





All Communist China needed to hang the United Nations up for a few hours, and make it look as powerless and ridiculous as Communist China would like to have it look, was the parliamentary services of a small friendly nation inside the Parliament of Man, the Federation of the World, plus, of course, the lasting political schism and power rivalry between the two biggest members of that Parliament, that Federation.

What Chinese Communist-oriented Albania did, the other day, was to demand that a vote be taken in the United Nations General Assembly. The record vote Albania demanded

was a vote on whether the members of the General Assembly wanted to continue operating without record votes of any kind. This was a particularly devilish par-

liamentary device, for it confronted the United Nations General Assembly with the precise technical showdown it has been avoiding all fall and winter by arranging its business, by tacit consent. so it won't have to take record votes.

If the General Assembly should ever be forced into a record vote, even on the question of whether or not it wishes to dispense with record votes, that would precipitate the point-blank quarrel between the United States and Russia. In that quarrel the United States maintains Russia can't vote in the General Assembly unless its pays its obligations to peace-keeping operations the General Assembly ordered in the past. Russia is apparently willing to make some kind of payment, but only after it has been assured that its right to vote is not being challenged.

So Communist China pulled the puppet strings leading to little Albania, and little Albania made the motion for a record vote, thus threatening to bring the United States and Russia head to head in a clash which might bring the whole world structure crashing down. At the least, it gave Communist China, speedily becoming the world's third greatest power, a neat opportunity to set its two greatest rivals at each other's diplo-

This is, as we view it, legitimate poregrets, we welcome the idea that the world powers and parties should play politics in the United Nations. That is what the organization ought to be forto settle disputes by politics rather than

As for our minor regrets, they are these. We would wish that Communist China were inside the political institution It is trying to ruin, instead of working through agents. And we could wish that the United States and Russia, who are in the United Nations, could somehow manage as much appreciation of its importance, and of their own opportunity to play their world politics there, as Communist China, the great outsider, seems to have. Is it entirely impossible for both the United Nations and Russia to realize, together, that the United Nations is more security for either of them than either of them can provide for itself in alliance even with another member of the great world power triangle now shaping up? Is it totally impossible that both the United States and Russia should realize that they have a great common aurvival interest in building up the same world political order Communist China was trying to smash with one smart parliamentary move the other





At school board headquarter policemen were pelted with sandwiches, and half-filled milk containers. More than 50 policemen restored order.

It was the first violence in the school protest, which has spread to 26 city schools.

mittee for desegregated schools started the boycott Jan. 19 to demand quicker action on desegregation programs.






