

Assembly Returning To 'Regular' Issues

HARTFORD (AP)—After treading the unfamiliar ground of reapportionment, the General Assembly prepared today to return to bread and butter issues in its "special regular" session that begins Tuesday.

Republicans, whose domination of the House won't be challenged till 1966, have already fired the first salvo in the battle of the budget.

Anticipating Gov. John Dempsey's spending proposals, House Speaker J. Tyler Patterson characterized the GOP attitude as one of "puzzled curiosity." Dempsey will deliver his "State of the State" message

to a joint session of the legislature Tuesday. His budget message is scheduled for presentation Feb. 14.

"We ask Governor Dempsey which course he will follow," Patterson said in a weekend program, or a renege on the party's fantastic promises of giving something to everyone."

He was referring to the Democratic platform, which he said would be as in the past, to favor a budget that is honest, fair to the taxpayers and encompassing the just needs of our state

Skiers Evacuated from Resorts Snow Storm Lashes Portions of Midwest

CHICAGO, Ill. (AP)—A massive storm carrying heavy snow and powerful winds lashed portions of the Northwest and Midwest today while extreme cold stung portions of the South and Florida.

Blizzard conditions prevailed from Minnesota and South Dakota southward through Missouri and Kansas. Cold wave warnings were issued for northeastern New Mexico.

Heavy snow and hazardous driving warnings were posted for Illinois, Ohio, southern Wisconsin and lower Michigan where the U. S. Weather Bureau predicted 4 to 8-inch snow accumulations.

Four inches of snow fell in Denver, Colo., in a six-hour period and winds gusted up to 46 miles per hour, reducing visibility to zero.

Five inches fell in Minneapolis, 3 in Rochester and Alexandria, Minn., and Lone Rock, Wis.

Some winds reached up to 80 m.p.h. in South Dakota and Nebraska. Broken bow in eastern Nebraska reported wind gusts up to 80 m.p.h.

A hard freeze struck northern Florida and frost and freezing temperatures prevailed in most of the southern sector.

The storm began in Montana early Sunday and moved swiftly in a wide belt toward the Midwest. Rock slides in Idaho sliced U.S. 12.

Gusting winds and heavy snow swept through Colorado, closing mountain passes.

Motorists were stalled on Denver streets. The temperature dropped 26 degrees in one hour after the storm hit the state. Eight hundred skiers evacuated from Lake Eldora in the Rocky Mountains during the morning were trapped by drifts up to 15 feet.

A drop of temperatures in Idaho eased the flood danger as the snowpack runoff was retarded. An estimated 200 persons

Dempsey Asks Tariff Check On Safety Pins

HARTFORD (AP)—Gov. John Dempsey asked the U. S. Tariff Commission today to consider what a lowering of import duty would mean to the Connecticut safety pin industry.

In a letter to the commission, the governor said that "should any of our safety pin producers transfer their operations outside Connecticut to areas of lower labor cost, as they may do if their competitive position is further weakened by lower priced import pins, the unemployment problem would, of course, be aggravated."

Dempsey said that most of the domestic safety pin industry is in Connecticut, particularly in Waterbury and the Naugatuck Valley region.

The commission will hold a hearing Tuesday to consider a reduction in the duty on foreign-made safety pins.

The governor told the commission that the unemployment rate in Waterbury, where there are two safety pin plants, is 5.1 per cent—one per cent higher than the state average.

Appalachia Bill Senate Adds Amendment For Kennedy

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate amended the \$1.09-billion Appalachia aid bill to pave the way for a possible share in its benefits for 13 New York counties.

The amendment was a personal victory for Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, D-N.Y., author of the amendment, in his first Senate floor test of strength.

He voiced an implied criticism of New York's Republican Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller for not having sought the action.

Approval was by voice vote, with Sen. John Sherman Cooper, R-Ky., the only senator to speak against it. Cooper contended it should have been handled as separate legislation.

Kennedy offered the amendment, accepted a modification of it proposed by Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R-N.Y., and won its approval after assurances that other regional plans similar to Appalachia will get consideration this year.

Sponsors had feared the biggest threat to the measure came from senators who wanted to add amendments to establish

Police Halt Mass March Along Street

SELMA, Ala. (AP)—Approximately 300 Negroes, including Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., were arrested by city police today as they marched toward the Dallas County Courthouse in a continuing voter registration campaign.

The Negroes who were walking in mass from the church were taken into custody on orders from Selma's public safety director, Wilson Baker, on charges of parading without a permit.

Baker, his voice hoarse with laryngitis, stopped the procession half a block from the church where the Negroes had assembled. He told them, "This is a deliberate attempt to violate the city's parade ordinance. You will have to break up in small groups."

King, walking at the head of the group, told Baker, "We don't feel that we're disobeying any law. We feel that we have a constitutional right to walk down to the courthouse."

The city official warned them again that they would be violating the law if they continued as they were.

He permitted them to proceed for two blocks before stopping them again and announcing, "Each and every one of you is under arrest for parading without a permit."

A small force of city police told the Negroes to form a more compact group and then marched them the remaining two blocks to the City Hall.

Baker instructed his men to refrain from using force in making the arrests. Another group of Negroes had gone to the courthouse earlier to get in line to seek registration as voters when the Dallas County

Attempted Coup Fails, Laos Regime Remains

VIENTIANE, Laos (AP)—An attempted coup Sunday night by a group of young army officers appeared to have failed today.

The officers, headed by Col. Bouleut Syvanna, met for two hours with army generals and Premier Prince Souvanna Phouma. Souvanna issued a statement afterwards calling the incident a misunderstanding.

The rebels seized the Vientiane radio station and issued a communique which said they wanted to reform the army high command, take control of the army out of the hands of cliques

Tract Tells Way to Fire On U.S. Plane

WASHINGTON (AP)—A document captured from the Communists in South Viet Nam shows how guerrilla soldiers are taught to concentrate their fire on U.S. aircraft and exhorted to "take courage and fire fiercely" if caught in the open.

The document outlines simplified methods of shooting at American helicopters and fixed-wing planes for three men "cells" or squads using rifles, automatic rifles or machine guns.

The paper, prepared by Viet Cong staff officers, was declassified recently and made available to The Associated Press. It

Demolition Is Started In Rockville Renewal

REDEVELOPMENT got under way in Rockville today as city and town officials viewed the demolition of the former New Haven Railroad freight depot at Brooklyn and Market Sts.

Workers for the Raymond Construction Co. tore into the building shortly before 10 a.m. Four buildings will be leveled as part of the first reconstruction project—the re-routing and covering of a portion of the Hockanum River. A 16-acre tract in the heart of Rockville is slated for renewal.

James Brennan, a Rockville Redevelopment Agency commissioner, told those gathered that "the pages of history are turning fast for the city of Rockville; we're here this morning to see another milestone of progress."

Brennan said, "At first glance it might seem we are here to watch the demolition of a landmark in Rockville—once the scene of great business activity in this area.

"But appearances are deceptive, and so we look beyond the thrust of the bulldozer and listen beyond the noise of falling timber."

Brennan said that speculators were watching the laying of a foundation for the new center of business in Tolland County and beyond. "We witness too the reclaiming of tired land and we will soon see the construction of handsome new apartments which

Churchill Grave Attracts 125,000

BLADON, England (AP)—Sir Winston Churchill's grave, a small rectangular plot heaped with wreaths of flowers in a quiet country churchyard, is attracting thousands of visitors.

Police estimated that more than 125,000 persons filed past the spot in Bladon Sunday where the great statesman was laid to rest Saturday.

Wrapped in coats, blankets and ski suits, the mourners paused at the graveside at St. Martin's church to read messages on the wreaths. Many wept.

New Soviet Action Perplexing to U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP)—U.S. officials today welcomed the Soviet Union's favorable response to President Johnson's call for top-level visits and contacts between the two countries.

They were less certain, however, about what to make of the Soviet Union's unexpected diplomatic intervention in war-torn Southeast Asia except that it will probably raise new problems for both the United States and Red China.

The two apparently unrelated developments announced in Moscow Sunday, led Washington authorities to conclude that the new regime in Moscow has now made some basic foreign policy decisions and is ready to initiate action.

The response to Johnson's initiative, which the President made in his State of the Union message a month ago, took the form of a commentary in the Communist party paper Pravda, which U.S. leaders were sure was officially inspired.

The comment declared that Johnson's proposal for visits and for increased contacts between U.S. and Soviet officials had "met with a positive response in the Soviet Union."

Informants here said there had been some advance word to the United States that a favorable, informal reply would be forthcoming. They called the Pravda commentary encouraging and speculated that diplomats of the two countries would soon begin exploratory talks about top-level visits.

Johnson had said he would like the new Kremlin leaders to come to this country and speak to the American people on television. He made clear that he would welcome a reciprocal invitation to visit the Soviet Union and appear on Soviet television.

A few hours before the Pravda article was published, the Times news agency disclosed that Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin would head a high-powered delegation of Soviet military, aviation and economic experts on a visit to North Viet Nam.

Asst. Secretary of Defense Arthur Sylvester told newsmen that McNamara's pneumonia showed up on X-rays over the weekend after the secretary was admitted Friday to the Army's Walter Reed Hospital.

At the time his illness was diagnosed as an upper respiratory infection or bad cold.

That would represent a decline from the 4,061,000 born during 1963, and would be the smallest annual total since 1954. The birth rate continued the downward trend which has prevailed for about three years, the November rate being 28.7 per 1,000 population, down from 29 in November 1963.

N.Y. Welfare Strike Over

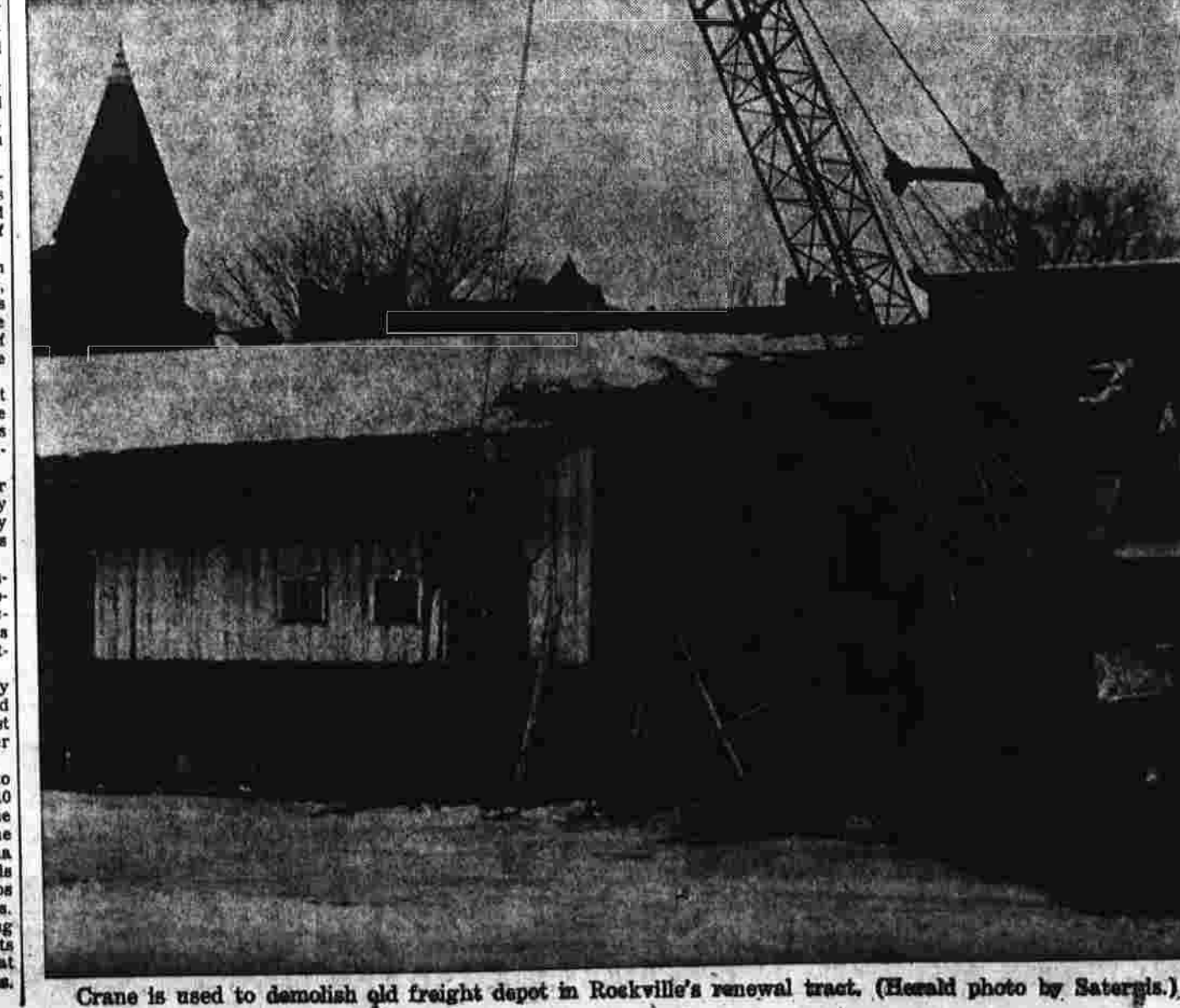
NEW YORK (AP)—The city's welfare workers returned to their jobs today, leaving a fact-finding board to study wage and working condition issues of their four-week strike.

A key point in the agreement was the city's pledge to suspend the mandatory penalties of a state law forbidding strikes by public employees.

Although the strike began over demands for more pay and lighter work loads, the state law became its central issue. The peace plan indicated that the law's constitutionality will be challenged on court.

Union leaflets greeted the returning welfare workers with the statement that "You've proved you could fight City Hall and win."

But it is also a point on the map where the Communist position, whether it is Chinese or Russian or East North Vietnamese, stands face to face with the position of the United States.

This does not necessarily imply a visit. It probably does carry the hint, from the new Russian leadership, that we are not supposed to worry too much about the approaching visit to North Vietnam.

It is probably supposed to whisper to us that, if the Russians are successful in reestablishing some priority of influence in North Vietnam for themselves they will be using it to try to tone the war in Southeast Asia down, and let it drift toward some kind of permanent truce.

So the new Russian leadership has found one spot on the world map where it can make a play which gives it a sudden strategic intersection with the policies and strategic interests of both the United States and Communist China.
