LBJ Reveals Broad Plan For Beautifying Country

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson called today for a wide-ranging program to preserve and enhance America's beauty.

Included attacks on air and water pollution, more parks and recreational areas, and elimination of eyesore junkyards along the nation's highways.

In a special message to Congress, Johnson said that while the federal government can do much, a beautiful America will require the effort of government at every level of business and private groups.

"I am hopeful that we can summon such a national effort," Johnson said.

"For we have not chosen to have an ugly America. We have been careless and often neglectful. But now that the danger is

clear and the hour is late this people can place themselves in the path of the tide of blight which is often irreversible and always destructive.

Johnson said "we must not only protect the countryside and save it from destruction, we must restore what has been destroyed and salvage the beauty and charm of our cities."

For the cities, he recommended a community extension program which will bring the resources of universities to focus on problems of the community just as they have long been concerned with rural areas.

In addition, under the housing law of 1964, grants will be made to states for training of local governmental employees needed for community development.

Johnson said he will recommend a supplemental appropriation for this purpose.

He cited two programs already on the books which he said can be of special help in creating areas of recreation and beauty for metropolitan areas: population: The open space land program, and the land and water conservation fund.

In addition to these programs, Johnson said he will ask authority for a fund matching program to cities for landscaping, installation of outdoor lights and benches, creating attractive cityscapes along roads and in business areas, and for other beautification purposes.

He also told Congress he will propose legislation to authorize supplementary grants to local authorities to acquire, develop and manage properties of historical significance.

Johnson said the present system of parks, seashore and recreational areas does not meet the needs of a growing population and that he will propose the use of federal funds to establish:

- Assateague Island national seashore in Maryland and Virginia.
- Tocks Island national recreation area, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.
- Cape Lookout national seashore, North Carolina.
- Sleeping Bear Dunes national



LBJ, Security Council Await Bundy's Report

WASHINGTON (AP)—U.S. and South Vietnamese planes struck another major air blow at Communist North Viet Nam today—the second in two days—and reported leaving military camps in border areas afire.

Here in Washington, the National Security Council met at the White House with President Johnson. A major purpose was to hear a report from George Bundy, the president's special assistant, just returned from South Viet Nam.

The new air strike, a follow-up to that delivered Sunday by planes from U.S. aircraft carriers, was announced in Saigon by the U.S. Embassy but without details.

At Da Nang, South Viet Nam, Brig. Gen. Nguyen Cao Ky, said it was made by 30 Vietnamese propeller-driven A1E Skyraiders and four U.S. F100s. Ky flew the lead Vietnamese plane.

The pilots reported heavy anti-aircraft fire. Ky said almost all the South Vietnamese planes were hit. One crashed near Da Nang on the return flight. The pilot parachuted.

Ky reported one American jet was hit by flak, but said there were no U.S. casualties.

He said his planes achieved 70 per cent destruction of their targets, leaving them burning, and observed numerous ground casualties.

Barracks and guerrilla staging areas at Dong Hoi, just north of the border, were the chief targets. Sunday as 49 U.S. Navy jets swooped down in a reprisal raid for the North Vietnamese shelling of a U.S. base in South Viet Nam.

Three targets at Dong Hoi earmarked for punishment during the initial raid were skipped because they were obscured by clouds.

Today's announcement by the U.S. Embassy said:

"In furtherance of the action announced yesterday by the acting Vietnamese premier and the U.S. ambassador, it has been made known that military action was taken today by government of Viet Nam and U.S. aircraft against other military installations in North Viet Nam."

Bundy was expected to report at a National Security Council session. The presidential aide hurriedly returned Sunday from a South Viet Nam fact-finding trip and went directly to the White House late Sunday night.

High-ranking officials declined to predict what turn events would take next. They looked for diplomatic and military clues from the Communists — but reported nothing so far giving a firm reading on the Red's future course.

Still left open was the possibility of further reprisal raids on Communist North Viet Nam like

'Changed Our Mind' Says Leader Registration Open, Negroes Still Balk

SELMA, Ala. (AP)—The Dallas County Board of Registrars permitted Negroes today to start putting their names on a voter registration waiting list, but a Negro leader said his followers will refuse to sign it.

Even though the board, in making the waiting list available one week ahead of the next scheduled registration period, had done precisely what Negro leaders requested, the Rev. James Bevel said, "We changed our mind."

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who has led the voter registration drive here, left for Montgomery, Ala., to launch a new campaign there before flying to Washington. King plans to confer Tuesday with Vice President

Hubert H. Humphrey and Atty. Gen. designate Nicholas Katzenbach.

King said he then plans to return to Selma to resume command of the movement here Tuesday night.

Bevel said Negro leaders had decided it would amount to discrimination for Negroes to put their names on the waiting list as the board gave them an opportunity to do.

He said they would insist on immediate registration even though the board is not in session, and would resume their street demonstrations if they are turned down.

More than 70 Negroes who were arrested after a court-house march Friday carried petitions urging the board to make the waiting list available immediately so prospective voters could start signing up and be assigned numbers. This would give them priority when the board meets next Monday for actual registration.

Bevel said the board had a clerk on duty to take the names and assign numbers, but Bevel said no one would sign the list.

He said the fact that Negroes are asked to get on the waiting list was discriminatory because as he expressed it, "white people don't have to sign. They just go in and get registered."

An order issued last week by U.S. District Judge Daniel H. Thomas directed the board to speed up registration and to abandon the tough literacy test.

Negroes, however, are still demanding additional time for registration in addition to the two days a month.

They are asking also for some joint sessions of the board.

Events In State Judge Proposes New Conference On Gambling

NEW HAVEN (AP)—Federal Judge William H. Timbers proposed today that a special conference be called to "devote its full energy initially to cracking down on organized gambling in the state."

"I'm looking forward to Gov. Dempsey for leadership in this critical matter," Timbers said from the bench of U.S. District Court.

Timbers also said he has been "impressed with the apparent lack of willingness or ability on the part of certain of the prosecutors, in one instance under the pretense of 'public apathy,' which is pure bunk, and judges of the state's Circuit Court to back up the local and state police in enforcing the gambling laws of this state."

Four Picked For Gemini Space Trip

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—Air Force Maj. L. Gordon Cooper Jr., the nation's most-seasoned space traveler, and Navy Lt. Cmdr. Charles Conrad Jr. were selected today to fly the seven-day Gemini space flight.

Chosen as the backup crew were two civilians — Neil A. Armstrong and Elliott M. Sze Jr. Both are former navy pilots.

Cooper was a member of the original seven-man Mercury astronaut crew. Sze, Armstrong and Conrad were among the nine men selected in a second group of astronaut trainees Sept. 17, 1962.

The four were assigned to the third manned Gemini flight — probably to be made this fall — at a news briefing at the Manned Spacecraft Center.

Cooper, 37, flew his Faith 7 Mercury capsule 22 times around the globe May 15-16, 1963, for a total time of 34 hours and 30 minutes. He is a native of Shawnee, Okla.

Sze, 37, a Dallas native, is a quiet, intense man. After receiving a master's degree in engineering in 1962 from UCLA, he was a test pilot for the Navy and later General Electric.

Conrad, 34, of Philadelphia, is the smallest of the 23 astronauts and the only Ivy Leaguer. He was graduated from Princeton in 1963 with a bachelor of science degree in aeronautical engineering. He is 5 feet 8 1/2 inches tall and weighs 138 pounds.

Reverberations Resound After the Viet Flare-up

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson, even while using the strongest language he has yet applied to the situation in Viet Nam, seems to be showing a basic caution that has marked most of his moves in that part of the world.

In his only statement dealing with the weekend crisis, he said Sunday:

"We have no choice now but to clear the decks and make absolutely clear our continued determination to back South Viet Nam in its fight to maintain its independence."

This assertion was coupled with a presidential announcement that American dependents would be evacuated from South Viet Nam, that an anti-aircraft missile battalion would be moved in and that reinforcements might be coming.

"Clear the decks," an American slang phrase, seemed to sum up a tough-minded attitude that if the Communists wanted a showdown, the United States was ready.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Congressional leaders came away from a White House National Security Council meeting today with the impression that the United States is following a strike-for-strike policy in Viet Nam.

Although none of them would comment directly, it was their obvious understanding that the United States will answer with air raids any new Communist attacks on its troops and installations in South Viet Nam.

The Senate's Democratic and Republican leaders, who sat in on the Security Council session, voiced in separate interviews full support for President Johnson's orders for the two air strikes on North Viet Nam installations which were carried out as a result of Communist attacks Saturday.

Sen. Mike Mansfield of Montana, the Democratic leader, said Johnson "had no choice in the matter."

"His purpose is to achieve stability, if possible, so the South Vietnamese government can manage its own affairs within South Viet Nam," he said. "I think he is proceeding cautiously and carefully with full appreciation of all elements involved in any move he directs."

Sen. Everett M. Dirksen of Illinois, the Senate Republican leader, said the Senate is giving full support to Johnson's course.

"We're going to carry out in South Viet Nam our initial purpose and objective of aiding these people to retain their freedom," Dirksen said. "The President has no choice."

Income Tax, Number 1 Form to Use, Deductions

EDITOR'S NOTE—Congress made some changes in the income tax, effective with the returns that are now being filed. Here, in the first of five special articles, is an ABC of some of the principal points to keep in mind.

WASHINGTON (AP)—This is an ABC on filing your 1964 income tax return which must be in by midnight, April 15.

Remember: Congress lowered your tax rate but, in doing so, made a number of other changes. Some will be examined later in this series.

This article explains one of them—the new minimum standard deduction—along with rules on what forms to use, how to figure your tax, and the other ways of taking deductions.

You will need the instruction sheet sent taxpayers by the Internal Revenue Service. It has general information, tax rate schedules for figuring your tax, and tax tables for finding your tax that way.

You can get far more information by buying the government's 100-page booklet—"Your Federal Income Tax"—for 50 cents at the nearest IRS office.

Let your Social Security number on your return, enclose the W-2 withholding statements given you by your employer, and report only taxable income. Some income, like Social Security payments, is not taxable.

Only by filing a return can you get a refund from the gov-

Both bills were filed Dec. 22, and Vernon's legislators, Reps. Raymond Spelman and Gerald Allen and Sen. Franklin Welles have been working on the project.

Rep. Spelman has announced the public hearing, and that another bill will soon be introduced to the General Assembly.

The bill would validate the action of the Charter Consolidation Commission, which after a year-long series of meetings, drafted the charter for the new unified government.
