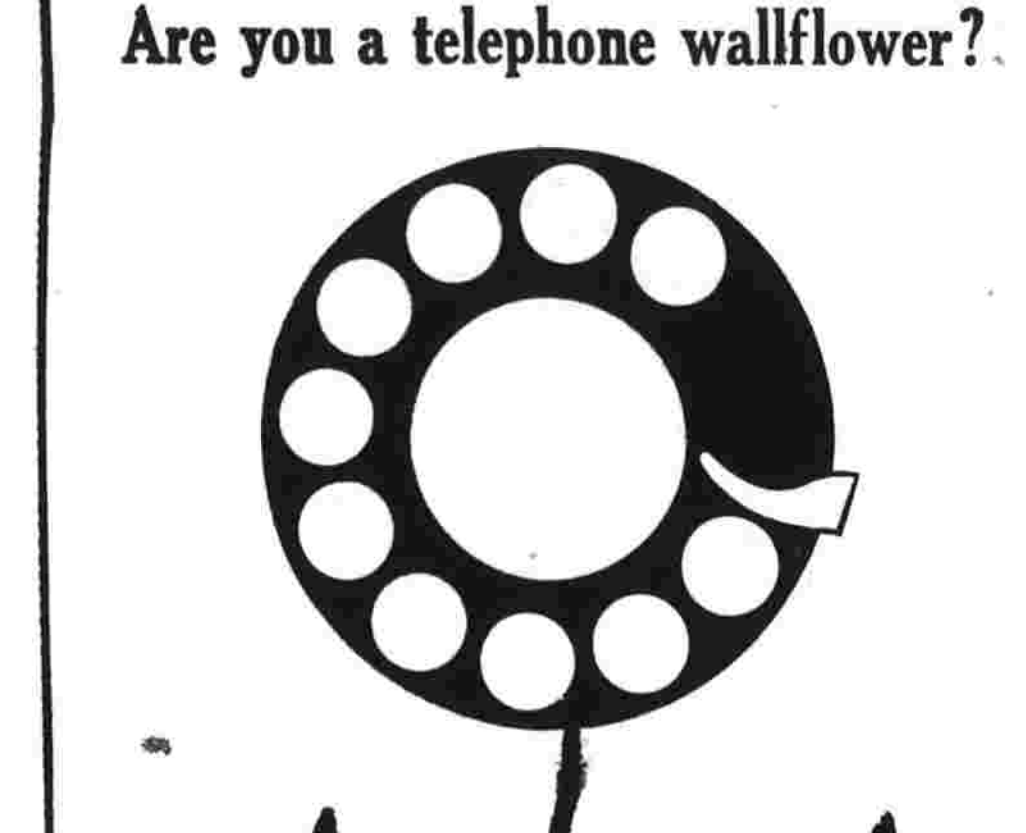

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) — Former U.S. Sen. Pierre Salinger has confirmed that he and his wife have separated and that she will seek a divorce.

The report which Salinger confirmed was published Thursday in the Washington Evening Star, which quoted friends as saying the Salingers' relationship recently had been strained because of divergent interests.

Mrs. Salinger, an artist, disliked her husband's activities in politics, the Star quoted the friends as saying. The friends said Mrs. Salinger would file suit early next month in some state which permits divorce on grounds of incompatibility of marital status.

Mrs. Salinger resided at a State Court in Virginia — a state which recognizes only adultery or desertion as grounds for divorce.

Salinger has been living in the Los Angeles area.

The Salingers were married in 1957. Salinger was press secretary to the late President John F. Kennedy, and later served President Johnson in the same capacity.

He was appointed to the Senate last year, but was defeated in the November election.

Revolution of Youth Looming in Africa

NEW YORK (AP) — "A revolution of youth and a revolution of youth soon may be the twin hurricanes. One gets the feeling that this is a bill before the storm. You travel through Africa with a sense of impending disaster."

With these words, Lord Caradon, Britain's permanent representative to the United Nations, sums up the impression Africa made on him during a tour last week at the request of the World Council of Churches.

In an account of his 10-day trip at a meeting of the National Council of Churches program board for overseas missions area, Caradon called on U.S. Protestants to help the Christian churches of the world in fully educating Africa's youth.

He said handicapped, still-illiterate but no longer satisfied youths, many uprooted from their homes, are tinder for a possible African youth revolution.

"I sometimes think," he told the churches, "that such a revolution of youth could be as dangerous as racial conflict."

The churches brought education to Africa. If they fail to give a practical lead to the youth which have partly educated but are not only destroyed by a monster of their own making but they will be betrayed, the hopes they raised.

Caradon said it was imperative that the churches, in order to continue to work effectively, go to the new African governments and ask: "What can we do? How can we help you?"

A former chief secretary of British Nigeria and long active in African affairs, Caradon added that all Christian churches should act in unity, not with "one denomination working in competition with another."

Attending Lord Caradon's address was the Rev. Theodore L. Tucker, 39, born in Angola and later a missionary there. A minister of the United Church of Canada, he now is director of the African Department of the National Council of Churches.

The Rev. Mr. Tucker, who lives in Manchester, and whose daughter, Nancy, 21, is with the Peace Corps in Sierra Leone in West Africa, is hopeful that the Christian churches will be able to continue their work in Africa, "no matter what happens."

Just back from an eight-day African tour, he said he had agreed with Lord Caradon's appeal for church emphasis on youth education, but added that "much of the effective leadership of Africa today is already Christian. That is why I am very hopeful for the future."

NEW YORK (AP) — "A revolution of youth and a revolution of youth soon may be the twin hurricanes. One gets the feeling that this is a bill before the storm. You travel through Africa with a sense of impending disaster."

With these words, Lord Caradon, Britain's permanent representative to the United Nations, sums up the impression Africa made on him during a tour last week at the request of the World Council of Churches.

In an account of his 10-day trip at a meeting of the National Council of Churches program board for overseas missions area, Caradon called on U.S. Protestants to help the Christian churches of the world in fully educating Africa's youth.

He said handicapped, still-illiterate but no longer satisfied youths, many uprooted from their homes, are tinder for a possible African youth revolution.

"I sometimes think," he told the churches, "that such a revolution of youth could be as dangerous as racial conflict."

The churches brought education to Africa. If they fail to give a practical lead to the youth which have partly educated but are not only destroyed by a monster of their own making but they will be betrayed, the hopes they raised.

Caradon said it was imperative that the churches, in order to continue to work effectively, go to the new African governments and ask: "What can we do? How can we help you?"

A former chief secretary of British Nigeria and long active in African affairs, Caradon added that all Christian churches should act in unity, not with "one denomination working in competition with another."

Attending Lord Caradon's address was the Rev. Theodore L. Tucker, 39, born in Angola and later a missionary there. A minister of the United Church of Canada, he now is director of the African Department of the National Council of Churches.

The Rev. Mr. Tucker, who lives in Manchester, and whose daughter, Nancy, 21, is with the Peace Corps in Sierra Leone in West Africa, is hopeful that the Christian churches will be able to continue their work in Africa, "no matter what happens."

Just back from an eight-day African tour, he said he had agreed with Lord Caradon's appeal for church emphasis on youth education, but added that "much of the effective leadership of Africa today is already Christian. That is why I am very hopeful for the future."

But it will be of course, a little too late for some of the present generation. They must continue, as before, to try to make a nobility of necessity, and a distinction of their lack, and so to appear before men as to make future generations, no matter how hirsute they may become, think of this as mankind's shining hour.

Felix Frankfurter was the best and the brightest of the present generation. He had a Jewish love of learning for its own sake as befitted the descendant of six generations of rabbis and Talmudic scholars. He was an effervescent, inimitable conversationalist—a suitable taste and talent for a man born, as he was, in nineteenth-century Vienna.

But Frankfurter had also the austere conservative's devotion to the past, respect for power and taste for balance and order and moderation. He was the public life under the auspices of Henry L. Stimson, one of America's great conservative statesmen. As chairman of the War Relocation Authority in World War II, he advised the president and finally American Justice of the Supreme Court, Frankfurter served his Government with conspicuous devotion.

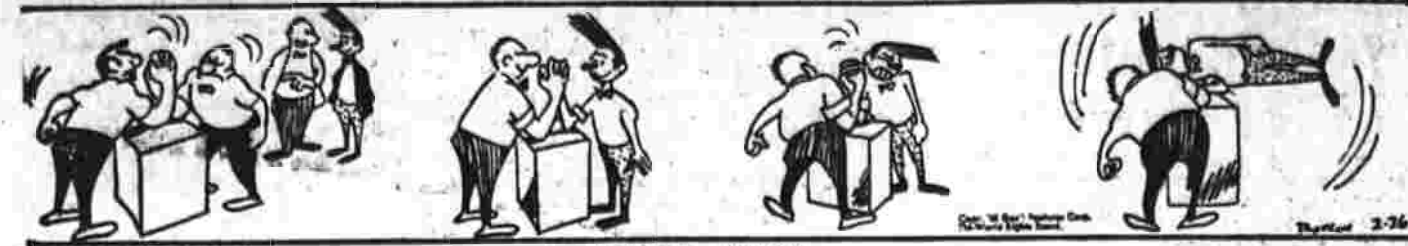

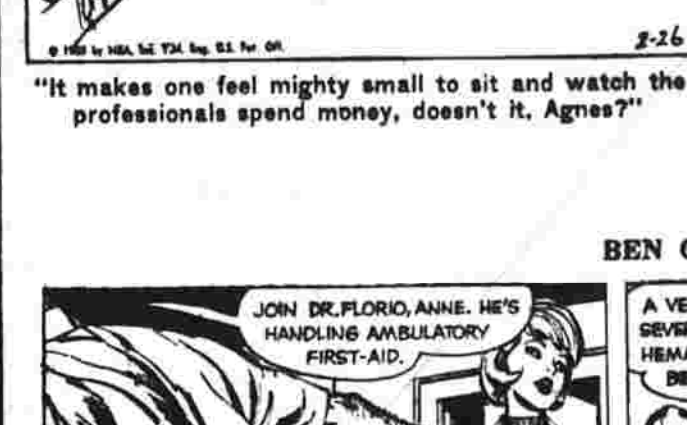
