EDITOR'S NOTE: A voluntary organization with headquarters in Norwalk is helping poverty-stricken people in many lands to help themselves. Here is the story of the Community Development Foundation.)....

NORWALK (AP)—You might call it the "Do-It-Yourself Peace Corps," this crew of counselors scattered through many of the world's poverty-stricken areas.

Villages from Mexico to India have been remedying some of their poverty problems by undertaking assorted projects and doing the work themselves—spurred to action by the Community Development Foundation.

The foundation's counselors put the emphasis on guidance rather than financial or material help. They distribute, more than anything else, confidence, encouragement and know-how.

The results are rewarding. There are roads now, built by the villagers themselves. Some of the community. There is plumbing where none existed before. There are projects, such as poultry-raising, that bring income to the otherwise destitute villages.

The foundation, an international voluntary welfare organitonal vo

"Community development," he says, "begins with respect for people, and belief in their great potential for economic and training—and a minimum of money—for programs in the underprivileged areas of the world.

At the heart of the organization are the counselors, who At the heart of the organization are the counselors, who live with the villagers and launch them on projects to improve the community and the lives of the people.

Glen Leet, the foundation's executive director, says that the counselors have found "that when village people realize the strength they have within themselves to change the basic reasons for their poverty, they are eager to work."

Many of the counselors are "graduates" of the Peace Corps, the governmental organization started during the administration of the late President John F. Kennedy.

Mays collected 21 doubles, nine triples and a league-leading 47 homers among 179 hits in 1964. He also extended two ratrecords, highest career slugging average, 589, and most consecutive years, 300 or more total bases, 11.


