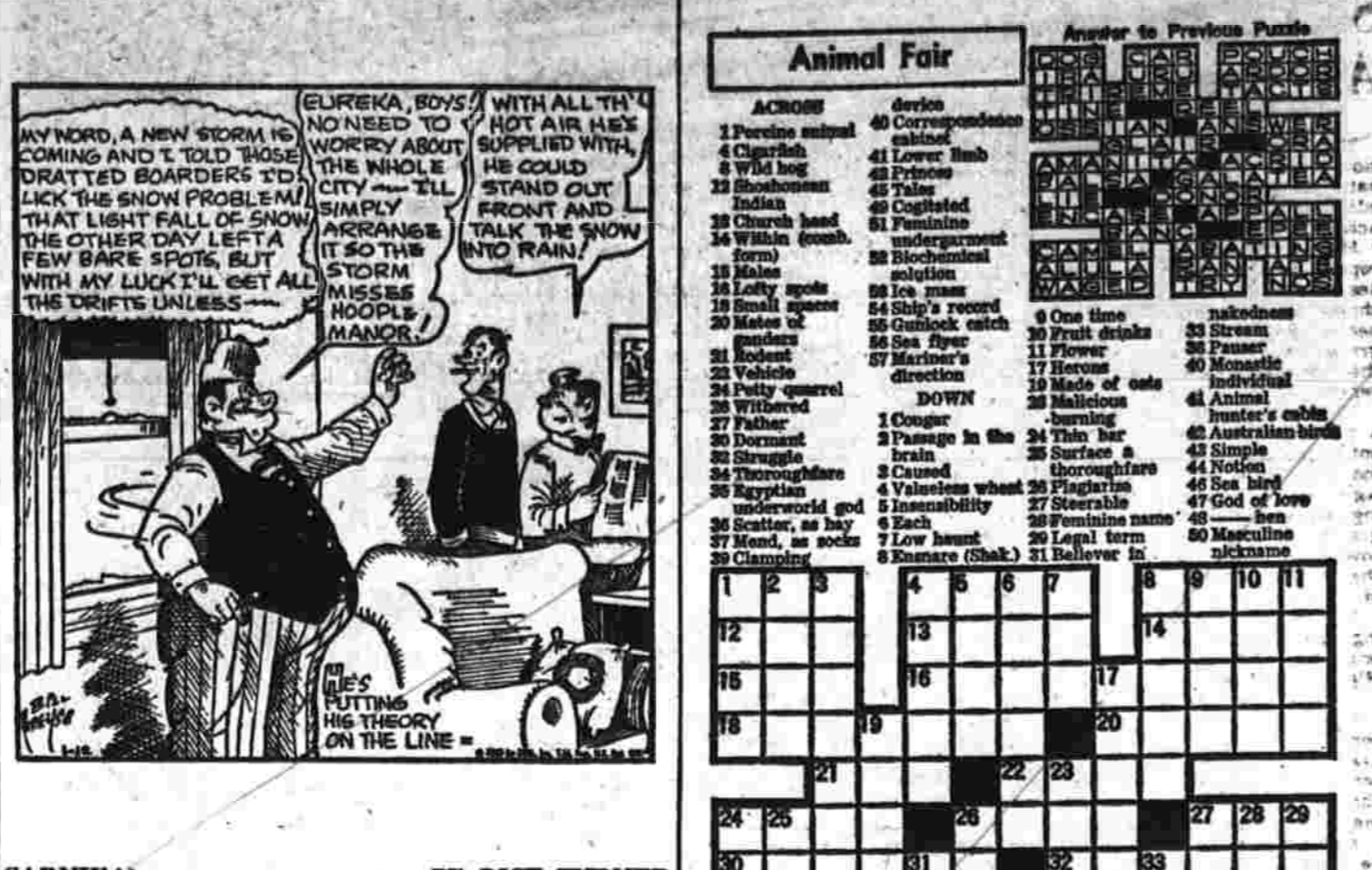

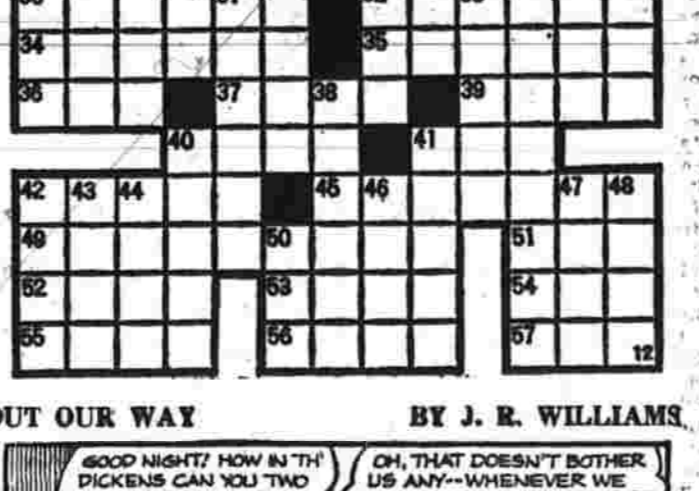

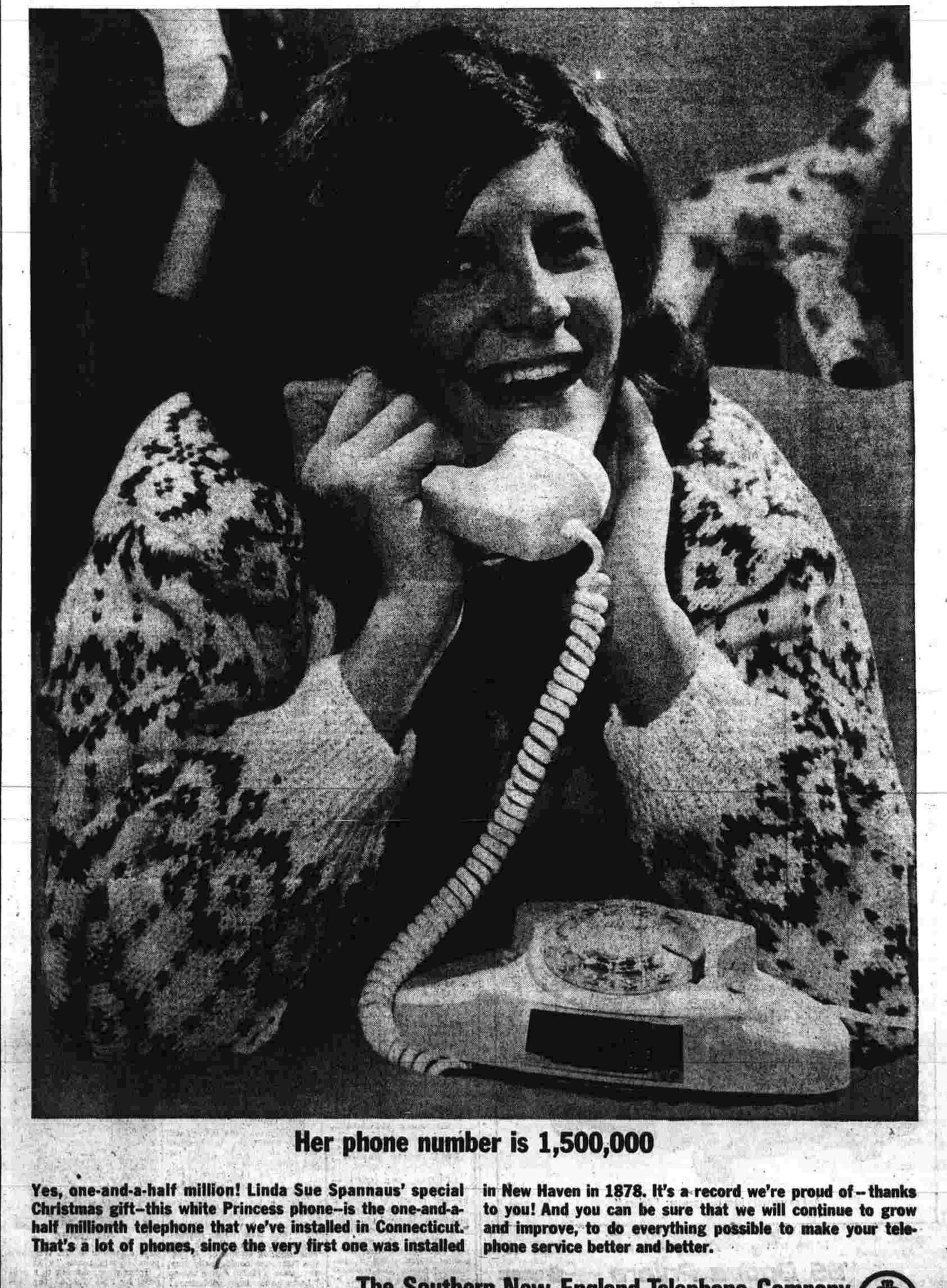

**President Submits New Measure**  
**Immigrant's Skill, Family Basis of Proposed Change**

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson proposed a sweeping new immigration law to Congress today. It is based on an immigrant's skill and his family ties in the United States.

It would do away with the 40-year-old national origin quota system, Johnson called the system "incompatible with our basic American tradition."

Instead, immigrants would be selected on a first-come, first-served basis, within a system of preferences based on work and cultural skills and family unity.

The bill is virtually identical to one proposed in 1957 by President John F. Kennedy. Johnson urged Congress today to give the revived bill priority consideration.

He said the proposed law "both serves the national interest and continues our traditional ideal." "We move could more effectively reaffirm our fundamental belief that a man is to be judged not by his race or color, but by his worth as a human being," the President said.

"The bill, he said, would maintain safeguards against undesirable and excessive immigration, require all immigrants to meet U.S. security requirements, and ensure that no immigrants "could contribute to unemployment in the United States."

It is a employment figure strongly in one of the first congressional hearings on the President's proposal.

Sen. John L. McClellan, D-Ark., said "I don't think I ought to let this country get flooded with immigrants. We've got enough of an unemployment problem as it is. It is a member of the Immigration Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee."

Sen. Philip A. Hart, D-Mich., promptly announced he would introduce a bill to carry out the President's recommendations.

"The quota system should have been changed years ago," Hart said.

An administration source estimated passage of the law eventually would increase the average number of immigrants from 300,000 to 350,000 a year. This would include those admitted by special legislation as well as the 165,000 falling under the new quota, plus immigrants.

**Inaugural Security Seen Best in History**  
**Dock Strike Cancels Two Luxury Trips**

WASHINGTON (AP)—Lyndon B. Johnson will be the best protected president in modern history on his inauguration day.

That much is agreed by all concerned with the ceremonies set for Wednesday and the secret service security seen to be no less than that of a presidential inauguration.

Among the protective measures known or understood to be planned to prevent any would-be assassin's attempt to duplicate the tragedy in Dallas 14 months ago are these:

— Agents with rifles, as well as Army helicopter gunships, will keep watch from Capitol rooftops on the throngs massed to see and surround the Chief Executive.

— A low wall of quarter-inch armorplate, topped by a bullet-proof glass windshield, will guard the President as he views the parade, marching and from his reviewing stand in front of the White House.

— A contractor is installing other sections of glass Tuesday.

— The newly rebuilt and re-armed presidential limousine, with a glass bubbletop 3 1/2 inches thick, is expected to be used for the inaugural parade. It permits good visibility.

— A building-by-building inspection of windows overlooking the parade route will be in advance by teams of police and Secret Service agents.

NEW YORK (AP)—Scheduled sailings of two luxury liners have been canceled as a result of a dock strike on the Atlantic and Gulf Coasts.

The seagoing unions called for immobilization of American-flag passenger ships on the two coasts in a show of unity with the International Longshoremen's Association.

Ship companies ordered the sailings canceled Tuesday after the National Maritime Union and the Seafarers International Union announced that their members would refuse to cross the longshoremen's picket lines.

All three unions are AFL-CIO affiliates. The NMTU and the SIU emphasized that they were not striking.

Other unions in addition to the NMTU and the SIU—both of which represent unlicensed ship personnel below officers grade—also have pledged support to the 4,000 striking dock workers.

The two big ships knocked out are the superliner United States, flagship of the United States Line, which had been scheduled to sail for Europe Thursday with 800 passengers, and the Argentina of the Moore-McCormack line, which was to have left New York today with about 100 passengers on an eight-day Caribbean cruise.

The action by the seagoing unions is expected to be a physical condition.

HARTFORD (AP)—A bipartisan reapportionment package will be introduced in the Senate today as the General Assembly's special session nears a successful climax.

The compromise measure is expected to be passed in the House of Representatives on Monday.

Final agreement on the package was reached Tuesday just after it seemed that the office of bipartisan bargaining over district lines would come to nothing after all.

Democratic National and State Chairman John M. Bailey put on his hat and overcoat after he and his Democratic colleagues left the conference room at 4:15 p.m.

Bailey had to catch a 5 p.m. plane for Washington and had made it clear that there would be no agreement if none was reached by the time he reached the city.

A few moments later, Finney and Bailey came out of the room and walked toward the office of Gov. John Dempsey.

"We can certify that," said Finney.

"You have risen to the occasion," continued the governor. "I am grateful for the long hours and hard work that you have put in. This will be a historic occasion."

### Curtis Submits Six-Year Plan \$782,000 Requested For Capital Works

Educational television (ETV) has been proposed in the capital improvements program that Superintendent of Schools William Curtis will present to the board of education Monday.

The cost of the sets and installations would be \$100,000 ranging over a three-year period from 1964-65 to 1967-68. Once the sets were in the classrooms and ready to receive the ETV signal, the total cost of the ETV system would be \$150,000 over the next six years.

The entire capital improvement program if approved by both the board of education and the board of directors, would cost \$782,000 over the next six years.

The yearly breakdown is as follows:

1965-66. Total cost would be \$175,000. It includes ETV replacement of the Nathan Hale School heating system, and improvements to the heating plant of the Bennett Junior High School main building.

1966-67. The total cost of \$124,000 would go for the second phase of ETV and modernization of the heating and ventilation system in the east side section of the school.

1967-68. Total cost, \$108,000 most of it for replacement of the heating system at the Bernard and Franklin buildings, and the third phase of ETV.

1968-69. Total cost would be \$133,000, of which \$25,000 would be earmarked for site improvements, including additional parking and playground areas. The other \$108,000 would be divided among a number of general improvements to classrooms and plumbing.

"I am sorry to hear that," Pearl said, "but I am sure that the city's highway maintenance costs which would otherwise become the responsibility of the town's highway department."

The agreement to reimburse the city for a part of its road costs was agreed upon several years ago, since city taxpayers through town taxes, were paying for town road costs, and then paying for city road expenses through the city's tax base.

The double charge was considered to be an inequity.

"I contacted Mr. Pearl," the mayor said, "and reminded him of the agreement. A payment of \$25,000 was received on Aug. 18, and a week later a letter was sent to Mr. Pearl asking him for the balance."

# CBS and Yankee Tie Draws Senate Look

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Senate subcommittee is summoning baseball and television officials next week for an investigation of CBS' purchase of the New York Yankees.

Chairman Philip Hart, D-Mich., said the Senate subcommittee will hold hearings Feb. 18-19 and Feb. 23-24.

There were strong indications this might be the start of a series of hearings which also would cover professional football and Newcombs.

Actually, this is an extension of hearings last year on a bill to exempt practices of professional baseball, football, hockey and basketball from antitrust laws.

Baseball already is exempt as a result of a Supreme Court decision. The legislation would put other sports on the same footing.

Hart explained: "Concern has been expressed about the fact that the CBS purchase of the Yankees may pose questions not considered last year. Therefore, we plan to explore ramifications of this purchase in order to see what effect this transaction may have on the purpose of the bill."

BASEBALL—The investigation of the purchase of the Yankees by CBS is expected to be a major focus of the hearings. Hart indicated that the committee will look into the financial details of the deal, including the \$24 million purchase price.

He also mentioned that the committee is concerned about the potential for monopolistic practices in the sports industry, particularly regarding television rights.
