Old Man Young
From a distance it seems to us that our special favorite of a winner in the election has proved to be Senator Stephen M. Young, and this in spite of the fact that his hair-line history happens to be the thing that choked off what might have been a burgeoning national career for a fine young man with a wonderful old Republican name, one Robert A. Taft, Jr.

Perhaps Senator Young should never have been considered the underdog. For he came on the national scene six years ago by daring to defeat another famous Ohio name, and take John Bricker's Senate seat away from him. And anybody who could do that might be entitled to public gratitude, but not the constant underestimating Senator Young has received ever since.

Our sympathy for this Senator Young first appeared when he became the quite innocent target and roadblock in the path of the political ambition of astronaut John Glenn. The assumption everybody made then, before the astronaut took a fall in the bathroom and incapacitated himself for political campaigning, was that Senator Young would prove a soft, harmless old man, unable to defend himself, and that Glenn would win the primary hands down.

Perhaps that estimate has now, in retrospect, been revised. Anyway, even though he had escaped being retired from office by Glenn in the Democratic primary, everybody assumed that Senator Young would wind up retired after he got through running against anybody by the name of Taft in the Nov. 3 election.

But poor old Young, never quite accepting the almost unanimous reports of his imminent political death, kept running around the state, shaking hands, going through the motions, just as if he were a real candidate. Senator Young, continuing in office, isn't going to add as much to the record of the Democratic party in the nation as the young Bob Taft might have added to the Republican record in the nation. However, a detailed study showed that the engine had performed as planned and that retention of the 200-pound shroud could slow the speed of Mariner 3 sufficiently to give an indication of early shutdown.

Signals first indicated the solar panels had folded like butterfly wings at 10:05 a.m. Later it was determined that they did not. Purpose of the panels was to draw power from the sun to operate Mariner 3's batteries.

With no solar power, the batteries lost their radio voice and the ability to receive steering commands from earth. Before the communication loss, ground stations relayed several full emergency radio commands in an effort to deploy the panels.

reserved for flights to and from the Communist-ruled city by planes registered to one of the three Western governments occupying West Berlin.

The United States, Britain and France maintain that any of their planes has the right to fly through the corridors. The Communists insist that only flights in direct support of the military garrisons in West Berlin are legal.

The Soviets have said civilian planes must be cleared with the East Germans but the Allies refuse to do this since they do not recognize the East German government.

The BEA return flight cleared through the Berlin-Hamburg corridor over Red-ruled East Germany again without encountering any trouble, a BEA official said. The plane carried 21 passengers.

The East Germans and the Russians also had protested New York-Berlin flights, made three times weekly by Pan American Airways, since last summer. Still, the Western Allies were not reported particularly worried that the Russians may be getting tough about use of the air corridors.

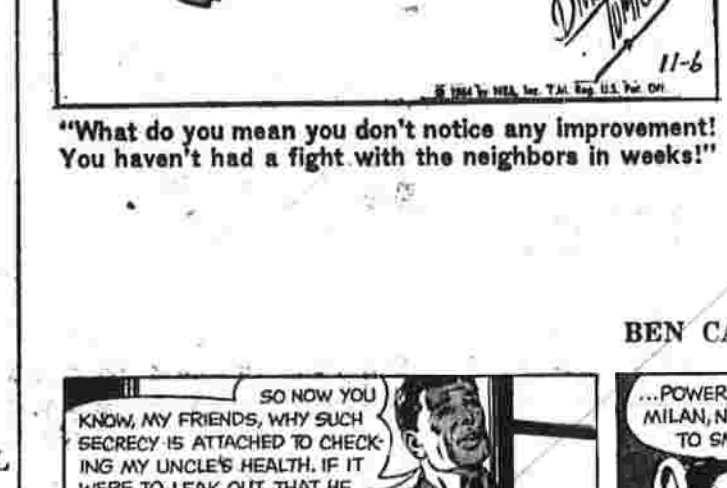
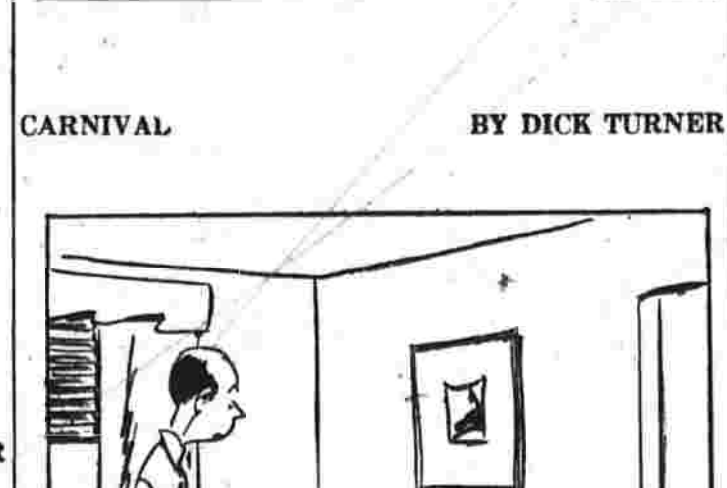

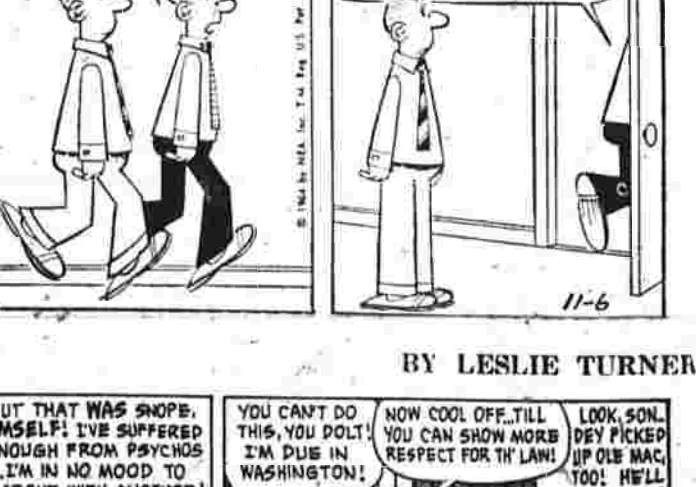
