The Five Images Of Lyndon The popular image of the man who is naugurated into his own full term as

President today has undergone a series

of changes in the few brief years he has really been in the limelight. He first came into that limelight as he responsible, statesmanlike, leader of the loyal political opposition in the Senate during the Eisenhower administrations. This was a period when he was somewhat celebrated as a conservative businesslike legislator. Two sub-factors in his career were not, in this era, given too much public attention. It was assumed that, in his post, he was somehing of a wheeler and dealer. In fact, It was sometimes referred to in terms of admiration. There was little or no attention paid to the fact that he was also a Southerner, with typical Southern middle-ground views on civil rights is-

Lyndon Johnson next appeared as the aspirant for the presidential nomination in 1960 and as the Kennedy choice for the vice presidential nomination. Here the comparative conservatism of his recard and philosophy was clearly emphasized, as an asset. During the campaign, bowever, he began to cross civil rights bridges. In the campaign, he helped old the South for Kennedy, but he himself began to leave the South on the

The third guise of Lyndon Johnsonnone was ever a disguise-came after the tragedy of November, 1963, and his mergency assumption of the Presidency. It was a phase in which he was oberly reassuring as he kept established wheels and routines turning, as he symbolized responsible continuity. This was obviously a period of trial and self doubt for him as it was for the nation. But he succeeded in making himelf seem safe and responsible. He schieved an impressive legislative success in his relations with Congress; with eas than a year in office, he had a record which included a tax cut nobody else and seemed able to get, and a civil rights law nobody had ever been able to get passed. He had talked much of a thing called "prudence" abroad. When the opposition tried to challenge him with an

extremist twist of the Republican party the result was a landslide Somewhere between the beginning of the campaign and the inaugural today a fourth and hitherto hidden phase of Lyn-

son Johnson began to appear. This was the exaggeratedly benign great white father, who wanted it unierstood that he was always kindly and all-wise, and always right, too, and who began to specialize in descriptions of all problems which reduced them to the most easily manageable denominator. This was the smooth-tongued sayer of soothing things, who could dismiss Vietnam with a sentence in a State of the Union message while his bombers were crossing additional international boundaries in Asia. This was the affectionhungry character who somehow expectad, or could pretend to expect, to woo both capital and labor in a speech in which he promised war on all right to lesson in reverse, if they succeed the work laws.

It is this atmosphere of personal paternalism, and his apparent belief that, wearing it, he can successfully be many things to many men, which has led to the emergence of a new kind of public reaction to Lyndon Johnson. We joke about an American royalty; we poke our barbs at the pervasive ego; we hope it is all near the surface and will pass away, having revealed itself, perhaps, as no more than a passing weakness in the make-up of the human being involved. But we hope for a little less blandness; a little less of the Pollyanna treatment for all kinds of problems. We prefer to think of the shrewd, elever-dealing manager of legislation; the achiever; the compromiser of facdone; the quarterback. We, the American people, can be our own cheerleaders. And now, from noon forward, the

would be for Russia, the nation leading in arrears, to make the first move toward breaking the deadlock by announcing voluntary contribution to UN funds which would heal its legal standing so far as the right of voting in the General Assembly is concerned. Lord Caradon was right in judging that the world would welcome and applaud such a move.

It can be judged that Russia, for its part, has no desire to wreck the UN over this issue. It is indeed, as Lord Caradon said, a question of prestige. And the Russian position is that Russia has already given assurance that it will make suitable voluntary payments to the UN as soon as the United States and others taking the lead in enforcing UN rules relax and permit Russia to exercise its right of voting in the General But this is something that the United

States does not think the "prestige" of the United Nationa itself can allow. This brings the situation down to the precise situation of two small boys who have agreed, verbally, to exchange an autographed picture of Willie Mays for one of Mickey Mantle. Neither will let go of his picture first. Sometimes they tug and strain at each other's picture in a way which destroys them both. Or sometimes they manage a successful,

instantaneous release by both to both. That is the kind of situation which has been paralyzing the UN for two months now, and which, so far, has been defying the best ingenuity of all the world's diplomats. Each side is still urging the other to be really big and noble and be the first to let go. Can't a payment and a vote be so timed as to be so simultaneous anybody can claim but never prove that either one came first?

Ebb Tide In Southeast Asia

For four centuries, white men were acquiring empires in Asia, wider still and wider. Then, in little more than a decade, those empires melted away; the alien rulers departed. The ebb is still not quite complete. European governors remain in Soviet Asia, in Macao and half of Timor, in Aden, and Hongkong; foreign soldiers are still station in those places, in some other British and United States bases—and in Vietnam, Malaysia, South Arabia. Historical movements are not irre-

versible. Nevertheless, the tribulations of the British and U.S. Governments in Southern Asia look very much like the concluding stages of the retreat of Europe and its transatiantic extension. In-deed, the two Powers themselves say they want to withdraw as soon as it is safe to do so.

The parallels between the lost French

war and the losing American war in Vietnam grow more striking every day. True, Americans themselves believe in a fundamental distinction; the French t against subversion. But the difference is not so clear in the jungles and rice fields, particularly under a shower o napalm; moreover, several "legitimate" mments, both in Vietnam and Laos, have been overthrown without any attempt by the US forces to stop it. On

The American argument also involves the corollary that if the Government of South Vietnam ceases to invoke their protection they will depart forthwith One Government or other in Saigon may in fact do so some day, and that might be the best way out. But then a further argument is adduced: U.S. forces are in Southeast Asia to contain communism, and specifically Chinese communism. This, it is urged, is an ineluctable American interest, whatever a particular Government in Saigon thinks about it. Withdraw American power from the peninsula, and the counies will fall to communism like a row

United States administrations over the past 10 years may have helped to make this true, by insisting on it. Most rulers, n Southeast Asia, as elsewhere, prefe to be on the winning side. But they do nor, probably do most of their fellow countrymen want to live under Communist rule. Burmese governments have been fighting Communist insurgents for sixteen years, and have probably got on all the better (certainly better than the Vietnamese) because they have had no American help; this was a struggle for the Burmese alone. Prince Sihanoul has even managed to keep Cambodia non-Communist in active hostility the United States. One of the main lessons of Vietnam surely is that even the most powerful nation in the world cannot save a country from communism or any other "ism," if most of the peo-ple there do not share its ardour. The Chinese will no doubt learn the same

French and the Americans as overlords of Vietnam.

But even if the toppling domino theory is true, that does not win the nese war. As President Kennedy once hinted, there are limits to a grea nation's power if it is extended too far Now the United States is learning, as we and the French learned, that it prob ably does not extend on to the Asian land. And, for all the idealism behind the American operation, there is no reason in history why it should. We, too, it is true, are also fighting an anarchronistic battle in Southeas Asia. The circumstances are different We are not intervening in a civil war, but coming to the aid of an ally unde foreign attack. But the same principles apply. We have no more permanent place in Southeast Asia than the Amer-icans. True, President Sukarno is mak-ing it as hard as he can for us to withdraw, by persisting in threatening t destroy a federation we are committee

destroy a federation we are committed to defend. But ultimately the salvation of Malaysia depends on Malaysians, not us. They may find it in Maphilindo, the union of Malaysia, the Philippines, and Indonesia, which the Governments of all three countries have accepted as an aspiration, although President Sukarno, by his confrontation, has also put the realization of this ideal many years. fifth phase of Lyndon Johnson. realization of this ideal many years back.
