





Our African Friend In Trouble

It was only yesterday that, pleased and proud that at least one new nation a Africa should have intelligence enough and courage enough to stand up in the United Nations and say something nice about United States policy in the Congo, all of us were full of enthusiasm about the existence of Nigeria. We even indulged ourselves in warm, pleased speculations over what it might be that could make Nigeria so unique among all the new nations of the continent where the greatest of all the revo-

lations of our time is taking place. Right here in Manchester we had ensertained Nigerian visitors, and we could, on the basis of such close-range appraisal, testify to their intelligence and their friendliness, and speculate that there must have been, in Nigeria, an especially happy combination of native talent with intelligent and foresighted colonial policy on the part of the Brit-

That was only yesterday

Today is another day. It is a day of the precise kind which is certain to recur again and again in this small and turbulent world of ours. where, in realism, there is nothing to be taken for granted, especially if it seems good and pleasant.

Today is another day. It is election day in Nigeria. At the end of this day, there may be

no Nigeria. The nation we considered Africa and the world so fortunate to have rise so quickly and so intelligently out of the African past may have disintegrated. The situation itself is complicated far beyond the comprehension of whatever relaxed attention we have previously

given Nigeria. The country seems on the verge of being split three ways. One vast section of it is boycotting today's national election, with the complaint that the right to ballot is being denied to large portions of the population. Another section of the country, its sectional and tribal prides enhanced by the recent discovery of oil in its territory, is flirting with the idea of instant secession.

All this possibility of disunity, sourced in geographical and tribal differences, has for four short years of Nigerian independence been shrouded and muffled beneath devices of coalition, and this perilous and perhaps fleeting improvisation has been what has made possible those fine visitors to Manchester, that heart-warming speech down at the United Nations.

At the end of the day's voting, the day's violence, the day's extremisms in Nigeria, there may be no Nigeria left. That's the kind of world it is, these

It may also be this kind of world: that the worst possible in Nigeria today never does quite take over; that the capacity to share and compromise and coalesce which has made Nigeria so notable for the past four years may retain its slim chance of operating into a few more tomorrows perhaps even with greater strength and success as time goes on.

One can hope, as anyone can hope after the wheel has been spun.

Toward Light, With Balance It has been discovered that obedience to the law of gravity shares with the quest for light the task of determining

the direction of plant growth.

Everyone knows that the plant will stretch and search and bend for light. But the idea that the force of gravity. which binds us all to earth, should also be the guidance which makes plants grow up, is a little novel and a little troublesome. The explanation seems to be not that the pulling down force pushes things up, but that it stabilizes their inevitable push so that it doesn't lean particularly to one side or the other, but finds reins of equal persua-

sion steadying it from all directions. What makes the plant push at all? That is neither gravity nor the light so it must be the life force itself.

Experimentation at the University of Massachusetts has shown that altering the direction of the gravity pull, by putting the plants on a turntable and then subjecting them to centrifugal force, could also alter the direction in which plants grew, and tempt them into side angle structure. But light, the thing which draws

plants toward itself, almost always holds the decisive power over gravity the force which would like to stabilize directions. Almost all plant growth is something of a cooperation between the two, an unconquerable seeking of light tempered and balanced by ties to

What plant life does automatically, in response to eternal natural laws, human life has much more trouble achieving.

Fascination With Calamity

We would hate to have to count all the predictions, even in recent times, o the exhaustion of this or that or several natural resources. Since the world is naking out better than ever in a physi cal sense, skepticism is evidently in or der, and some recent developments raise with approaching calamity.

Often studies of this kind are scholassailable. Simply project the popula tion 50 or 100 or 500 years hence, cite the pertinent resource figures and it beenough oil minerals, food or whatever to go around

Often too the contemporary treatises on the subject are charged with criti-cism of alleged waste of resources in e substances that go into "frivolities" like automobiles. Sometimes more than an implication can also be found that the Government or somebody must start oranizing and allocating and conservin st posterity end up in unheard-of per Now we do not mean to scoff. The poplation rise alone, if it does in fact continue, has frightening overtones even for advanced nations; at the least suggests more overcrowding, less com and more regimentation just to direct the traffic as it were. For all we know, the upshot could be far worse should a geometrically increasing population actually be accompanied by depletion of vital resources and a lack

of acceptable substitutes. Still, the amazing thing is not merely that the best-laid projections can go awry, but how active people are i warding off the very evils threatened time that a great deal of thought is being given to possibilities of population limitation, men are busily devising new resources and expanding reserves of old ones-mostly without benefit of

any vast master-plan decreed by offi-Oil is a dramatic instance at the moment. Experts have been freely predicting that the U.S. would dry up its iomestic petroleum supplies in a matte of decades, and state conservation pro grams have been built ostensibly o his fear. Yet. as Mr. Creedman report

ed in this newspaper recently, newly improved production methods may double the estimates of the American petroleum In other words, complex and inter ocking endeavors in pursuit of private gain and markets may measurably im-

prove posterity's outlook in a major re source area. It is hard to imagine any governmental master-planner bringing Atomic energy already is able to fill in for future deficiencies of other powe sources if and when they materialize and economic circumstances otherwise

The impetus for nuclear energy came originally from the Government, and of ourse the Government can be a frui ful source of innovation; there ar many byproducts of defense and other ectivities, Even the farm program, in versely and perversely, has helped spur agricultural abundance as men increase rields per acre to get around the con trols. Few, however, would argue that such restrictionism is a good way to en-

ourage resource expansion. The point, we think, is that innovation along those lines comes, from an awesome variety of apparently disconected effort, most of it private and much of it involving the so-called waste decried in consumer goods. Because tha is so, a master-plan for resources coul only have a deadening effect, tending to reeze an unpredictable future.
