

Proposition 14 That there was backlash on the civil rights issue in the election last Tuesday was established beyond all doubt. Ex-'cept in the Deep South, however, it did not translate itself into direct support for Senator Goldwater. In the South, the Senator got white votes because he had voted against the civil rights bill, and Negro votes went against him for the same reason. We are less philosophical, and less inclined to accept responsive movements inevitable, when the objects and pressures involved become pseudo-animate, as with geopolitical entities called nations and pressures called policies and vital interests. In such case, we always seem to

think somebody has to be held responsible, and that somebody should have changed some circumstance, and that we are dealing with a situation full of easy alternatives. And it is with that kind of uncasiness

has made such a journey.

The shifting pressures involved, to shove a Turkish foreign minister in such a direction are several. First, the pressure from Russia toward Turkey has been diminishing. Second, a new kind of pressure on Turkey has arisen from the rouble in Cyprus, pushing Turkey away from old alliances and into a feeling that they have been operating, in Cyprus, against Turkish interests. It looks more like history than like whimsy; more like a play of forces than an example of free human wills; f there is a role for human policy and diplomacy it may well be to try to adjust to and ride with such inevitabilities rather than to try to wipe them out or achieve some complete reversal of them. Or at least this much is certain rather than abuse Turkey for moving the way the pressures dictate, one would begin by trying to figure out how to influence and perhaps alter the pressures.

#### Chamber Scores Referral Sales

Townspeople who buy vacuum cleaners from door-to-door salesmen who promise a dis-count if the householder can direct them to other paying cus tomers are likely to end up # th

no bargains. So warns the Manchester Chamber of Commerce, in response to the appearance in town of vacuum cleaner sales men selling on the "referral"

According to the chamber, salesman using the "referral" method promises the customer a reduction in the cost of a nev vacuum cleaner if he can direct the salesman to additional

In some cases, the chamber says, the salesman tells the original buyer that the cleaner may end up costing nothing. But this is seldom the case according to the chamber.

More frequently the additional sales are not made and the first customer ends up paying full price. In some cases, the chamber adds, the price is higher than for a comparable produc purchased elsewhere.

The chamber suggests that townspeople trade only with established businesses that have a known history of performance and reliability.

If a householder does buy something from a door-to-door salesman, the chamber says, he should avoid "special bargain prices or give-aways" that are offered "because the salesman happens to be in the neighbor hood" or because the customer has "been chosen" for some

Usually such offers are not genuine, the chamber says Buyers should also be wary of "high pressure" sales tech

If an item is purchased from a traveling salesman, the buyer should make sure all business agreements are in writing in detail, and that all such agree ments are read and understood before signed.

#### Two Shows For Beatles

NEW YORK (AP) - Th Beatles, who have been rather quiet lately even if their fans have not, will be coming back strong on television soon.

ABC, it turns out, quietly signed the Liverpool long-hairs

last August for an hour-long special which will be seen on Sunday, Nov. 15, at the hour usually occupied by "Wagon Train"

The show will be produced by Jack Good, who also produces ABC's "Shindig," a pop music show aimed at the young audi-ence. It has turned into something of a hit, particularly after the Beatles appeared in one show.

Shortly after the ABC announcement CBS said it has a special Beatles show scheduled two days before the ABC spe-

This one is called "Around the Beatles," and is an edited version of a motion picture about the singing group during their American tour-but without songs. It will pre-empt "The Entertainers" on Friday,

Nov. 13. CBS, like ABC, has good cause to know the tonic effect of the English group on ratings. The first appearance on its "Ed Sullivan Show" last spring pulled an audience esti-mated by Nielsen researchers at well over 70 million viewers.

### Casualties Are Starting

It looks as if one of the season's first casualties will be NBC's "Bill Dana Show," which probably will disappear from NBC's Sunday night lineup some time in December. Another — and a big one — in trouble is "90 Bristol Court," the economy- size package of three situation comedies under one title. Replacement for the latter is

likely to be an hour Western which will put Chuck Connors back in a 10-gallon hat and blue jeans, plus a half-hour comedy. The network is expected to stick with "The Man From U.N.C.L.E." and "The Rogues." despite disappointing initial ratings in the belief both will build audiences during the postelection shake-down period. There is some worry about the nosedive "Dr. Kildare" has taken in the ratings and efforts are being made to brighten the scripts.
