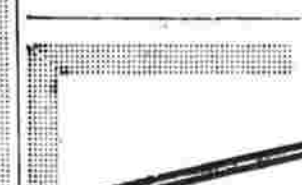


**POOR JUDGMENT**

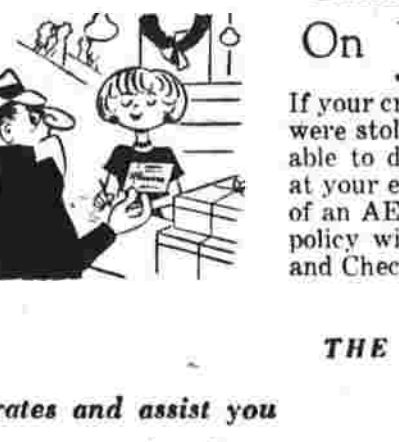

**William Bendix, Chester Riley Both Dead at 58**

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Actor William Bendix is dead, and Chester Riley, radio and the movies. Bendix succumbed Monday at Los Angeles Good Samaritan Hospital to lobar pneumonia, complicated by a stomach ailment. He was 58.

At his bedside were his wife of 17 years, Theresa, 56; daughter, Mrs. Alan Ladd, with whose late actor husband Bendix once starred. During his career, Bendix played characters ranging from brutal villains to everybody's pal. To millions of fans of "The Life of Riley" television show, Bendix' death was a double loss. It removed Chester Riley, the "harried father."

Bendix' wife once admitted to an interviewer: "Chester Riley and Bill Bendix are alike in a lot of ways. Bill's bluff manner doesn't let outsiders know what he is like at all. He has all the kindness and desire to help others that Riley is noted for. Sometimes when I watch a Riley show, I say to myself, 'You'd think the writers lived with William Bendix.'"

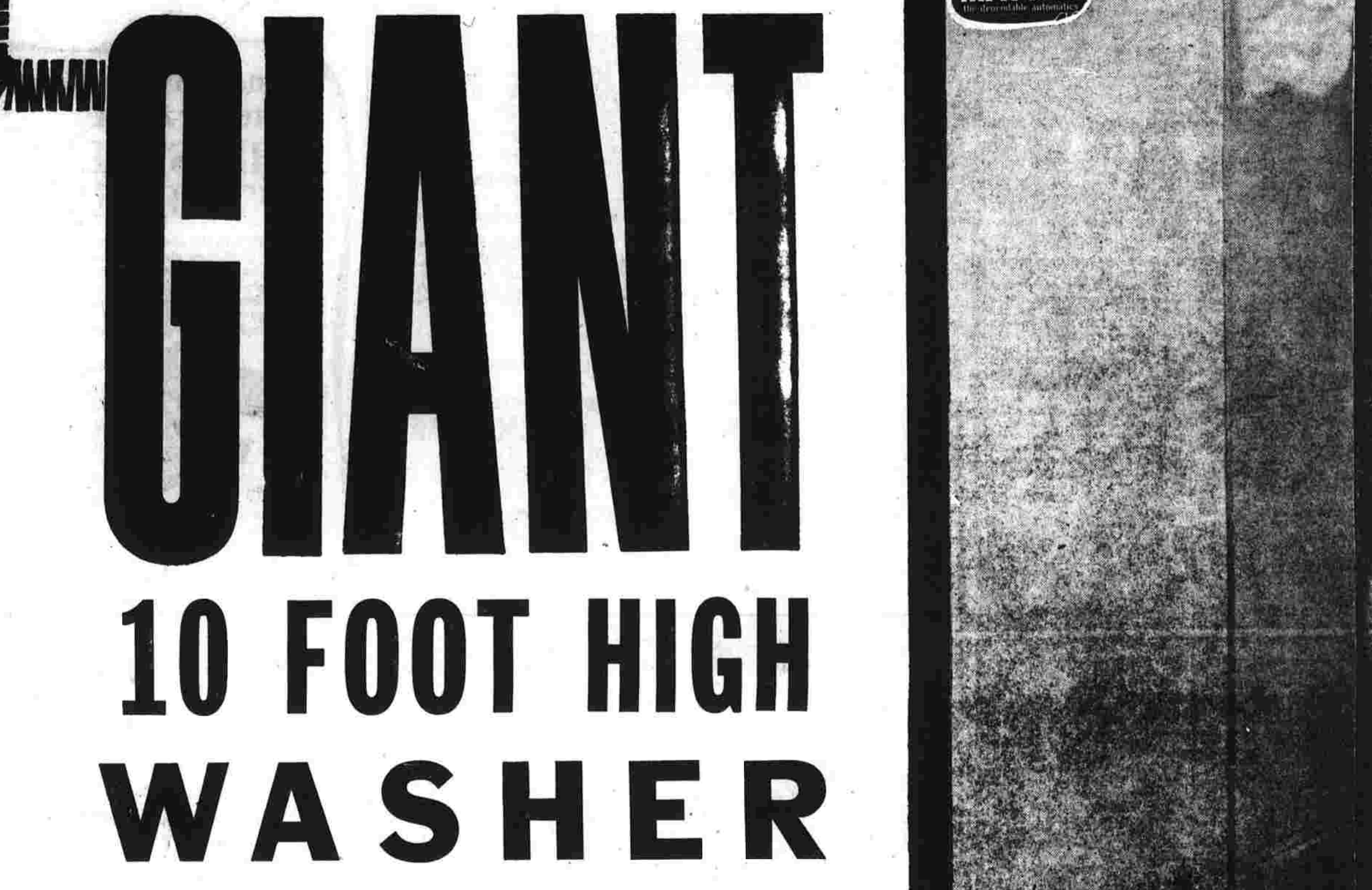

Rockville-Vernon Pearl Heads Ticket For GOP Campaign

First Selection Samuel W. Pearl last night received unanimous support at a Republican caucus as a candidate for mayor or under a consolidated government.

However, Pearl's victory was marred by the possibility that one or two dissident Republicans may seek a primary for both on the city and on the board of representatives.

District candidates to the board will be Thomas Carruthers, Frank McCoy, Frank Inella and George Risley.

Also named as candidates last night were Peter Durstelo and Joseph Greenwood as selectmen, and Walter Campbell, Mrs. Dorothy Rider and the Rev. Paul Bowman as candidates to the board of education.

A floor fight heralded the selection of the nominating committee at last night's caucus, and observers indicated that a similar fight, led by supporters of Gill and Mrs. Belotti, was held at a Republican Town Committee meeting just prior to the caucus.

Following the caucus, Mrs. Belotti said she had not yet decided to hold a primary, "if I want to go home and sleep on it," she said.

The nominating committee's slate was presented by Charles O'Flynn, representing the committee, Gill and Mrs. Belotti were nominated by William E. Ham, former chairman and present member of the Vernon board of education.

During a discussion of the procedures to be used in voting for the candidates, Joseph Belotti, husband of the political hopeful, presented a written motion to John E. Grant, moderator of the caucus. The motion called for election of candidates by written ballot.

Mayor Leo Fishery following a Democratic Town Committee meeting last week, Pearl said, "the opposition party has promised a no holds barred campaign. We work differently."

Pearl continued, "and I'd rather run a clean fight, speak the truth, and let our record speak for itself."

Pearl also noted, however, that "we've got to be aggressive."

The candidate for mayor noted that the opposition has made very misleading statements in the paper." He added that "this is the start of this sort of thing," noting that more such statements may be expected.

Pearl went through the list of candidates, commenting on the experience of each one. He pointed to the efforts of Olson who, as mayor of Rockville, initiated Rockville's elderly housing, redevelopment effort, creating Rockville's shopping center.

When Pearl reached the name of Thomas Carruthers, GOP town chairman and a candidate for the board of representatives, he said Carruthers was "a very close friend of mine."

The laughter which ensued may have been caused by the close "boiler room" fighting reported at the town committee meeting. That meeting was closed to the press.

Pearl advised candidates to stick to a two-part campaign program: tell the truth, and think of the good of the town first and the good of the party second.

Wilton Flamm, a town committee member, told Republicans present that "Fishery's statements are phony. We've tried in the past to tell the truth but we've done a poor job of selling it."

"We've done such a poor job (selling the truth) Flamm continued, "that we have forced people into Fishery's camp."

Teachers Allowed to Apply For Exchange with Salary

The board of education voted unanimously last night to allow two elementary school teachers to apply to exchange with salary. The move represents an extension of an al board policy, which in recent years provided only for teacher exchanges without salary.

The teachers, Dorothy Deo of Verplank School and Robert Martin of Buckley School, both present, spoke briefly about the Teacher Exchange Program which sponsors and coordinates the exchanges.

Such an exchange has only one precedent in the memory of Superintendent of Schools William H. Curtis. That occurred in 1956 when teachers from Hawaii and Manchester High School exchanged positions for a year.

Miss Zezo and Martin are applying for an exchange with Great Britain. There are 80 exchange positions open for the coming school year.

If the exchange is approved by the government, the State Department will present the potential replacements to Manchester for approval. Curtis said that standards of acceptability would have to differ from usual ones since it is unlikely that the visiting teachers would have the certification required by the state. He added that the State Department would be replacing applications until two were found acceptable as teachers in our school system.

On the other permanent concern, resignation requests from Mrs. Rita Dorewin, William West-old and Gordon Turner, all teachers, were approved.

Mrs. Joan Scels and Mrs. Mary E. Guma, elementary school teachers, were granted one year maternity leaves for absence. The effective date of the leaves of absence previously granted to Mrs. Marion Cummings to begin the end of this month was changed and now will begin Jan. 8 of the coming year.

The board accepted the resignation of Olof L. Anderson from the Citizens' Advisory Council of the Manchester Community College. Anderson was recently elected to the board of directors. The resignation of Ralph Johnson, part-time community college instructor, was also accepted.

Enrollment Data Given

Some interesting facts on the Andover Elementary School enrollment were presented last week's Chat, a weekly newsletter sent to parents of children in school. Present enrollment was given as 278, and the estimated number of pupils entering next fall and for each year through 1970 was stated.

By deducting each year's sixth graders who will be leaving the school and then adding the school enrollment figures for those pupils entering each year, the probable enrollment next fall to the fall of 1970 can be determined. It appears that the enrollment next year will be 290. In the fall of 1969 the pupils will number 290.

The Germans had caddy last off for a while with their V-1s. I'd been having a little late party at my flat, and Glenn was one of the boys mostly musicians — who'd dropped by."

### Water Firm Bars Sale to District

The privately owned Manchester Water Co., serving the town's North End area, is not for sale. This is the word given the Eighth Utilities District's directors in a letter from the water company president William Foulds. The district directors have demanded that the water company be sold to the district. Foulds also told the district that the company's directors feel that the firm is not able to help the district pay for a sewer line break in Hollister St. last January. The district's directors have contended that the sewer broke because of a washout that resulted from a break in the water company's Hollister St. line. The directors of the district and the water company were to have met last night to discuss the Hollister St. sewer break. The agenda could have been expanded to include discussion of the sale of the water company. The session was called off after the water company delivered a letter to the district secretary Joseph Vols Friday stating the company officials felt they had nothing to discuss. Instead, the district board has decided to include discussion of the water company's position on the two issues. In addition, the conversation also touched on a water company charge to the district for water supplied at hydrants for fire protection. The district operates both the sewer service and the fire department serving the North End area. The water company serves approximately the same section of town. According to Atty. LaBelle, the water company's refusal to sell leaves but one course open to the district if it wishes to obtain control of the private utility condemnation under the district's charter. Before the district could begin condemnation procedures it must have the necessary funds to complete the purchase. However, a bond issue would have to be approved in advance of the purchase. According to the town assessor's office, the water company's property is assessed at about \$280,000. Meanwhile the town could move to buy the water company as well, following the same procedure. Both the town and the district have equal votes under its charter and the town under a Special Act approved by the General Assembly in 1959. Atty. LaBelle said the sale or condemnation would also require approval of the State Public Utilities Commission. The water company turned down the district's request to consider sale of its assets in a letter authorized by the private utility board of directors at a meeting on Dec. 9. According to the letter, "the company's board is unanimous in the decision. It continues that the board 'feels the company is well managed and is performing a good public service.' The company also refused by letter to entertain a liability

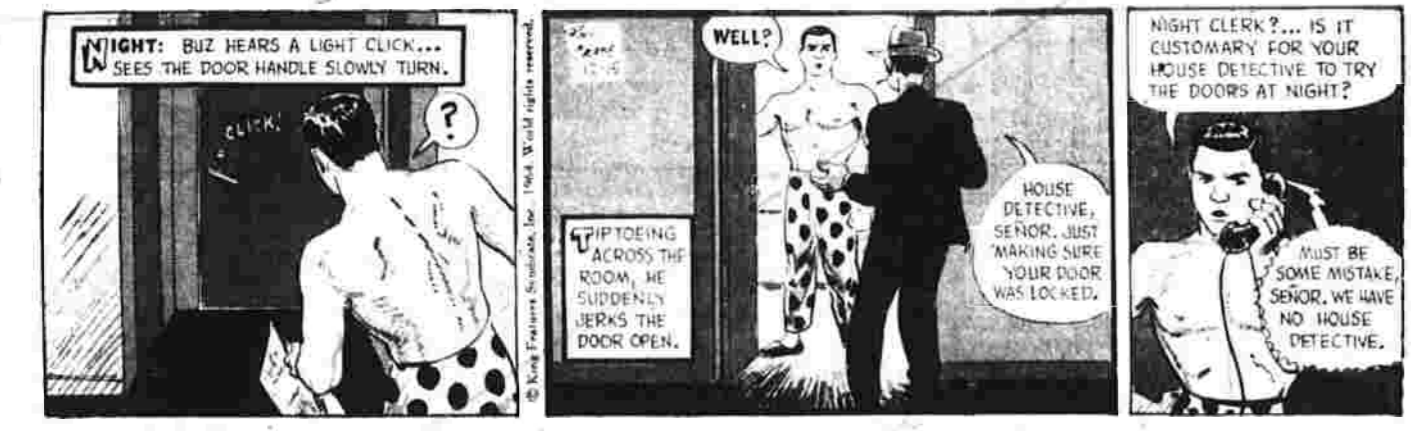

# Strong Ring Finish Nets Giardello Win

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—It was like the old mad-dog against the young, dangerous bull.

Middleweight champion J. Giardello came perilously close to being gored but he called on every trick he learned in 15 years of pro boxing to beat strong Rubin (Hurricane) Carter in his first title defense Monday night.

A rousing finish in the last few rounds of the 15-round bout earned the unanimous decision over the muscular, 27-year-old second-ranking contender from Paterson, N.J., at Convention Hall.

Giardello was cut over the left eye and shaken by a jolting left hook in the fourth round. Carter had his big right hand in that round but he blew it. Giardello absorbed several other solid left hooks to the jaw from his ever-threatening foe but Pat Joey always managed to slip away from the brink of disaster.

"If I only could have made him fall," said Carter. "Just once, if I could have made him fall, that was the difference. He won't clear—at least 9 to 6—but a fall would have clinched it."
