Nigeria Speaks For Law

The nation of Nigeria, having become the first African native government to defend the legality and the propriety of the American-Belgian air expedition into the Congo, will probably find itself being classified, by some of its continental contemporaries, as a sort of "Uncle Tom" nation.

And we in Manchester can indeed testify, from past association with several Nigerian visitors, that they are a genial, pleasant people who somehow seem to have emerged into their own independence without either racial bitterness or ideological extremism.

But it is something better and more mportant than mere geniality and something more statesmanlike than any "Uncle Tomism" which is involved in Nigeria's stand in the Security Council debate on the American-Belgian expedition to Stanleyville.

What Nigeria was trying to do yesterday was to take a stand on law rather than emotions, on what might be legal rather than on what it might like. One can question whether Nigeria likes Moise Tshombe, whom most Afrieans seem to regard as a traitor to the race and the continent.

But what the Nigerian delegate reminded everybody yesterday was that "in this United Nations we all agree that the Congo is a sovereign, independent state of Africa" and that "the Democratic Republic of the Congo," which is thus recognized, "tells us that there is no foreign intervention in its territory; that those who are accused of intervening came with its knowledge, consent, approval and indeed by invita-

And, while the Nigerian delegate thus bought the idea that the American-Belgian expedition was a legal affair, he went on to label and protest the illegality of the interference some other African states are reportedly trying to make in Congolese affairs. And he urged them to abide by law, and by the United Nations Charter, no matter what their feelings about Tshombe. And thus there comes, from at least

one country in Africa, the sermon much more civilized nations still need to hear and honor-that law, whether it is popular or not, whether it appeals to one's emotions or not, whether it promises the quickest practical solution or not, now constitutes, and will constitute from now on, the only real hope for all peoples, all countries, all continents.

Ike Or Anybody Else

With one of Senator Barry Goldwater's post mortems one can almost agree. That is when he says that former President Dwight Eisenhower was the only Republican who could have defeated Lyndon Johnson for the Presidency last Nov. 3.

But the more we think it over the less willing we are to accept such a glib pronouncement. In the first place, if Dwight Eisen-

hower, assuming he could have been eligible, had campaigned for the Presidency in the same style in which he operated in his own party affairs during the 1963-64 period, we are not sure ne wouldn't have been engulfed, too. In the second place, we are not sure almost any Republican, Eisenhower or anybody else, couldn't have made a real

run out of it against Johnson, in comparison to the collapse which actually happened. We don't think it would have taken very much-and we expect this opinon to be substantiated and reinforced by the way public reaction to the man now in the White House develops in the next few months-to have compelled the Democratic candidate into a type of

What we will all never know is just what a coherent, intelligent, disciplined discussion of issues would have done to the campaign and to the Democratic andidate. What we had, as can be seen the more clearly the more mercifully it fades into the distance, was a scatterissue performance by a candidate who

Political realism still says that any man in Johnson's position, succeeding a martyr President, looking forward to his own first term in his own right, would have been extremely hard to beat. But the point still is, also, that nobody really did try, and that any comparison of potential runs should start with the assumption that what we had was rock ottom, the ultimate minimum, than which none could have gone lower, and which anyone else could not have failed

Upon the receipt of this check. Norman Thomas made a typical remark. "It won't last long," he said, "because every organization I'm connected with is going bankrupt."

Heve in peace and in the goodness of men have to make such a proud display of their inability to handle money? Why can't Norman Thomas be everything he is and still meet a payroll? Oh, we know our idealists. They pre-

tend to be proud of the fact that they have no money, and don't make any. Or ff. by any chance, they happen to have inherited money, they pretend to be ashamed of it and they spend the rest of their lives trying to apologize for it by all kinds of impractical good deeds. But carve your way through that outer softness to the last hard core of their being and you might discover that they all secretly wish they had what it takes to balance books and amass an

This pretense of disdain for the inability to make money eventually becomes a pious routine, boring and unattractive, Really, who would have voted for Norman Thomas even if we could have? Wasn't our man in there right along, one who had every conceivable fine principle anybody ever heard of, and a way with the dollar too?

Ethics In Foreign Policy

Former Secretary of State Dean Acheson has done a public service in liscussing at Amherst College the role of ethics in foreign policy. The burden of his speech might be paraphrased by fore wise as serpents, and harmless as doves." Such, he seems to be saying should be the watchword for United States foreign policy.

Mr. Acheson runs the risk of being nisunderstood. Yet he was categoric in his statement of the general principles which should inspire the conduct of American diplomacy. "I take it as clear," he said, "that

where an important purpose of diplo-macy is to further good relations between states, the methods—the modes of conduct-by which relations between states are carried on must be designed inspire trust and confidence. schieve this result, the conduct of diplomacy should conform to the same moral and ethical principles which inspire trust and confidence when followed by and between individuals." He warns against absolute, over-

noralistic, no-retreat commitment to such catch-all phrases as self-determination or renunciation of the use of force. To withhold such a commitmen might seem tantamount to refusing to be against sin. But, as Mr. Acheson suggests, it is better to combine respect r the ethical with a measure of prag matism. He calls it "the strategic ap

This he sums up as follows: "The end sought by our foreign policy, the pur pose for which we carry on relations with foreign states, is . . . to preserve and foster an environment in which free societies may exist and flourish Our policies and actions must be tested whether they contribute to or de tract from achievement of this end." The vardstick for this test is informd human judgment-which is neces-

arily subjective. Views are bound to differ as to which is the wiser or more profitable course. Such was the case in 956 at the time of Suez. Mr. Acheson argued for a greater United States com nitment to friends under indictment in United Nations. Nobody would question his integrity or patriotism i aking such a stand. But the Eisen hower administration chose instead to break with Britain. France and Israe over their resort to force. We happen to hink that, even by Mr. Acheson's own criterion, he has been proven wrong and the Eisenhower administration

What it boils down to, of course, to choosing the way of enlightened self timate needs in Christ, nterest in a manner which does not detract from, but rather enhances, the confidence and trust of others in the United States.—CHRISTIAN SCIENCE

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay — When ex-Argentine dictator Juan Peron scheduled a stop in Uruguay on his abortive trip home last week, this nation's nine - man government council (Uruguay abolished its presidency in 1951) went into its usual agony of indecision. What to do? Should Peron be sent to Spain or not?
While the multi-factional council debated, others acted this time. The Minister of Defense (controlling the army) and the Minister of the Interior (conrtolling the police) decided on their own that Peron should be returned to Spain immed ately. Much to its surprise and shock, the important National Council was ignored.

Because Brazil sent Peron Spain before he reached Monte-

video, the Uruguyan decision was moot. But the incident points up the possibility that the military might step in if if political and economic stagation continues here. "Believe me, a coup d'etat here today is an entirely possie event," a worried politician

him of activities hostile to the Soviet Union. They termed Tahombe a henchman of imperiture and said his regime was carrying on a campaign of slander against the Soviet Union.

In a procedural wrangle at the start of the Congo debate last week, Fedorenko called the paratroop operation "aggression by Belgium, the United States and Britain" and said the Congolese people were engaged "under appropriate conditions."
