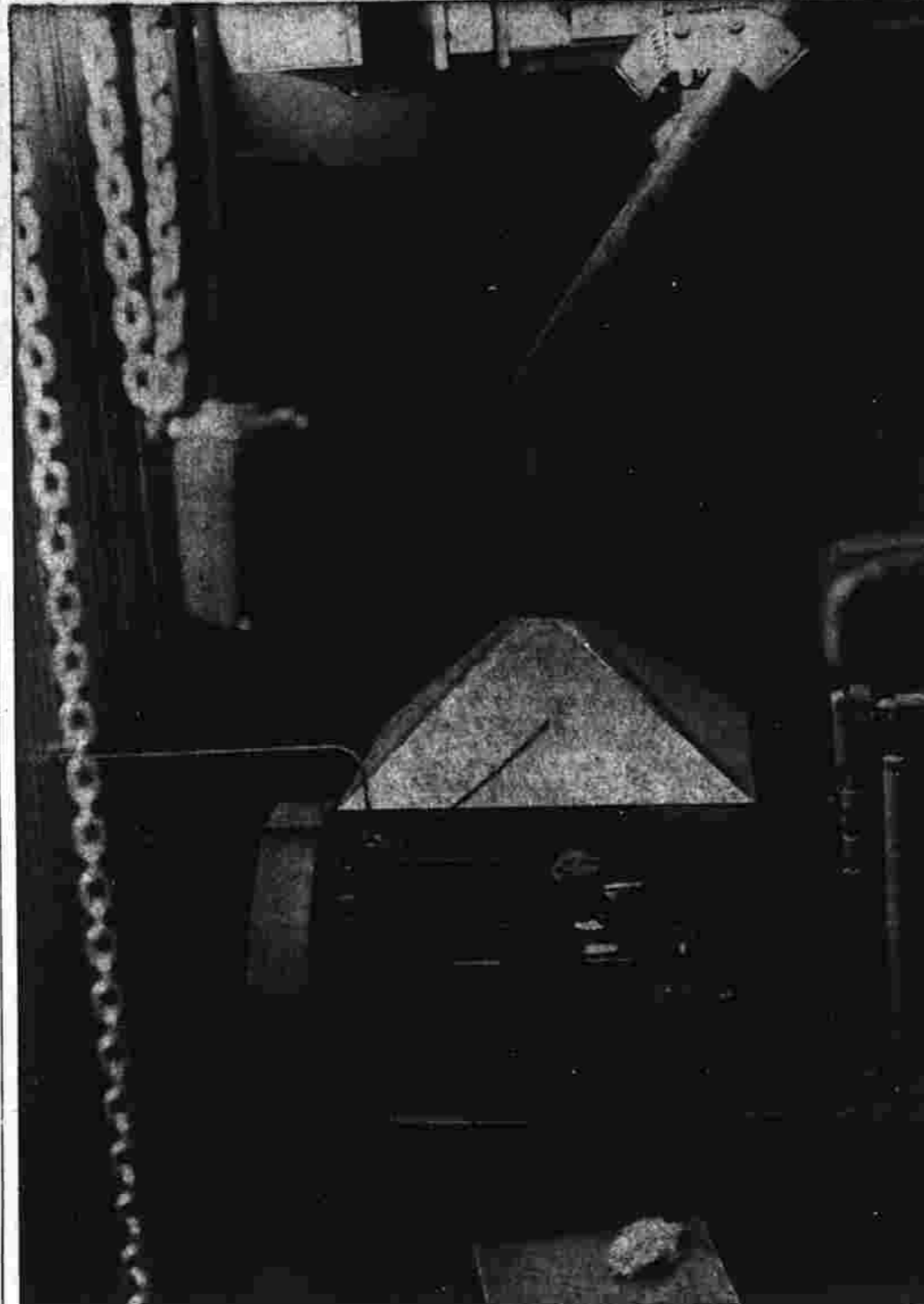

Chamber Scores Referral Sales

It has come to the attention of the Chamber of Commerce that vacuum cleaners are again being sold in Manchester on the referral method.

The Chamber of Commerce would urge all citizens to be very careful and cautious of the referral method of selling. Under the referral method of selling, the salesman promises the customer a certain amount of money for every name that the customer gives to the salesman, provided a demonstration and/or sale is made to the person named. The chamber points out that in many cases the customer may be told that he will actually make money by referring names to the salesman and that the product will cost him little or nothing. However, the customer should keep in mind that, when he signs a contract, he has assumed responsibility for the full purchase price of the item plus any finance charges.

The Chamber of Commerce urges that these simple rules be followed:

- 1. Do business with an established business firm that has a past history of performance and reliability.
2. Have business agreements in writing and specify exactly what it is to cover.
3. Shy away from special bargain prices and give-aways because the person "happens to be in the neighborhood" or because you have been chosen for something.
4. Don't sign anything unless it is fully read and understood.
5. Don't be subject to high pressure sales.
6. Compare price of the item offered with similar items sold in the stores.

A 15-Year Review  
Few Series Survive

NEW YORK (NEA)—Once more unto the breach, dear friends, goes another CBS program, in an effort to make a dent in Bonanza's ratings.

Beginning Sunday, For the People, a show produced by Herbert (The Defenders, The Doctors and The Nurses) Brodtkin will move in to the spot from which such shows as Judy Garland and The Celebrity Game sank into No Viewer's Land.

For the people is the other side of The Defenders' coin. But it's also a lot more, according to William Shatner, who plays the lead, an assistant district attorney.

"We are dealing with the prosecution of evil, putting these people out of the way for society's protection. We are using an active, inquiring camera, which moves and probes."

"There is much more cops and robbers here than in The Defenders, more emphasis on solving crimes."

**Facing Disadvantage**  
The structure of television being what it is today, it's very difficult for a show starting in midseason to build a rating in time to get on the schedule for the following season.

"We are at a distinct disadvantage starting late," Shatner admits, "because viewing habits are more or less set. But we have an advantage in that we are the only show opening at that time."

"If we make good our promise for an exciting, entertaining series, we can change viewing habits. If we fail to make good, then viewers will have to go back to watching a lot of junk."

By mid-February CBS is supposed to make a decision as to whether For the People will be around next season.

"Renewal, I think, will depend on the reviews we get. No one expects us to start with a huge rating."

"I don't think network people are stupid. The shows they have lopped off the schedule were inherently dull. The networks want quality. If they have a quality show it only adds to this luster."

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—What's the secret for longevity of a television show? It helps if the series offers variety, quizzes or family fun.

That's the conclusion that can be drawn from Variety's compilation of "TV's Graveyard" from 1960 to 1965. The show biz Bible listed every nighttime network series — 763 in all — and showed how long they survived. More than half succumbed after one season. Only 35 per cent managed three years on the air; 13 per cent made the golden mark of five years.

It's interesting to browse through the list and see the shows that succeeded. None of the NBC and ABC shows of the 1960-61 season are still on the air, but CBS boasts two — "What's My Line" and "The Ed Sullivan Show," then called "Toast of the Town."

Long gone are all the other entries of that year, including such gems as "First Nighter," "Hollywood Screen Test," "I Cover Times Square," "Mr. I. Magination," "Tom Corbett, Space Cadet," "Lights Out" and "Break the Bank."

The 1961-62 season brought the first of "I Love Lucy's" seven years; after a lapse, Lucille Ball came back to television, though without her original costar. The only newcomer of that season to maintain uninterrupted tenure was Red Skelton.

Survivors of the 1962-63 season are Ozie and Harriet Nelson et al, "Meet the Press" and "I've Got a Secret." Still riding the air waves from the following season is indestructible Jack Benny — but it's reported this

will be his last year with a weekly show.

It was 11 years ago that Walt Disney and Lassie went on the air. It's interesting to note that Rin-Tin-Tin also started that year, but lacked the staying power of its collier rival.

Lawrence Welk made his debut in 1955-56, also "Gunsmoke," and Alfred Hitchcock. None of the new shows of the following season remain and only "Wagon Train," "Perry Mason" and "To Tell the Truth" from 1957-58. The former two are expected to fade with this season.

Donna Reed is the lone survivor from the 1958-59 season. Two hardy Westerns started the following year — "Bonanza" and "Rawhide." Among the 5-year-olds are "My Three Sons," "The Flintstones," Andy Griffith, "Candid Camera" and Bell Telephone.

Will future seasons bring such stalwart perennials? Probably not. The life expectancy of television series has dropped with the years. Now if a show lasts three years, its participants consider themselves lucky. Series just don't have the staying power they used to.

Sellers Recalls the White Coats

Heart attacks left Peter Sellers on the brink of death on eight different occasions, but his sense of humor emerged unscathed—even on the subject of his brush with death.

Interviewed for a forthcoming "ABC Scope" program on heart disease, Sellers was asked what advice he'd give someone who's had a heart attack.

"Don't have another one if you can possibly help it," he replied.

Then Sellers described how, after his heart had stopped beating, the Pacemaker, a special electric cardiological machine, brought him back to life.

"As soon as my heart would stop, this thing would sound a hooch and about five million white coats would rush in—one on each leg and one on each arm. . . . whereupon this thing would give off a terrific shock and they'd all get one at the

same time as I did, and I'd sort of wake up with these fellows flying up in the air and then coming down again and all coughing about 10,000 volts each. . . . I want to thank them very much for all they did and all the shocks they took on my behalf."

Sellers was interviewed in London for "Heart Attack," which will be presented Wednesday, 10:30 - 11 p.m. The program will explore the nation's number one killer disease, interview some of its victims, including Sellers and the Duke of Windsor, examine advances in diagnosis and treatment, show actual heart surgery and talk with Dr. Michael DeBakey and other cardiologists on hopes for defeating the disease.

In Sellers' opinion, it's important that a recovering heart attack victim not be overly serious about his condition.

that he not be — in Seller's phrase — "a cardiac nut" . . . "if you blink your left eye more than three times, you get a bit worried."

Sellers, who said he never gave up hope, during the "touch - and - go days" of his heart ailment, had some advice for people who never have had heart trouble. He recommends no smoking; as much exercise as possible, especially people with desk jobs; no overeating; do everything in moderation.

Had he known before the attack what he knows now, Sellers said, he would have done less work.

What saved his life? "Being in a city very close to a hospital that had an intensive care unit, that had a Pacemaker machine, that had some wonderful physicians available — and also having great faith that I wasn't going to die."

# Bittersweet News: Beatles Will Return

NEW YORK (AP) — There's bad news for assorted police departments, but good news for the teen-agers: The Beatles are coming back for another American tour.

But not until next August, so there is still time to make proper preparation for the invasion.

The news comes from Brian Epstein, the long-haired boys' short-haired manager and agent who is in town briefly to make some arrangements for a coast-to-coast Beatles tour; set another of his clients, singer Cilla Black, for a forthcoming Ed Sullivan appearance on CBS, and discuss his future participation in the new "Hullabaloo."

Epstein, 29, recently has blossomed as a TV performer himself, introducing singers in a special weekly segment of the NBC show which is taped in London.

Epstein, whose association with the Beatles started when he was running a Liverpool music shop and began receiving requests for their records, believes that their phenomenal success is no flash in the pan and is constructed on their musicianship rather than their way-out hairdos and tailoring.

"Two of the boys are fine composers, too," Epstein noted. "And while I think that the teenage excitement will continue on for another year or so, I expect they will go on to better things, including some more fine films. They have great talent."

The young impresario confessed he was unhappy about the film "Beatles in America" show which CBS broadcast, adding that it was made without permission.

He chuckled rather cynically about the numbers of people who now are claiming they had important parts in the Beatles' success.

"The boys and I have a private 'We Made You' club," he said. "It even has some honorary members. The truth is that I came over here in November, 1963 with another client, Billy J. Kramer, partly to find out why nothing was happening here. I found the answer was that the Beatles had not been promoted properly and also that they had not made the

right record for American audiences. "After that they made 'I Want to Hold Your Hand,' and their new record company started promoting them. One of the people I went to see was Ed Sullivan — and I rather think I shook him by demanding star billing for the boys."

His final explanation about his most famous clients:

"The boys wear their hair long just because they happen to like long hair. It is not to attract attention or anything else. After all, men did wear long hair once and may again. Is there any particular reason why I part my hair on the right side except that I like to?"
