Retroactive Ruling Once again, the present Supreme Court has made history in such a man-

ner as to create a rather violent emo-

tional and intellectual disturbance among its own members. Those nine members agreed unanimously, yesterday, in the main decision of the day, that holding constitutional the most important single provision of the new Civil Rights Act. All nine members saw their way clear to applying the interstate commerce clause to the operation of the many places of public accommodation required, by the Civil Rights Act, to abolish racial discrimination from their own conduct of their

But the same nine judges split, rather savagely, on a companion decision of the day, in which they made, by five to four vote, what all agreed was a somewhat unusual interpretation of the same 1964 Civil Rights Act.

own business.

The five judge majority held that the passage of that Civil Rights Act, this summer, could be construed to cancel out presecution of as many as 3,000 people arrested before the passage of the Act, over several past years, in the course of their own demonstrations in the civil rights cause.

Most of these arrests were in the South, and they arrested civil rights demonstrators who staged sit-ins or other strategies, and who were then charged with offense against the exist-

Yesterday, the five judge majority held that passage of the Civil Rights Act this summer had a retroactive effect on all these arrests and prosecutions. Their argument employed a legal theory called that of "abatement," a dectrine which says that prosecutions can be abandoned when the law under which they were originally brought has been changed to make the conduct involved lawful.

This was the victorious theory in the court, but the four dissenters. Black, Harlan, Stewart and White, disputed the theory strongly. They saw it more simply as a situation in which their fellow judges were presuming to make a law retroactive, in a way Congress itself had not chosen to do.


With these four dissenting judges, the fasue was more one of principle than of individuals, or of what they themselves wanted done with these pending civil rights cases. The prosecutors and sourts concerned with these cases, in various Southern states, may welcome rather than resent the opportunity to get them all off the docket. In fact, it might have been expected that most of these cases would have been dismissed, or allowed to die, as part of the natural atmosphere in the wake of passage of the Civil Rights Act.

The argument, and the importance concerns a question of precedent and principle. The court majority had a somewhat shadowy principle, which also secorded with common sense. But whether it really had the right to interpret laws backward and make them sover, retroactively, events which occurred before they were adopted-and whether, having done this once, judges may choose to do it again-these questions take their place among other exciting and fundamental questions being asked concerning the functioning of this particular Supreme Court.

Hot Chocolate

Some of civilization's tricks win their way into the jungle faster than others. And, if one may reserve all rights to refrain from any final mass judgment on the human being, one can admit that the kind of trick jungle man likes to learn best from civilized man is the trick which involves the destruction of What primitive fun, what civilized

Not all was pure joy around that special bonfire over in he new African nation of Ghana the other day, when 500 tons of cocoa beans were put to the torch. There, of course, is the key to the whole business. The world's cocoa protucers, like the little pig producers and the wheat producers once in the United States, have been producing too much lately, and cocoa has become a glut on the market so that the people who grow and sell and process cocoa can't get good prices any more. And for this kind of situation civilization has invented for itself a device called the economy of scarcity, which means if you have too much of a good thing selling at too low a price, you burn enough of it up or plow it under until the price goes high

There might, conceivably, be another kind of solution, in which extensive research might discover some human beings somewhere who wanted more meat or wheat or cocoa to eat, and in which some ingenious new concept of economic policy might figure out some way of getting surplus production to them instead of destroying it.

This is the way the jungle might have been inclined to solve such a problem, before it took on the obligations and responsibilities of participation in a civilized economy.

And civilization itself, to give it fair credit, has lately begun experimenting with various possibilities and programs for putting the earth's good bounty, when it occurs, to some good human use instead of to the torch or plow.

All civilization really needs is the intelligence to resolve its own infinite complexities forward to the point where simple common sense can operate again.

Cultural Exchange?

A British scientist is having himself the kind of time all of us might envy, particularly in the beginning of a New England winter, trying to discover, over in Greece, just how the ancient Greeks became master of acoustics without having the technical science which might have qualified them to be experts in the field of sound.

Somehow, perhaps just playing it by ear, the Greeks managed to create the perfect auditoriums, in which, as tourists always discover, the sound of a coin dropped on stage can be heard with perfect clarity in the last and highest If only we could discover the scien-

tific laws the Greeks guessed at, or the scientific laws which would enable us to reproduce the results they got by playing it by ear, then we too could achieve acoustical results equally impressive. While it is thus envious of the still un-

explained expertness of the Greeks, our modern world is pursuing its own known talents and its own established scientific laws in the hope of achieving an even greater sensitivity of communication than that of any Greek amphi-

An underground nuclear explosion down in Hattiesburg, Miss., has just proved that seismic waves transmit themselves more easily to greater distances across relatively old geological regions than across younger and newer, the Eastern United States, in this instance, having the older geology, the West, where underground explosions have hitherto been tested, being the

younger region, geologically speaking. This means that there is greater hope now that our scientists will consider it safe to enter an international agreement banning underground nuclear tests. Scientists are developing more and more confidence that such explosions can eventually be detected just as easily as explosions in the air can be detected and


After the modern world has learned to take another small controlling hitch n its own nuclear power belt, it may want to drift back toward some of the thinking the Greeks orated in those remarkably advanced theatres of theirs. Just as they seemed to have excellent acoustics without acoustical science, so they had knowledge of the depths and heights of the human soul without paychiatry. And they would tell us, we think, although we don't finger the precise quotation at the moment, that the answer to the bomb lies not in our science, and not in how far the tremors of an explosion can be measured, but within ourselves, and how well we can wear and share the sacred gift of life.

Morality Is Realism

America's leading iconoclast, Dean Acheson, has addressed himself in his usual trenchant style to the subject of morality and ethics in American eign policy. As might have been ex-pected, he's again' them—or appears to exist for right and wrong in international relations. The crux of Mr. Acheson's argument

is that it is "stupid"—almost "im-moral"—for the United States to deny itself "the use and threat of force" to achieve its purposes. He points out that our adversaries employ it, under hand; excuses, whenever it seems useful." Unquestionably, many American involvements in foreign affairs have been soft-headed and many more have been injurious to the moral principles this country seeks to advance. But much of this misdirection is attributable to ambivalence in trying to wed expendience
