ST. LOUIS (AP)—A brief, but blistering, general alarm fire killed two women patients Thursday night at the State Mental Hospital. More than 1,000 other patients were threatened but quick work by firemen and others prevented greater tragedy.

About 1,200 patients, some in wheelchairs, were removed into sub-freezing temperatures from a women's dormitory and then sheltered temporarily in a nearby auditorium.

Most of them wore only night clothes and were barefoot although some managed to drape blankets around them. A majority of the patients were evacuated within 30-minutes after the blaze was discovered.

Another woman, Sally Turpen, 67; of St. Louis, died after collapsing in the state hospital conference with the blaze in the hallway, they hospital. Cause of her death was not immediately learned.

"We were very lucky it wasn't much worse," said Robert Blackburn, assistant to the mayor. "Only quick work by firemen prevented it from becoming a terrible disaster."







The debate as to whether or not our action in extending our activity in the betnamese war to the territory of Laos right or wrong is not the immediate point. The immediate point is that the merican people weren't supposed to mow it, and wouldn't know it even now we hadn't had two planes shot down . a an operation Communist broadcasts were apparently describing in accurate

The actual procedure involved seems to be that we go ahead and inaugurat some new policy or strategy in the Vietnam war, and that, in time, if newsper speculation grows too pointed, or Communists broadcast too clear and horitative an account, or if we incur asualties we can't hide, there comes some kind of semi-official admission that we have been doing what we have been doing.

Along with today's semi-official adnission that we have been engaged in shooting war inside Laos for several months now, perhaps since last June, here comes another not-quite-official ification of another phase of the war which could hitherto only be guessed rom various circumstances. It now seems admitted that we have, for some time, again measured by months, been sing our fleet to provide air and naval sover for South Vietnamese troops usng American planes and boats in atacks across the border of North Viet-

Along with these disclosures, there omes, from Washington, something of near-official explanation of the stratgy involved. We have been extending our role in the war this way, it is said, o show the Communists how serious we are in Southeast Asia, and persuade them to abandon their own adventuring across borders.

It would be a very fine and conrenient thing if one side of a war would et the other side increase its pressure and then reduce its-own. We have selsom seen this happen in history. And he record actually seems to indicate that the period during which we have seen stepping up our own involvement n-the Vietnam war has also been beoming a period in which the Commuaist guerrillas have been growing bolder and bolder, closer and closer to Sai-

But what seems likely, at the moment, is that we will renege on our own original statement, which was quite unconditional, and return to a state of affairs in which we will do things we consider right providing others agree to do them

To get back into a style of operation in which we will be sure we are not making any concessions first will be more like normalcy in foreign affairs. It is the good old reliable formula, backed by natural human instinct, which holds that the other fellow must always be the first to yield something, which has got this good old world into its present reassuring and delightful state.






