deeply zealous and wealthy staff of persons whose job is to write letters to selected newspapers. Be that as it may, while we regret the violence of some of the letters we have received, we are grateful for the political awareness they represent.


