New Phase In Cola War

The soft drink war has entered a new phase, quite as fascinating, in a relaxed way, as the cold war itself.

But before we discuss the latest ploy, a brief summary of what has gone before would seem advisable. During the Eisenhower years, one par-

ticular brand of soft drink had the special entry at the White House and the distinguished ambassadors to send abroad. When it got abroad, one of its chief functions seemed to be to serve as a symbol of the kind of civilization our ideological enemies in the world attacked, and wanted to send home, and considered it capitalist treachery to drink, When Eisenhower left the White House, a rival soft drink of imitative

name, hitherto in second place in popularity, began to establish itself as the new court favorite. At the same time, it began to employ distinguished ambassadors of its own, who began making extended journeys around the world, commenting as authorities on the cold war while they themselves pursued the soft drink, or the cola, war.

The spectacle of two American soft drinks fighting over the world market proved tempting for the Russians under Khrushchev, who often seemed wistfully envious of the ploys and gimmicks capitalism, and the Russians announced that they were about to enter the world market with a soft drink of their own, called Kvass.

What has happened, now, to throw the cola war into a new phase, is the disclosure that one of the American competitors, the one which seemed to come into favor at Washington with the advent of the Kennedy administration, has apparently decided to steal a march on its American competitor and deal a return thrust to the prospective new competition from Russia by invading several of the satellite countries with its

existence in the cola war involves a change of attitude on both sides. The satellite countries will have to give up their own idea that the cola drink is a perialist villainy. And the cola drink in question will, in its turn, have to be willing to do business across the po-


