

## How Many Real Goldwaterites?

A "confidential" post-election survey of Republican voters has leaked some of its results, and given its answer to some of the questions of particular interest to political analysts and to Republican party planners in the wake of the Norember debacle. The most interesting single question

asks just how many of the 27,000,000 people who voted the Republican ticket on Nov. 3 were full die-hard supporters of the party's particular nominee, Senator Goldwater.

The Goldwater camp has claimed, after the election, that these 27,000,000 had to be counted as all fervent Goldwater enthusiasts, and that, on this basis, Goldwater and his associates had in their pockets a great 27,000,000 nucleus upon which the future of the Republican party must be built, according to their prescriptions.

Other Republicans have had varying opinions, tempered by their own acquaintance with their own voting mood or that of some fellow Republicans who voted Republican last November primarily because they had been Republicans all their lives, not because they were in love with Goldwater. But everybody admits that there is,

in the party, a hard core of true Goldwater enthusiasts, who thought, and still think, that he is the only candidate who has truly represented his party since Herbert Hoover. This present "confidential" survey,

made by a reputable national polling firm, who are being paid to do it by a group of Republicans who include several large contributors to the Goldwater campaign, offers results which will not please Mr. Goldwater or his supporters.

By this survey's findings, only some 5.4 million of the 27 million who voted for the Senator can now be classed as devotees of Mr. Goldwater. And, if one wants to go down to some real hard core of Republicans so loyal to Goldwater they would leave the party with him if he left it, the survey cuts the figure down to 2.5 million.

We think we would have guessed a little higher than that as to the number or percentage of Republicans who really "went for" Goldwater. Of those who remained in their own party column after 25 per cent of normal Republicans had crossed over to Johnson for this one election, we would have said that approximately one third would be die-hard Goldwater enthusiasts, who would thus have included 9 million of the 27 million who finally voted for him. That, in our estimate, constitutes a rather permanent nucleus of Republiand honestly an extremely conservative

Their historic predicament is, or course, that there is never any place for right wing Republicans to go when they are displeased with their party, while Republican moderates can, as they did in 1936 and in 1964, find it possible to find a temporary home with the Democrats. A somewhat similar predicament captures the really extreme liberals on the left side of the Democratic party. They may not, many of them, relish the Johnson regime, but where were they to go? In 1948, the liberal fringe did desert the Democratic party and organize an extremist party of its own, and got nowhere, not even succeeding in bringing about the defeat of Truman, the Democrat it couldn't stand. Perhaps the Republican right wing, as of now, is heading toward some eventual third party effort in futility. Or perhaps one can say it has just gone through that effort, on Nov. 3. Perhaps it was the potential third party which ran this year, with an 18 million vote assist from

## The Simple Tax Life

It always interests us how proposal o simplify and "equalize" the tax icture tend to wind up in the oppo site direction. To a considerable extent of course, the tendency is merely tribute to the structure's complexity and the heaviness of its burden. The latest case in point is this week's Brookings Institution's sizable study ione by tax expert Richard Goode after three years of work. The report is said to be getting the attention of the Treasury, and it is possible some of it may show up in Administration recommen-

Along with observations many tax payers would second-such as that the individual exemption is too small and should be boosted-Mr. Goode ha some fairly drastic things in mind. His general objective, it would seem, is to treatments in present tax law But perhaps nowhere is the disparity between the aims of simplicity and means on the other more pronounced than in connection with tax eductions for college education. Instead of providing deductions for parents, which may or may not be a desirable approach, Mr. Goode would let student himself deduct college tuition and certain related costs from future income over a period of 10 to 20 years. The benefit would be allowed regardless of who paid for the education. In part the theorizing about college education is that expenses made for the purpose, or in the hope, of producing ductible; so stated it may sound persua

sive. It nonetheless seems to us that theory actually violates a number principles of sound tax policy and also embraces a couple of more general misconceptions. The intent aside, the proposal does

set up still another group, in this instance college students, for special treatment. Some might even call it oiling of one more inequity on top of the tax system's existing ones; isn't i unfair to all those young people who for one reason or another don't go to college? Is it even fair to the college student who needs the money now, gardless of what his situation might be Certainly it is an extension of the un fortunate propensity to grant subsidies indirectly through tax legislation There is more than enough of that already. If the public in its wisdom deem

it proper to subsidize college students

then the issue should be aired on its A broader trouble with the approach, think, lies in viewing college study the laudable fact that higher education is revered in our country; sometimes however, the reverence can result in confusing quantity with quality At the risk of heresy we will remark that while college is an investment for some students it is certainly not for campus with no academic busines there. Words like "cure and "initacle" and phony endorsements like this all are outlawed.
