Rayburn Building to Open, May Be Most Expensive Yet

WASHINGTON (AP)—What is estimated to be the costliest building in the nation—the Rayburn House Office Building—is about to open for business. Although the cost is estimated at \$24.5 million, another \$27.7 million is being spent for related construction. This brings the total to more than \$52 million.

The Rayburn Building, completed in 1954, cost \$7.2 million. New York's Empire State Building cost \$142 million. Chicago's Merchandise Mart cost \$12 million and the United Nations buildings in New York cost \$72 million.

The new building covers a two-block area across from the Capitol and is situated on the site of the old Rayburn building. It will have a main entrance, a second entrance, and a walk-in filing closet that includes a built-in filing cabinet.

The entire floor space is being used for offices. Each office will have a private entrance from the hallway, a lavatory, and a walk-in filing closet that includes a built-in filing cabinet.

Hard Blow Dealt NATO Fleet Plans

WASHINGTON (AP)—Prime Minister Harold Wilson appears to have dealt a severe — if not fatal — blow to the proposed mixed nuclear fleet of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization by declaring Britain opposes the project.

Wilson told the House of Commons Monday his Labor government believes "a mixed nuclear surface fleet adds nothing to Western strength, is likely to cause dissipation of strength in the alliance and may add to the difficulties of East-West agreement."

On the surface, his statement puts London in stern opposition to the plan at the very moment when it seemed to be on the verge of being approved in the British government.

The double-ended fleet, which would have been a mix of nuclear and conventional ships, was being considered as a way to meet NATO's requirements for a fleet of 190 ships.

U.S. officials were surprised at the fitness of Wilson's decorations, but there was some tendency to regard it as the latest move in a series of negotiations.

Wilson said he hoped to obtain the same "quiet rooms" for his office as he had in the State Department.

VATICAN CITY (AP)—The Vatican Ecumenical Council's 1964 session left birth control an issue still unresolved, but it posed questions that imply the possibility of historic changes in Church teaching.

Teachers Win Right to Work Until Age 70

HARTFORD (AP)—Five public school teachers have won their fight to stay on the job until they reach the age of 70. The State Supreme Court ruled Monday that town boards of education do not have the authority to force teachers before they reach the mandatory retirement age of 70 set by state law.

"This power does not reside in the local board," the court said in its unanimous ruling. The decision came on suits filed by Fred Hartford, who teaches in West Hartford, where the retirement age was 65, and by four New Haven teachers—Mary E. O'Connor, Veronica Boland, Helen McKenna and Alice Minix. The retirement age in New Haven was 68.

The ruling apparently affects every public school system in Connecticut where the teacher retirement age is below 70. State law provides that "any member of the (teacher) retirement association retaining the age of 70 years shall be retired from service in the public school system."

The court concluded, adding: "This power does not reside in the local board."

Rockville-Vernon School Board to Aid Potential Dropouts

An all night effort against the problem of high school dropouts was declared last night by the Rockville-Vernon School Board of Education.

The board unanimously adopted a Work Preparation Course proposed by Martin Fagan, principal of Rockville High School.

Fagan noted that about five per cent, about 60 students, drop out of school. This work program would make the potential dropout a potential graduate and a productive worker.

Fagan said that the high school is a multi-purpose organization. Fagan said the board has several different needs, and it is our task to prepare them for so-called dropouts.

In his report, Fagan noted that about 60 per cent of the students are interested in business courses, about 65 per cent in non-academic courses, and 15 per cent in Business Education, Vocational Agriculture, Industrial Arts, Home Economics and Technical Courses.

The remaining five per cent would be enrolled, if they are able to meet the criteria in the new work preparation program.
