Joy And Belief

. The first rites of something like Thanksgiving on the shores of this North American continent seem to have been observed not in the harvest season at all, but in the midst of the promise of spring. It was on May 27, in the year 1578, and the participants were the members of the first English colony in this world, brought to New-

foundland by Sir Martin Frobisher. The next formal ritual of giving thanks seems to have occurred, also as a religious service, at the point known as Sagadahoc, on the Coast of Maine, by the members of what is known as the Popham Colony, in August, in the year 1607, the same year in which James-

town was being settled. But the Thanksgiving we think we follow was first proclaimed for Dec. 13, in the year 1621, by Governor Bradford of the Massachusetts Colony.

That turned out to be a rather rigerous celebration, which prolonged itself for three whole days. They could celebrate for three whole days, our ancestors, because they weren't going any place in particular, and had nothing else very pressing to

do at that time of year. So they began with a feast, and then they did a little singing of psalms, and they fired a cannon or two, and then they engaged in a few sporting contests, and then they ate and sang some more, and drilled and marched, and perhaps bundled some too.

The odors of their cooking, and the of their sports and the boom of their guns attracted the friendly and curious ndians, who had some dances and games of their own to display. As one relives such descriptions of

what the first real Thanksgiving was like, it is easy to understand why, in the years that followed, Thanksgivings became quite popular among the English colonies, so that some of them insisted on having at least two Thanks-

But we have, in the 343 years since then, grown more sober and less capale of the good rejoicing. There were even some years when we had no cascity for Thanksgiving at all. For the President Lincoln proclaimed an official ational Thanksgiving in the year of the battle of Gettysburg, the holiday s been a routine with us. Some years we feel more thankful than others. and is more ritualistic than voluntary. result of the fact that we do not vissalize ourselves in any such primitive struggle for existence itself as that waged by our forefathers day by grim

We never quite seem to make it, to be either as gay or as pious as those Puritans. In fact, we never seem quite able to put the two things together, or to realize that joy and belief might both be parts of the same creed, the

And it is strange that, after 343 years, we should begin realizing that it was the Puritans who were the lively one, who might be able to teach us a great deal about the real enjoyment of

But one can wager that of all the ruts they might conceivably ever settle into, the Communist way of life and politics would be the last they would ever seriously select.

All Ten Feet Tall?

The favorite explanation for the in crease in height in our population is that modern diet is primarily responsible. Getting those proteins and vitaming into those young frames is what makes American men now two inches taller than they were 60 years ago, and women taller too, and both men and women correspondingly heavier, so that the average weight for the American male has become 165 and the average weight for the American woman 12

The same thing is going on in other countries of the world, too. It seems to be especially noticed in Japan, where the young Japanese of today is some four inches taller than his grandfather. And there too a big share of the credit is given to diet, and especially to a school lunch program which has provided nutrition of a kind the polished rice of ancient days never did.

When, to nourish all this mingling of Podunk with Oshkosh, you provide the wonder foods of the twentieth century, the picture comes clear: those washing machines had better get ten feet tall, or the poor housewife will have to stoop down to work them.
