But the important, significant thing is that such nations are willing to yield themselves, without reserve or condition, or without knowing in advance what and where the peace-keeping operation would be, to the will and command of the United Nations. > Felix Frankfurter Felix Frankfurter was the heir an exemplar of several traditions that have mingled successfully in the rich tapestry of American life. Had he lived in the eighteen-century

Enlightenment, he would have been at home in Dr. Johnson's London or in the Paris that so warmly welcomed Thomas efferson and Benjamin Franklin. He had a Jewish love of learning for its own sake as befit the descendant of six gensatiable conversationalist—a suitable taste and talent for a man born, as he Frankfurter had the authentic radical's need to protest against injustice and, in so doing, to risk unpopularity rich and respectable. He exposed the wrongful conviction of labor leader Tom Mooney during the patriotic excitement of World War I. He crusaded in behalf of a new trial for Sacco and Vanzetti, in 1927, shocking many defenders of the status quo in Harvard Yard and the Commonwealth of Mas-sachusetts. He was active in innumerable dissenting movements.

But Frankfurter had also the authentic conservative's devotion to th

pest, respect for power and taste for balance and order and moderation. He entered public life under the auspices of Henry L. Stimson, one of America's nan of the War Labor Policies Board in World War I, adviser to President and finally Associate Justice of the Su-preme Court, Frankfurter served his rnment with conspicuous devotion Nor was it any accident that he conributed the phrase "with all deliberate speed"-with its nicely balanced double imperative-to the Supreme Court's school desegregation decision.

Harvard Law School, he was a superb enthusiasm, he awakened, stimulated, goaded, enlightened and finally educat-

skilled professionals but as civilized men and as future public servants with live-Among his admirers there was school of thought that for Frankfurter elevation to the Supreme Court, although it seemed to crown his career, was i ct an anti-climax and a wrong turning. This greatest of teachers, some believed, lacked the ultimate self-confi dence to wield judicial power, intimately acquainted though he was with the workings of political power.

#### Rio's Traffic **Under Tough** Task-Master

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) - Rio's tough traffic boss, Col. Americo Fontenelle, has tangled with another foreign embassy - this time the Soviet Union - in his flat-tires battle against illegal parking and traffic violations. As usual, Fontenelle won.

The colonel and a team of hi deflation specialists found eight American-built cars with diplo matic license tags parked gally at the Soviet Embassy. The cops drew their weapon valve cores — and swung into action, ignoring protests. The air hissed out of 32 tires. Some of the cars were said to belong to visiting Yugoslav dip-lomats, but both embassies dropped the matter.
Fontenelle and his men have deflated tires, impounded cars and cited drivers of some 20 diplomatic cars owned by seven foreign embassies.
Three diplomats protested in vain to the Foreign Ministry. Diplomatic immunity, contends Fontenelle, doesn't extend to the

air in a diplomat's tire. Most diplomats accept measures quietly. U.S. Ambassador Lincoln Gordon called Fontenelle to praise his campaign after Fon-tenelle deflated the tires of the ambassador's official limousing illegally parked at the embasay force pilot, says "diplomate know they also must respect the traffic laws." "A diplomat who breaks the law is compromising and embarrassing his country." When Fontenelle took over the traffic department nine months

ago, virtual chaos reigned on Rio's streets. Gov. Carlos Lacerda told Fon tenelle to untangle the traffic problem. He revived a method used by the late Menezes Cortes when he held the traffic director's job 15 years ago deflating the tires of offenders.
