Steelmen See Busy Period As '64 Ends

NEW YORK (AP) — The steel industry sees busy schedules in the final weeks of the year, despite shutdowns in some customers' plants and demands for more steel.

The United Steelworkers, Inc. is starting to ease up its campaign for spring negotiations. First it may have to settle a leadership fight in its ranks. And the fight is likely to intensify as demands for higher wages. Management already was on notice that the union's asking price would be much stiffer than last time.

Labor shutdowns in many auto plants this fall have held up steel shipments to these big customers. But steel production schedules so far have been affected little. Other customers have kept the mills busy. And orders on hand will keep many working, near capacity, for weeks ahead. Many companies will be using new equipment that will speed up production and lift profits.

The final weeks of the year, and the early ones of next year, look bright indeed.

Pressure for steel price increases continues strong, although held in check now by White House frowns.

Drought Affects 350,000 with Wells in State

HARTFORD (AP) — An estimated 350,000 residents served by home-owned wells in Connecticut reportedly are being affected by New England's drought.

William E. Wilson, acting geologist in charge of the Middlesex branch of the U. S. Geological Survey, made the estimate Monday from 1960 census figures.

"About 35 per cent of Connecticut's population depends on home-owned wells," he said, "and this is not taking into account the many wells serving public water supplies and private water."

L.I. Sniper Hits Six Cars

CENTRAL ISLIP, N.Y. (AP) — A sniper was driving his station wagon in rush hour traffic along the Long Island Expressway when the bullet struck.

"I didn't know what it was," he said, "but all of a sudden I was showered with glass from the right door window."

"I looked around and saw the bullet hole."

La Face, 42, a construction superintendent of Farmingdale, N.Y., pulled off the six-lane highway and stopped behind an empty school bus and a small truck that had also been hit.

"My first reaction was anger," he said. "Then when I was sitting and waiting for the police I became frightened. I was something I'll never forget."

A sniper, firing from woodlands, hit six vehicles late Monday and wounded two other persons, neither seriously.

Police closed a section of the highway for two hours during a large traffic jam.

They questioned several persons, including a hunter, but made no arrest.

Joseph Sadowski, 25, a laborer, of Plainville, N.Y., was riding in the rear of a truck.

"I thought a stone tipped up from the ground and struck me in the arm," he said. "Then I picked up my sleeve and saw the bullet hole."

Edith Green, 36, a trucker's helper, of Bay Shore, N.Y., was grazed by a long wooden bullet pierced the door of the truck in which he was riding. "I heard a crack in the door and my left leg started to burn," he said.
