### Attorney Says Law Prohibits Religious Wine

NEW HAVEN (AP)-A strict interpretation of the Connecticut drinking law would forbid the serving of wine to minors at religous services, a lawyer for a Darien psychiatrist argued today.

The lawyer, Robert M. Mc Anerney, appeared in behalf of Dr. and Mrs. George S Hughes at a hearing before the Ap-pellate division of Circuit Court McAnerney, in an hour-long plea today, contended that "the issue is a relatively simple and fine issue — whether the pro-visions of the Connecticut liquor statutes apply to the delivery of alcoholic beverages to a minor within the confines of a private home.

He said "the issue of teen-age drinking and the morality of teen-age drinking is not an issue before this court.'

McAnerney said a strict inlead to "absurdity and certain bisarre and ridiculous results." He said it would prohibit grandfather serving wine to his grandson at a religious cere-mony, a clergyman serving a minor at a communion rite, or a young husband serving a cocktail to his twenty-year-old

One of the three judges, David Jacobs, asked McAnerney if he were maintaining that a few sips of wine at a religious ceremony fell within the purview of the statute.

McAnerney replied: "my answer to that would be yes, i was any consistency

Engineering Plus Morality The engineering aspects of President ohnson's proposition for a new seaevel canal across Central America will ake considerable exploration; certain political effects are immediately appar-

The President's announcement did two things. It set up the goal of an entirey new canal, to replace the Panama Canal as the main artery for passage of great ships between the two oceans. and then it promised that, in conjunc-Mon with this plan, the United States would be ready to renegotiate the present treaty by which we hold and operate the present Panama Canal.

These twin announcements happen to have caused consternation in one particular quarter, and only one. Who is particularly upset by the an-

nouncement that the United States, perhaps not needing Panama any more for passage from ocean to ocean, is ready to enegotiate its present treaty with Pan-

The answer is that the ones who are upset are the very same Panamanian politicians and agitators who have, up To now, made a profession out of baiting

All their speeches denouncing us have had to be called in for reconsideration and possible revision. And the demonstrations they had planned for Jan. 9, in honor of the anniversary of the anti-American riots of

Suddenly, the heart and core has been put out of the issue through which most Panamanian resentment of things

American was being channeled. What has it taken to do this? To be honest about it, there has not been just a simple, straightforward admission on the part of high United States policy that we could have been more generous and understanding of Panama's position all along. Such an admission might have been attacked, here in this country, as a demonstration of softness and as an encouragement to agitation if it

had not been accompanied, as it is now accompanied, by a United States declaration of its own potential independence of Panama. This is, in other words, a hard-headed way of moving toward the right kind of moral stand. We take ourselves, to

some degree, off the imperialist hook. We offer the Panamanians a chance to think the whole relationship over, with its combination of good and bad, the pleasant and the offensive, and see whether they resent us quite as much as they thought they did. A good many of them may come to a

saner judgment about us, as many of us, over the years, have also been coming to a clearer realization that no big power, even the finest, can ever be totally welcome on the soil of another nation, particularly when it dictates the terms for its own presence.

Only the die-hard agitators who, to tell the truth, would rather have us acting unfairly about the old Canal so that we would keep feeding them argument and passion for their cause, are unhappy over the possibility that statesmanship, weaving engineering and morality into one policy, has arrived on the

Guess Who One day last week, the New York fimes carried a dispatch from its Washington correspondent in which he said "President Johnson is approaching his first full term in the White House determined to avoid high pressure tactics in dealing with his most important foreign problems and his major domestic problems."

The correspondent went on to state number of other policy intentions which, the correspondent said, "can Iso be reliably reported."

The descriptions of President Johnson's prospective policies which followod were quite specific and detailed and orthright in stating what the Presient felt, believed and intended. But nobody was ever quoted. No source for such news was given. The story was the Times news lead

The new story began as follows: "The White House emphasized today that Presiden Johnson believed in the feasibility and usefulness of a mixed-manned fleet . . The President had been represented in several newspaper dispatches as believing the concept of mixed-manning could raise difficulties, and it was this report that was clarified today.

On the third day, the Associated Press told its readers everywhere what newspapermen around the nation had already deduced—that the President had invited a few select top reporters in for a little off-the-record chat, which they were privileged to use in story form so long as they didn't attribute it to any source, but that what had happened this time was that the President hadn't been quite satisfied with the way some of the reporters had understood him with the result that the White House had to issue a clarification of the clarification of the President's views. There is nothing particularly novel

about this. Other Presidents have liked to do the same kind of thing. It does two things for a President. It enables him to float some of his views out for a test flight in the public eve without making him definitely responsible for them. And it gives him a chance to be especially kind to a few special reporters. Usually, these days, such reporters are too sophisticated to pay the President back with too obvious a flattery.

And once in a while, when a clarification has to be clarified, even the general public gets an idea it knows who has been talking.

Down at Columbia University there is an associate professor of architecture. Henry Wright by name, who dares advance the theory that scientific perfection does not inevitably equal human comfort and happiness.

Professor Wright, in a speech before the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, has paid his compliments to the modern air-conditioned akvacraper. with its aluminum and glass air-tight construction, and its guarantee to its inmates of the perfectly controlled temperature and quality of air.

Instead of considering this kind of building the ideal achievement its designers and builders and operators apparently think it to be, Professor Wright called it an "environmental Delving down deep into the anthropo-

morphic heritages and instincts of our race, Professor Wright came up with the radical rebellious and reactionary conclusion that human beings still like to smell a smell, now and then, still like to experience, just for the variety of it, an occasional change in temperature, still like, where it is possible, to look

On the subject of windows, indeed Professor Wright was completely heretical. He recommended that every building, no matter how modern, ought to have at least some special room where the inmates could go, if they wished, and actually open a window and see what the air outside might be like. This idea of an occasional "window break" is only one of several humane

His basic error is easily stated. He thinks buildings are for people.
