# "That's Show Biz"

Perhaps it's because the writer is overly sentimental. Or maybe it's the season—when everyone is remembering holidays and other things past. But we were taken back a good many years earlier this week with the news item about the 20th anniversary of Glenn Miller's disappearance.

First came the remembrance of a Sunday afternoon when we barged into the middle of a huge line at the State Theater in Hartford (quite by innocents) and thus managed to grab a seat to watch, in person, the Miller orchestra. We saw the group again at the State before they entered the armed forces, and like thousands of others, waited patiently for the boys to come back.

But on Dec. 15, 1944 Glenn Miller disappeared. The band never was the same again although he was reorganized by Tex Benke, and later by an Air Force sideman, drummer Ray McKinley.

The band's music, however, lives on. It's one of the phenomena of the business that records of a man and an orchestra gone for 20 years can still be among the best sellers.

Miller's music was so popular that record companies

ransacked their files and came up with tapes and master records of radio broadcasts, a Carnegie Hall concert, and the sound track from the two movies in which the group was featured, "Orchestra Wives" and "Sun Valley Serenade." # After 64 Years in Prison Everything's Exciting In World of the Free

Editor's note: Richard Honeck's left prison. And that despite neck, after spending 64 years in prison for murder, was released on parole to his California niece.

Dec. 20, 1964. Mrs. Clara Orth saw an Associated Press picture, recognized Honeck as her uncle and persuaded officials to release him. Here's the story on his first year of freedom.

SAN LEANDRO, Calif. (AP)—At a spotlight on Richard Honeck finds excitement in everything from supermarkets to shaving.

One of his many happy chores is to walk each day at 11 a.m. from his niece's trailer home to the entrance of the trailer park and pick up the mail.

Recently, there was a letter from Rose V. Randolph, widow of Illinois' Menard prisoner where Honeck served 64 years for the murder of a former school teacher.

As a Christmas treat, I am reminded of my pleasant experience of nearly a year ago when you were making preparations to go to California, the warden wrote.

"I would be happy to hear from you sometime when you have time to write. Would you be interested in knowing what you are doing and how your niece, Mrs. Clara Orth, is getting along?"

The warden's curiosity is shared by hundreds. Christmas cards are piling up at the Orth home from all over the United States and as far away as Germany. Friends Honeck never met and never will be asking about him.

He said he would offer amendments incorporating both changes.

The recess came with legislative leaders confident that the convention measure would win approval in the House.

### Right Bills Can Result In Savings

BY SAM DAVENON  
NEW YORK (AP)—A lot of people can save money by spending more right now. The money will be saved in taxes. The money spent must be put over till next year will be subject to a smaller bite from the U.S. Treasury.

Many people can't do much about it. But many can. And if you're in love, you could save tax money by getting married before New Year's Day. If you're moving to a new job in another town and the costs are up to you, you might save by transferring now rather than waiting to celebrate the New Year with your present employer.

Or you might save in the long run by paying for a new car in right now by delaying to later bills, or to pay people for interest due, or to cash in those paper profits to get money for the holidays. You might save by admitting you picked some sour ones this year in the stock market and selling the stock and taking your loss—now, not sometime next year.

These possibilities arise because of the federal income tax rates, which were cut on 1964 income, go down another notch in 1965. In 1965 the tax brackets run from 20 per cent to 71 per cent depending on how much income is subject to tax. The drop next year isn't that steep, but it's still something to consider. The 1965 rates will range from 14 to 70 per cent.

So you'll pay less on the same amount of income next year. Therefore, any deduction that over after taxes. And any income that can legally be put over till next year will be subject to a smaller bite from the U.S. Treasury.

### Shaved Head Required For Role as Franklin

NEW YORK (AP) — Benjamin Franklin thought he might have become the first U.S. president had his son not been a star during the American Revolution.

This is one of the facts about the Founding Father that Robert Preston learned while studying for his role in the Broadway musical.

His portrayal requires a wig, and Bob has to shave his head each night before going on stage.

Playing the role of a 70-year-old diplomat is no problem to the sprightly actor. He is used to being older than his actual age.

"Even as a kid I never played anyone young," he said. "As in my first film, I played Barbara Stanwyck's husband. I only played one juvenile part in my life, and found it so dull I never did another."

Preston was born in Newton Highlands, Mass., but moved to California in childhood, graduating from high school, he joined a repertory company headed by Tyrone Power's mother, and took part in 42 productions before being signed by Paramount Pictures.

He grew a mustache to make him look more mature, and during the next dozen years or so became one of the most versatile villains in screen history.

Preston proved his gift for comedy in Broadway revivals before his biggest success came in "The Misfit Man."

A man of gusty vitality, he enjoys his work hugely and has no ambition to become either a writer or director.

"Everything I do is in my own reward," he observed. "Anybody who works at anything he doesn't like is my sympathy. I feel sorry for actors who think their job is a chore."

"That I don't have many dislikes, I don't even dislike going to the dentist, because I accept it as necessary in the scheme of things," he said.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Mrs. Robert H. Humphrey doesn't expect her life to change very much when her husband becomes vice president.

## Bastogne's Mayor Recalls Horror

EDITOR'S NOTE — It was just before the last Christmas of World War II. The Allies were on the verge of victory in Europe. Then the Germans revived to fight the Battle of the Bulge. The way it went in Bastogne is told in this story written for "The Associated Press" by the man who at the time was burgomaster — mayor — of the Belgian town.

BASTOGNE, Belgium (AP) — In that December 30 years ago, snow had been falling thick on this capital of the rugged Ardennes Forest area, covering the gray stone and blue slate of the town. The snow covered the black pine on the hills and high plateaus nearby.

Terrified women, children and cattle were sheltering in cellars or stables across Bastogne and on surrounding farms.

Then tracer bullets and exploding shells replaced the Bethlehem star in Bastogne's sky.

Seventy-two thousand U.S. soldiers were to spill their blood in these tragic Christmas days, marking Bastogne's name in golden letters — beside Stalingrad, Alamein and Caen — in the history of German defeat.

GIs had liberated us the previous September. We were preparing to celebrate our first Christmas in peace with them when, on Dec. 17, a rumor spread across town that the Germans had launched a counter-offensive near Namur, a Luxembourg town 17 miles away.

Our first reaction was disbelief. How could Germans rout this powerful U.S. Army, equipped with the most modern material?

But anxiety grew with the news as guns grew louder.

It was Sunday and we went to church for an evening benedic-

### Commuter Clock Devised To Keep Track of Mice

WASHINGTON (AP) — Hickorymice usually enter traps only at night, and many spend one or more days in the home area without entering available traps.

Thus, the fastest moving speed clock by the older methods will only catch mice in-cube of cheese — for insertion beneath a mouse's skin.

The signal-sending gadget is designed to allow remote-control tracking of a mouse's movements — especially how swiftly he heads to his next spot when he finds himself in unfamiliar territory.

The researchers reported some surprising findings about the homing behavior of the rodents — findings which presumably would be helpful in any scientific program in a e-eradication program.

For one thing, it seems mice navigate directly back home. Biologists Kenneth E. Dawson and Peter H. Jarrin, of Swarthmore College, Pennsylvania, came up with the mouse news in a report in the Technical Journal of Science, official weekly of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. They gave this account:

Previous attempts to study the homing behavior of mice involved releasing them some distance from their nests and then timing the interval up to their recapture in traps placed near their homes. This method has been used by researchers at Varo Beach, Fla., and Magen's Bay, St. Thomas.

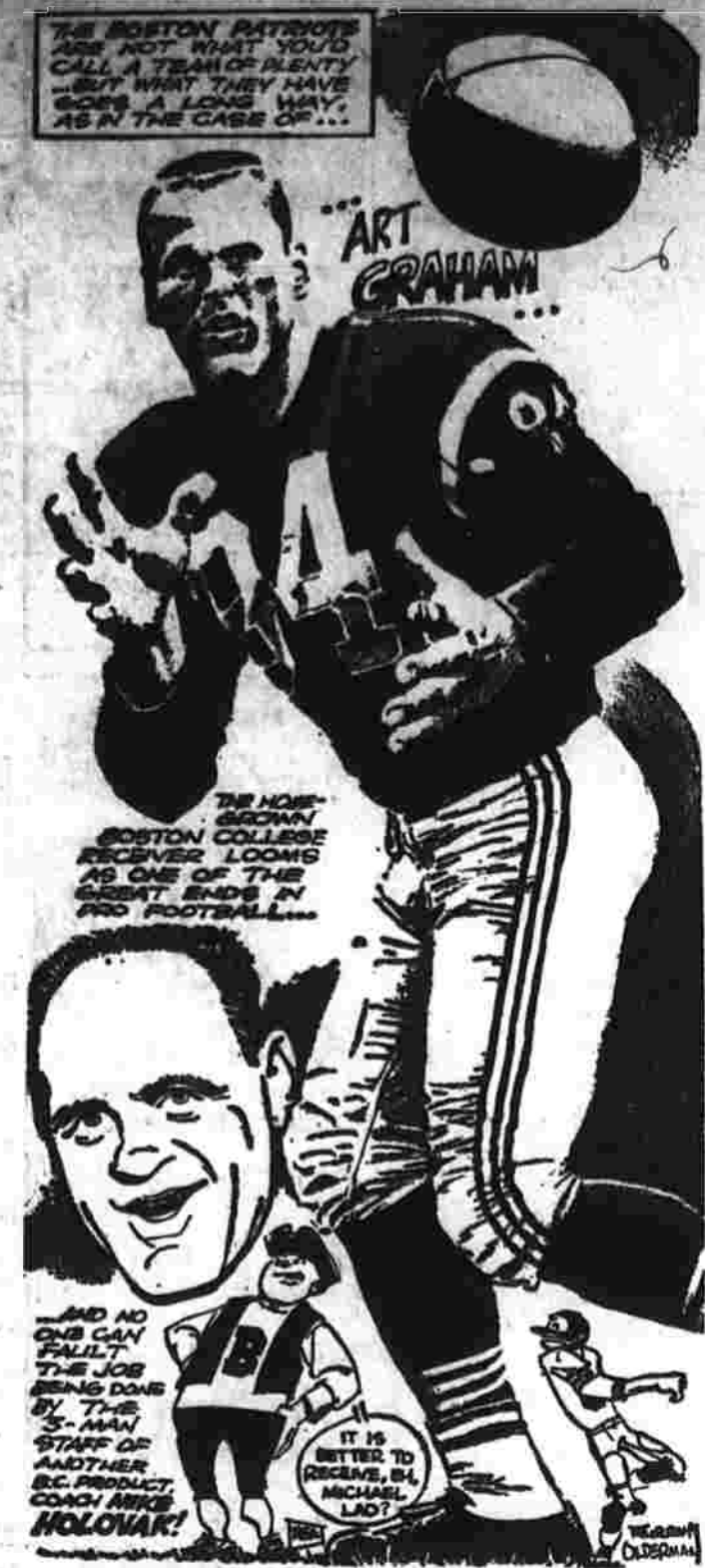
