Out in California, in the midst of another Johnson landslide, the Republican party gained another potential national figure, in Senator-elect George Murphy. In addition, the party has such existing governors as Scranton of Pennsylwania and Hatfield of Oregon.

Lesson In Political Science

One way to follow the internal politics of Soviet Russia is to follow the ups and lowns in the career of poor old Trofim Lysenko, the imaginative plant biologist who believes that he can make living organisms transmit to the next generation characteristics they have quired during their own lifetime.

This alluring heresy, which claims the ability to burst the bonds of classic genetic theories, may not be quite as much of an error as simple lay descriptions of it can make it sound. Lysenko keeps producing all kinds of interesting results in his own breeding of plants; not all geneticists reject his theories completely. Every now and then some new discovery opens some side alley which if followed to its end, might eventually wind up showing Lysenko partially correct. Probably we haven't ched the definitive scientific verdict

But poor Lysenko has relatively little to fear on the battlefields of science. It's on the field of politics that he seems to score his triumphs and take his defeats.

Lysenko, with his claim that he might be able to work practical miracles by making all kinds of crops adjust to the Russian climate, appealed to Stalin, and was his favorite. After the fall of Stain, new regimes leaned toward more ventional and more reliable methods f increasing Russian farm production. but, as these failed, apparently Nikita ushchev began to be fascinated by the idea of miracles, and Lysenko be-

same respectable again. In fact, as recently as Oct. 2 officially sponsored articles in the realm of ical science were chiding Lysento's opponents for daring to dispute his

But now the new line has appeared in Russian publications. And Lysenko is middenly the villain again, and his opconents are now the ones being praised. So goes the ordeal of science forced to sink or swim in the reversible currents of politics. Eventually, one hopes, the scientific fact will become so clear and indisputable no political fancy can confuse or distort it. But since we haven't even managed any such state of pure clear and undisputed knowledge in our own country, we should not be particularly surprised to find Russia lagging in a state of development where science and myth are still indistinguish-

Old Man Young

From a distance it seems to us that our special favorite of a winner in the election has proved to be Senator Stephen M. Young, and this in spite of the fact that his hair-line victory happens to be the thing that chokes off what might have been a burgeoning national career for a fine young man with a wonderful old Republican name, one Robert A. Taft. Jr.

Perhaps Senator Young should never have been considered the underdog. For he came on the national scene six years ago by daring to defeat another famous Ohio name, and take John Bricker's Senate seat away from him. And anybody who could do that might be entitled to public gratitude, but not to the consistent underrating Senator Young has received ever since.

Our sympathy for this Senator Young first appeared when he became the quite innocent target and roadblock in the path of the political ambition of Astronaut John Glenn. The assumption everybody made then, before the astronaut took a fall in the bathroom and incapacitated himself for political campaigning, was that Senator Young would prove a soft, harmless old man, unable to defend himself, and that Glenn would win the primary hands

Perhaps that estimate has now.

Anyway, even though he had escaped being retired from office by Glenn in the Democratic primary, everybody assumed that Senator Young would wind up retired after he got through running against anybody by the name of Taft in the Nov. 2 election.

But poor old man Young, never quite accepting the almost unanimous reports of his imminent political death. kept running around the state, shaking hands, going through the motions, just as if he were a real candidate

Senator Young, continuing in office, isn't going to add as much to the record of the Democratic party in the nation as the young Bob Taft might have added to the Republican record for the future. Perhaps another result would have been

Lyndon Johnson's Mandate

Lyndon Johnson has decisively won

election to a Presidential term in his own right, as, given the alternative, th clear needs of the occasion demanded His competency as chief executive has been amply demonstrated; his programs for the nation have largely, and regrettably, been left obscure. It's in the area of these programs that the measure of his mandate has to be clearly taken. It has to be recognized that he ran, in effect, as both a Democrat and a Republican; that the overwhelming bipartisan support he re-

ceived, both before the election and al the polls, was by no stretch of the Democratic program of Federal aggrandizement. Mr. Johnson ran as the candidate of the great moderate center of American political life, a center occupied by substantial segments of both political par-

ties. He ran as a man prudent in foreign affairs, creative but cautious in domestic matters, a man skilled in the art of consensus and alert to the rights Beyond the normally Democratic power bases, he won the support of business men persuaded that he respected free

enterprise and would not be profligate with the nation's wealth; of advocates assurances of faith in the Federal system of shared powers. Much of his support came from Republicans who voted with crossed fingers, not for medicare or fatter farm

ubsidies or Federal poverty panaceas, but for the only candidate to whom they felt they could safely entrust the nation's foreign relations. Much came from people of both parties to whom the cause of equal rights

was sacred, and who found only one candidate willing to commit his Administration to its achievement. Much came from people who, for a variety of reasons, were simply voting against Barry Goldwater. All this is said not to belittle Mr.

Johnson's victory, which was massive historic, personal, and, in the context of 964, deserved. It is, rather, a reminder that the default of the Republicar party contributed in no small measure to it. Questions that would have haunted any other campaign went unanswerdidate was unacceptable. The public didn't demand any specific accounting of Mr. Johnson's plans, because it he oo unsettling an accounting of Mr. Goldwater's.

It's been said of Lyndon Johnson that he had to be President, because no other office could absorb his energies. He has shown, also, a great zest for power and its use. For the most part, he has used power responsibly. The question now, as an elected President, is how he will use it in the future. He has a mandate to meet, with vigor, the challenges of four uncertain years. But that mandate has its limits—the limits of consensus of the great national coalition that gave it.— NEW YORK HERALD TRIBUNE.
