ANKARA, Turkey (AP) — Sen. Bunt Hayri Urgan, a moderate independent, sought today to form a new government for Turkey.

President Cemal Gürsel named Urgan to head a committee Tuesday night on the recommendation of leaders of the four opposition parties which overthrew Premier İsmet İnönü's minority government Sunday.

It forms a government, Urgan will serve until a general election in October. He is a former ambassador to Washington and London.

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — Japanese Foreign Minister Shigemitsu Shima is to visit South Korea today for talks on establishing formal diplomatic relations between the two countries touched off violent street demonstrations in Seoul and Tokyo.

About 100 placard-carrying members of South Korea's two opposition parties scuffled with police in front of the Chonan hotel as Shima arrived from Seoul airport. Police arrested about a dozen demonstrators.

About 200 leftist students battled police near Tokyo airport in a protest against the visit of Shima, left for South Korea. Police said 25 students were arrested.

LONDON (AP) — Sir Alec Douglas-Home has given a general reshuffle to the Conservative party's shadow cabinet following the retirement of R. A. Butler from politics.

The shadow cabinet keeps watch over the various government departments, and its members raise questions in Parliament relating to the fields assigned them.

Douglas-Home assigned these fields of responsibility: Reginald Maudling, foreign affairs and No. 2 Conservative spokesman in the House of Commons; Edward Heath, treasury and economic affairs; Peter Thorneycroft, home office; Christopher Eames, defense; Quintin Hogg, unspecified; Sir Ian Gledhill, agriculture, and Anthony Barber, trade.

MOSCOW (AP) — Pravda today reported overwhelming support for less centralized control and more use of the profit motive in the Soviet economy and said proposals to achieve this are now being studied by special commissions.

The Communist party paper published news of more than 800 comments received since it ran an article by economist Viktor Trofimov on Aug. 17 proposing the revolutionary changes.

SEMPFIELD, England (AP) — Sheffield University's student health service has started issuing birth control pills to reduce the number of illegitimate births among students.

Dr. Peter Gifford, the director of the health service, said illegitimate births among the university's 700 girl students were running at the rate of 12 a year.

### Survey Tells Who to List As Jobless

WASHINGTON (AP) — Bob Brown has a job with the Nuts & Bolts Co. but didn't work last week because of a strike at the plant. Question: Is he employed or unemployed?

He's employed, according to the Labor Department's Bureau of Labor Statistics. But suppose, while on strike, Brown goes over to the Screw & Washer Factory to apply for a job there?

In that case, he will show up on the government's jobless rolls along with some four million other Americans.

The names of Bob Brown, the Nuts & Bolts Co. and the Screw & Washer Factory are typical of course, but the bureau uses them to illustrate how it arrives at one of the nation's most important economic yardsticks every month.

During one week in every month, some 35,000 families in a carefully chosen cross-section are interviewed by a special group of Census Bureau workers and the results multiplied to get the national unemployment rate.

But it's not so simple as just knocking on the door and asking who in the family is employed or out of work.

The interviewer does not make the decision. It's all done by electronic computer back at the Census Bureau in Washington.

The computer is programmed to decide who is listed as employed, unemployed or not in the labor force.

People with regular jobs who were absent from work during the survey week because of illness, bad weather, strikes or various personal reasons are listed as employed.

### Smallest African Nation Unfurls Flag at Midnight

BATHURST, Gambia (AP) — Africa's newest and smallest independent nation unfurled its flag for the first time tonight.

Gambia was Britain's first and its last possession in West Africa. It is a tiny strip of a country, 15 to 30 miles wide on each bank of the Gambia River and extending 300 miles inland.

Little more than 300,000 people live on its 4,000 square miles. It is surrounded by Senegal and its people are related to those in Senegal.

Most of the 10 Gambians live on bare subsistence farming. Peanuts account for 80 per cent of exports. Small quantities of beeswax, hides, skins and palm kernels also are shipped.

Prime Minister David Jawara, 41, is the son of a farmer. Jawara was trained as a veterinarian in Scotland and became a full-time politician as the head of the People's Progressive party in 1960, a year after it was founded.

Closer ties with Senegal are favored by top officials in Bathurst and Dakar, and geography suggests it would be logical. A U.N. commission has recommended association.

Gambia is not economically viable by itself and Senegal's coastal communications now must take a 200-mile detour around Gambia.

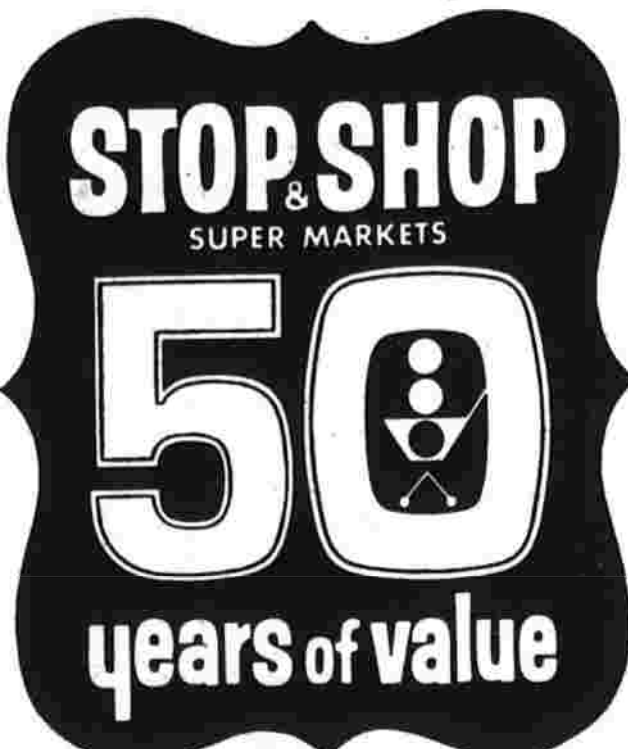

The wishes of those trustees who nobody seems to love. This would be for some regional authority of interested states to take over the passenger end of the New Haven, lock stock and barrel, and own it and operate it, and leave the trustee free to take the freight end of the railroad into any merger they can get for it.

Clear, clear Connecticut policy should, then, in our opinion, have toward association with other states, New York, Rhode Island and Massachusetts, to form a special government agency to be given power and title to operate the passenger services of the New Haven permanently. The first step seems to be to get behind the proposition that Congress should create such authority.

#### No More Boundaries

As it was with the great robbery at the Museum of Natural History, so it is with the great plot to dynamite the Statue of Liberty, the Liberty Bell, and the Washington Monument. We don't know whether we are in the world of reality or the world of television.

But whichever way it may seem to be, one particular moment or another, one rather fundamental stage of integration and equilibrium seems to have been achieved for our civilization.

The reality and the unreality, the actual and the imaginary, the absurd and the tangible, have at last brought into a perfect interchangeability with one another.

This, one can be sure, is what philosophers might mean and recommend in the way of harmonious and perfect adjustment of our relationship to the various spheres of existence. We are getting so we now pass from one to the other without consciousness of any old-fashioned boundaries. The world in which we live and the world of television are indeed one and the same; there are no longer any dividing lines between them; experience continues the same whether we turn a knob off or on.

If there is any slight surviving difference between worlds, it is that we used to say, of something on television, that it was too extreme and bizarre and crackpot for real life. Now there is some question whether things that happen in real life aren't just a little too fictional for television. But the one dominant trend, to which all factors and which keep contributing, is that there shall be no sanity anywhere, in either medium. We have it almost made.

#### The Trouble With Stimulants

In the early years after World War II the U.S. urged economic orthodoxy on the Europeans, who were then recovering heavily from the war. It wanted fiscal and monetary reforms so that the war-ravaged economies could become self-reliant. Perhaps the single most intelligent U.S. move was sponsoring the Marshall Plan, which allowed the Germans to get rid of a flock of economic controls.

Just how orthodox the Continental nations have been in this since is a matter of recurring dispute; some observers contend they have been less than having lip-rampant Keynesians. Yet at the end of the day it is evident that the U.S. policy was successful. The world has prospered, both in terms of living standards and the huge holdings of gold and dollars which France and Germany particularly have built up.

Meanwhile, back on these shores, the policy of late has been of unabashed indulgence. Budget deficits have become the rule in good times as well as hard; the same with artificially easy money. Last year saw a large tax cut enacted with the budget in a position of deep deficit.

This combination is hailed in certain quarters as a major breakthrough in economic thinking. It was not accidental, but a deliberate design for powerfully stimulating the economy. You might justly be impressed with the fact that the policy is so effective, and that it is going to the right.

The prescription for this year is similar, except that there isn't supposed to be quite so much stimulus, especially in the first half of the year. The program does, however, call for increased Federal spending, excise-tax cuts, continued deficit and presumably easy money. In addition, Congress will be asked to devise machinery for quick tax reductions and public-works spending increases when the occasion is thought to require it.

The question is who is more nearly right, the comparatively orthodox Continental countries and the relatively unrestrained Americans. On the surface little basis appears for complaints about the U.S. economic performance; we are still in a long up-swing and most people are well off indeed. It is only fair to ascribe a certain amount of the prosperity—it's impossible to say exactly how much—to the government's stimulus policy.

Still, that very policy contains its own seeds of trouble, some of which are beginning to sprout and others of which are in painfully full bloom.

In the former category are the mounting signs of excessively risky lending, with the concomitant danger of money going into marginal or unbound enterprises; the money market is experiencing a rapid expansion. The well-developed difficulties include most notably the balance-of-payments deficit and the gold outflow it occasions. It is not extreme to believe that the government seems unwilling to correct, as a threat to the dollar and hence to the prosperity which is so widely and warmly applauded.

It might not be a bad idea for the policymakers and pundits to take a closer look at America's old precepts to Europe and Europe's present practice. An ironic turnabout has taken place, all right, and it is not necessarily fair play for this country. But old officials, the Europeans are acting as though they were well off indeed. It is only fair to believe that stimulants in excess are likely to have unpleasant after-effects.

The South School P.T.A. Committee for School Facts would like to present the following facts regarding the need for a larger elementary school in the Spring-Gardner Street area.

On October, 1962, Planning and Renewal for the Town Planning Commission on a comprehensive plan of development for Manchester. In this report (pages 21-22) it is stated that the need for a new school in the Spring-Gardner Street area should be secured as soon as possible for the construction of an elementary school in this area.

On December, 1962, Dr. William Curtis released a report on the future requirements of all school districts. It was again recommended that a site be identified in the Spring-Gardner Street area for the construction of an elementary school. This and the preceding report were widely circulated.

Last week an up-to-date study of recommendations and characteristics of Manchester school districts was released with the recommendation that the acquisition of land and steps for construction of an elementary school plant be considered No. 1 project.

The 1965 report shows South School enrollment to be 146 as compared to 153 expected in 1965. This decrease in enrollment is being caused, it is felt, by the fact that the school is crowded and that making it necessary to bus out of this district to Washington and Highland Park Schools, including the first four graders as have the 4, 5 and 6 graders for a number of years.

Since 1962, there have been 42 new homes constructed in the area and the rate of construction is increasing as predicted in the preceding report. These are some of the conditions that exist at 224 Elm Street.

A combined grade 1 & 2 school is being constructed in the cafeteria assembly room of the school building. The stage where there is no bulletin board space and where there is no proper lighting.

Most facilities including the gymnasium, are too high and accessible only by a ladder and sink facilities are completely inadequate.

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Throughout his long history with "The Greatest Story Ever Told," George Stevens has striven to avoid the usual trappings of a commercial motion picture.

Because he felt the Christ story should not be treated like any other film venture, the eminent producer-director has been steadfast in refusing to discuss costs, contracts and other business matters.

"Tonight's premiere in Hollywood will be conducted about the usual accompaniment of searchlights, beehives, etc. But, with the opening here and in New York, 'The Greatest Story Ever Told' has entered the marketplace and hence must be appraised in terms of commerce as well as art.

Stevens' magnum opus is a soaring achievement, the best film ever made from a Biblical theme. It is also a flawed masterpiece.

Stylistically, the film is everything Stevens hoped to achieve. The camera roams the magnificent western America. He works with lights and shadows, rather than exploiting the brilliant hues that most color movies possess.

Costumes, cities and landscapes are largely in expert shades of beige and brown. No bare color intrudes, except for dramatic purposes, as in the scarlet of Mary Magdalene's dress or the brilliance of the Resurrection robes.

The second most notable feature of "The Greatest Story Ever Told" is the performance of Max Vado. He may be the definitive portrayal of Jesus, being virile and commanding, but with a deep well of spirituality and mysticism. His face seldom animates; as

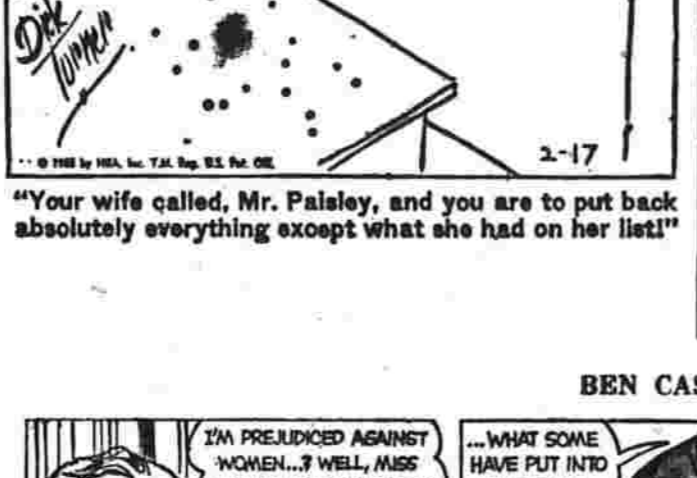
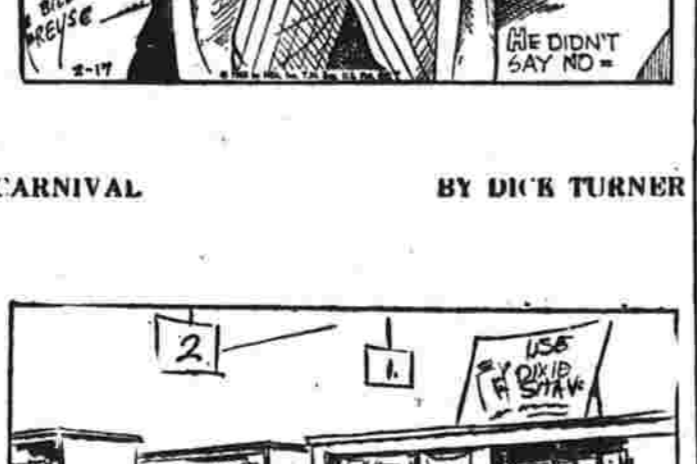
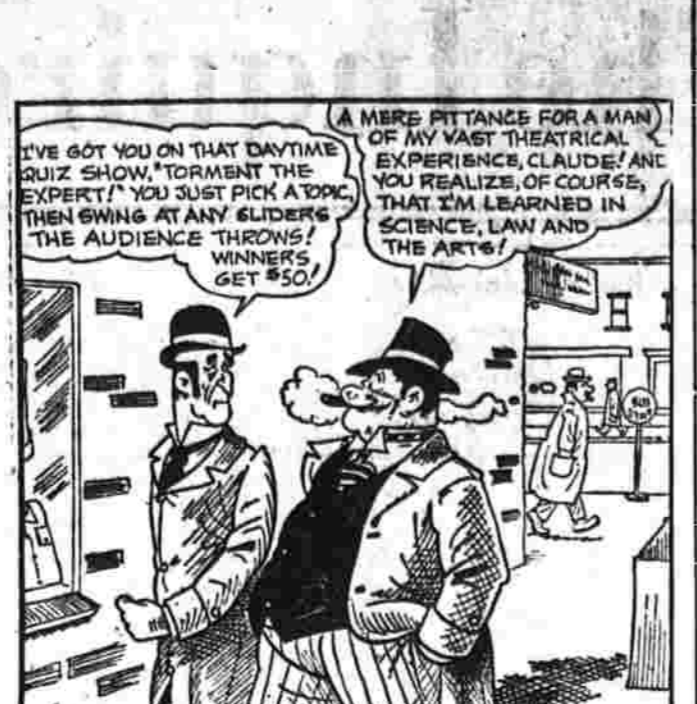
