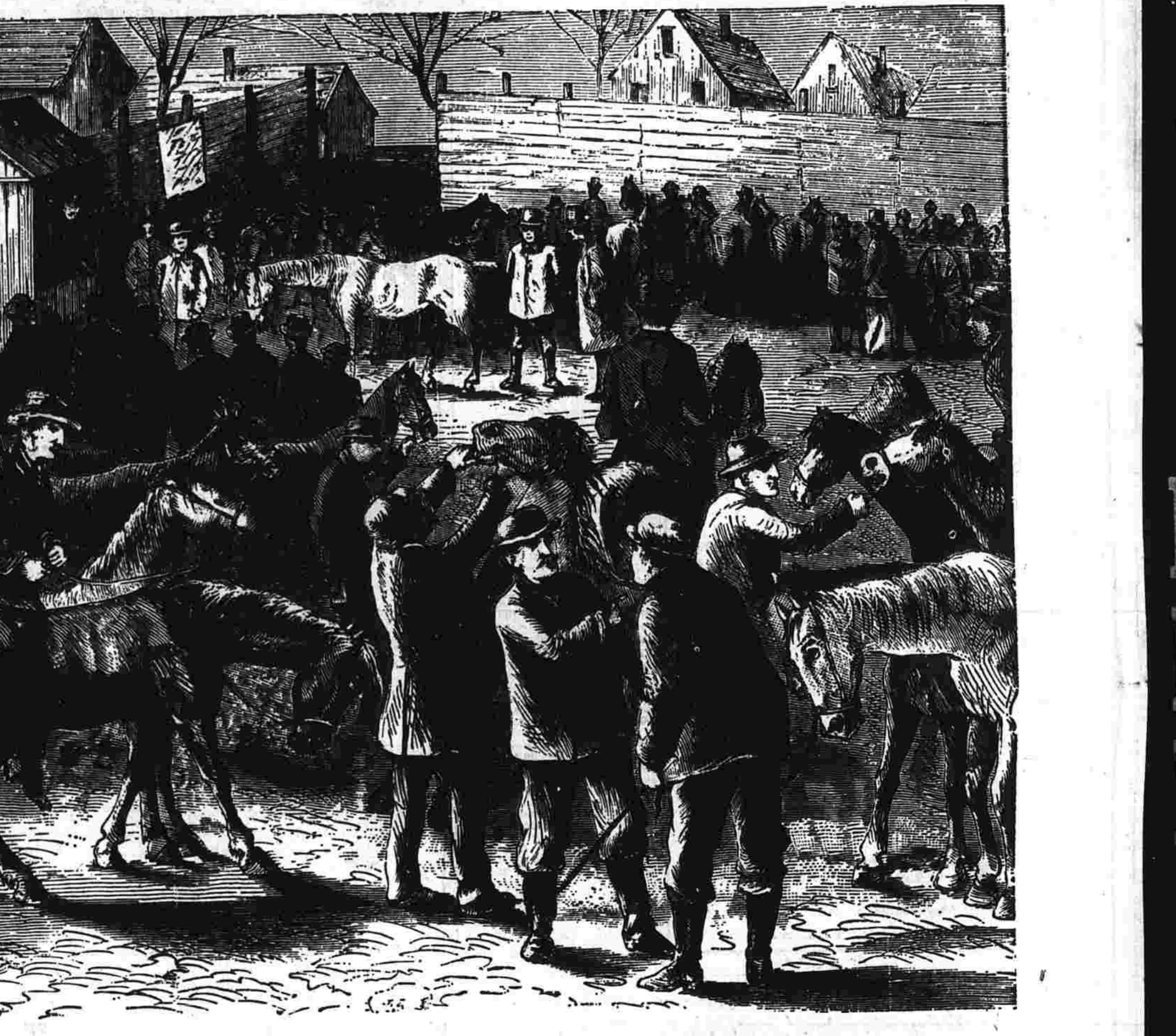

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States is seeking more information on a Soviet explosion which sent radioactive material into the atmosphere.

The underground blast occurred Jan. 25. The limited test ban treaty forbids nuclear explosions in which radioactive material is sent into the atmosphere.

A survey spokesman said similar photographs may be obtained by Ranger 8 Saturday. This would permit detailed mapping of a second inner area.

The area mapped is about 90 by 20 feet, and is located in the Mars Cognitum area of the moon. The map shows contours and defines with clarity the ridges, depressions, and minute craters of the lunar landscape.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Humphrey has expressed regret for the U.S. legislation in Budapest. He said the U.S. charge d'affaires, Robert J. McCloskey, said the apology was made Thursday to the U.S. charge d'affaires, Ethel O'Donnaghy, in Budapest.

Gov. Dempsey Will Have Plan For Aid to RR

HARTFORD (AP)—Gov. John Dempsey, vowing to preserve New Haven Railroad commuter service, says he hopes to present a concrete plan of aid to the bankrupt railroad's trustees soon.

Dempsey said the Connecticut Transportation Authority is working to implement the Connecticut-New York plan to pump \$20 million into the railroad for new commuter equipment.

Dempsey's remarks came Thursday after the trustees' bid plans with the Interstate Commerce Commission for financing service at four stations and cutting service at 10 others by March 29.

Dempsey said he will personally assist the proposed cutbacks at the ICC hearing. He announced that Connecticut's case is already being prepared.

Connecticut House Speaker J. Tyler Patterson, Old Lyme, and House Majority Leader Louis A. S. Norwalk, all said they expected Connecticut to resist the application in every proper way.

The trustees' application to the ICC came three days after U.S. Judge Robert P. Anderson gave them permission for the move.

The 10 stations whose services would be cut back are Larchmont, Mamaroneck, Harrison, Pleasantville, Scarborough, and Greenwich, Cos Cob, Riverside, Old Greenwich and Stamford, Conn.

The plans were presented to the ICC in a 23-page statement backed by 30 exhibits.

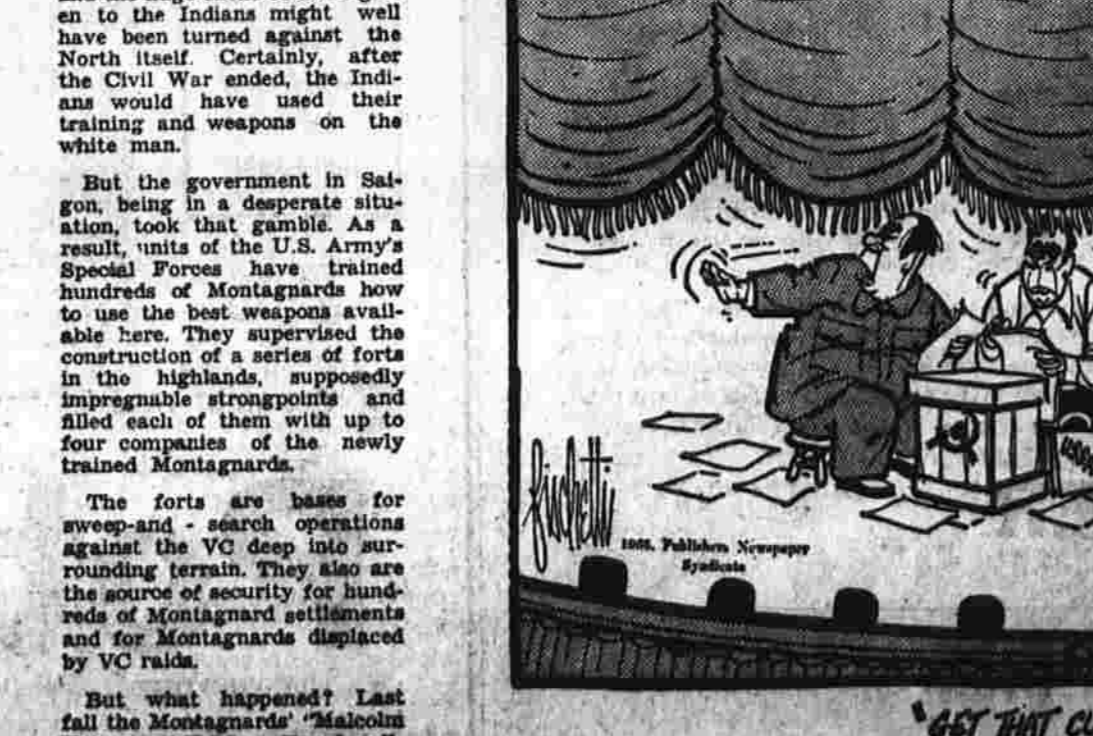

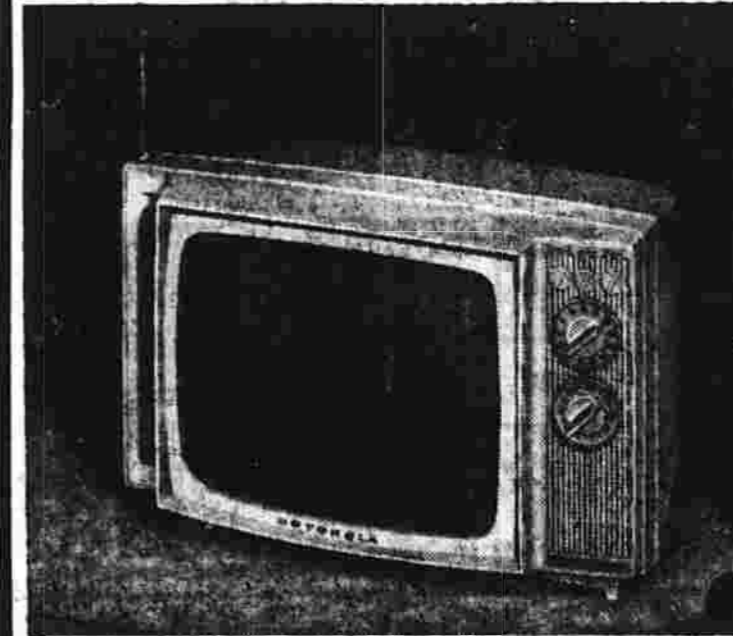

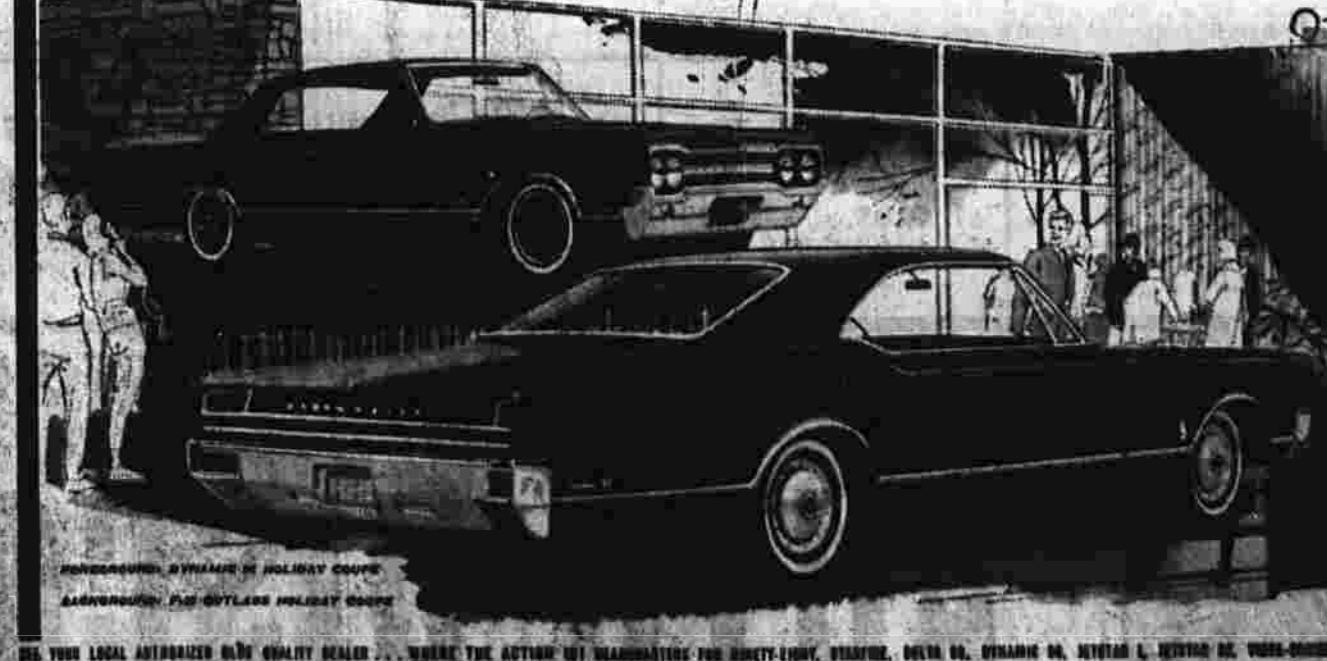

New Turnpike Link Opened Boston to Mississippi River Without Single Traffic Light

BOSTON (AP) — The Boston terminus to the New York extension of the Massachusetts Turnpike opened yesterday providing a direct route from the heart of downtown Boston to the west.

With the new link, it will be possible to drive from Boston to the banks of the Mississippi River — without encountering a single traffic light.

That's well over 1,000 miles, and a third of the way across the country.

The new 12-mile link connects the end of the original Massachusetts Turnpike in Weston Road 125 with the John F. Fitzgerald Expressway which cuts through downtown Boston.

The latter leads in one direction to Route 3 and the Middlesex Turnpike, and in the other it makes connections with expressways to New Hampshire and Maine.

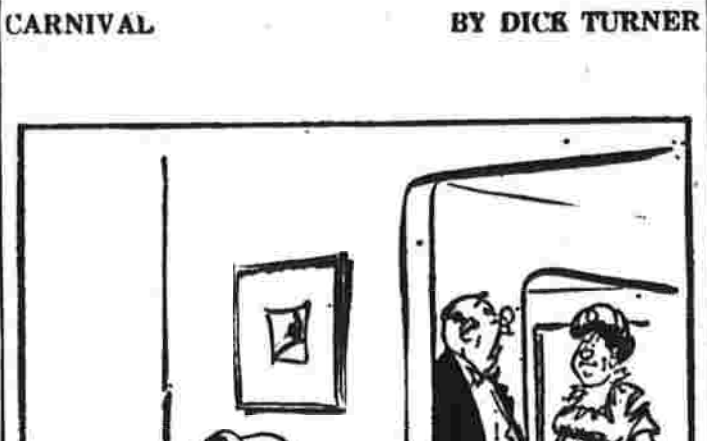

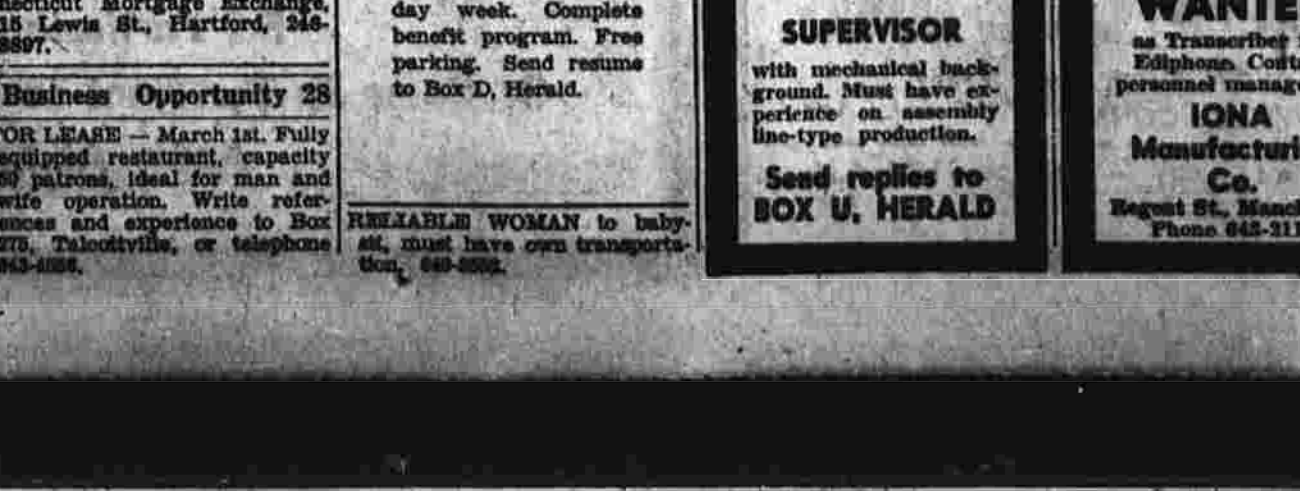
