### Truman in TV Debut THURSDAY Television PROGRA

NEW YORK (AP) — A pep-pery 80-year-old who has often appeared on television is makappeared on television is ing his formal debut this week as a television star. He is Harry former president of S: Truman, former president of the United States, and the name of his series is "Decision: The Conflicts of Harry S. Truman."
Twenty-six shows have already been completed.

Tht reason the series — an examination of his major decisions during the eventful years in the White House — has been launched without the usual fan-fare is that it is sold to individual television stations around the nation, instead of to one of the three major networks.

Most of the 50-odd stations which have acquired the series have launched it this week, but on various nights and in various time periods.

The Truman series has been long time in the making. The former president originally entered into an agreement with producer David Sussidind to make 13 one-hour shows for network broadcast. Two were made and shown to the net-works, which were not interest-

Ben Gradus, producer of the new shows, said the pilot films were made without strong docu-mentation and amounted to a eulogy of Truman. Besides, ABC had been disappointed by the low audience ratings of its fine series on Winston Churchill. It has also completed a docu-mentary series on Franklin D. Roosevelt but has never sched-

Truman, however, wanted a television series and ultimately the rights were aquired by Screen Gems. Gradus was as-

signed to produce the series
"Mr. Truman had the final say — but I don't think he made more than five minor changes in the scripts," Gradus said. "His own book, of course, was the base of our research."
