

443 Arrests Last Year, Yearly Police Report Finds

Rockville Police Chief George Tierre is chairman of the Rockville Police Chief George Tierre is chairman of the liA. Trapp has submitted his anmual report to the city council. The report covers the city's
fiscal year which ended Nov. 18.
The chief reported that a total
of 443 arrests were made, 245
criminal and 198 motor vehicle,
while 181 motor vehicle warnings
were issued.
Complaints for the year totaled 1,853; 482 doors were found
unlocked and 424 street lights
were reported out by Rockville's
finest.
Police responded to 44 fire
alarms, investigated 213 motor
vehicle accidents, and first aid
was rendered in 24 accident
cases.

Rockville's three police cruisers burned a total of 11,091 gallongs of gasoline and traveled 113,988 miles. Forty-four lodgers were housed overnight in the Rockville lockup.

Chief Trapp reported revenues included: Bingo permits, \$145; fees for copies of police reports, \$354; peddlers licenses, \$75; paid phone calls, \$1.55; parking meter collections, \$6,133; parking violations collected, \$1,336; revolver permits, \$76, and retail firearms licenses, \$9.





New Push For Fluoridation

Proponents of fluoridation of public drinking water supplies are making a new attempt to take from the pe Massachusetts cities and towns the right to determine for themselves that they want, or do not want, to adopt this procedure in their communities. Filed with the Legislature this week was a bill to give city or town officials authority to decide, without consulting the people, whether to put fluorides t the public drinking water. The bill, if adopted, would wipe out the present requirement that fluoridation cannot be dopted in any Massachusetts commuunless approved by a referendum

Fluoridation—the process of putting a form of the chemical fluorine into the public drinking water supply-is advocated by certain medical and dental groups as a means of attempting to reluce decay in childrens teeth. The subject is highly controversial; fluoridation s vigorously opposed as dangerous to health by other segments of the medical

The bill was filed in behalf of the Massachusetts Citizens Committee for Dental Health." which, in a statement, praised the measure for putting the responsibility for this "technical and proessional" matter into the hands of city or town officials. The statement elearly implies that the sponsors consider the people unfit to decide for themselves whether they wish to subject them-selves, their families and the whole community to such a wholesale mass edication experiment as fluoridation, with its dangerous potentialities.
