MCC to Oppose Apartment Bid

The Manchester Conservation Commission (MCC) last night voted formally to oppose a proposal for the construction of 116 apartments on the Calhoun Farm, adjacent to the Oak Grove Nature Preserve.

The conservation commission was instrumental in the designation of the preserve as a municipal open space area, and last spring was appointed its overseer.

It was revealed last night that a representative of the Lots-Johnson Museum, custodian of the area, will also appear before the ZBA to express opposition to the apartment construction.

The MCC several months ago agreed informally to discourage construction at that site, and to take steps for town acquisition of the acreage as an open space addition to the town's natural preserve.

The commission has held informal talks with the owner of the farm, with representatives of the Capitol Region Planning Commission and with General Manager Richard Martin, all of whom had expressed interest in the acquisition proposal.

However, no formal plans for the acquisition have been made. A representative of the MCC will appear at Monday night's meeting to oppose the commission.

# Imaginative Planning Held Cure for Blight

By BOB KILPATRICK

A call for experimentation and imagination characterized last night's second and keynote town planning forum. The three panellists—a city planning instructor with an economist's background, a regional planner, and a town planner—all agreed that the present shape of our cities and cities left much to be desired.

Where do we go from there in our attempt to make the town a more home through town planning? New England towns strike responsive chords in everyone.

In contrast, we have the well known phenomenon of the "suburban sprawl." As Gertrude Stein once said, "When you're there, there is no there there."

Our public areas should invite participation; they should make unproductive activities, such as shopping, a pleasure.

We should pay more attention to public architecture. The main problem is to combine excellence with wide popular appeal. But we pay so little attention to the character of our public and religious facilities that we have little experience with both beautiful and appealing.

Robert C. Young of Bolton, regional planning coordinator of the Connecticut State Development Commission, succinctly called for planners who are "half-headed idealists" to raise our sights.

Joseph R. Tansky, Manchester, said his hands were tied. It is the developer, he said, who is the physical form of the community, not the planning commission.

Carruthers noted that campaign efforts within the party are working hard, but the campaign is not expected to start until the end of January.

Vernon's election is expected to draw a great deal of interest, since this is the first election in the state since the Democratic party scored a landslide in November during the presidential contest.
