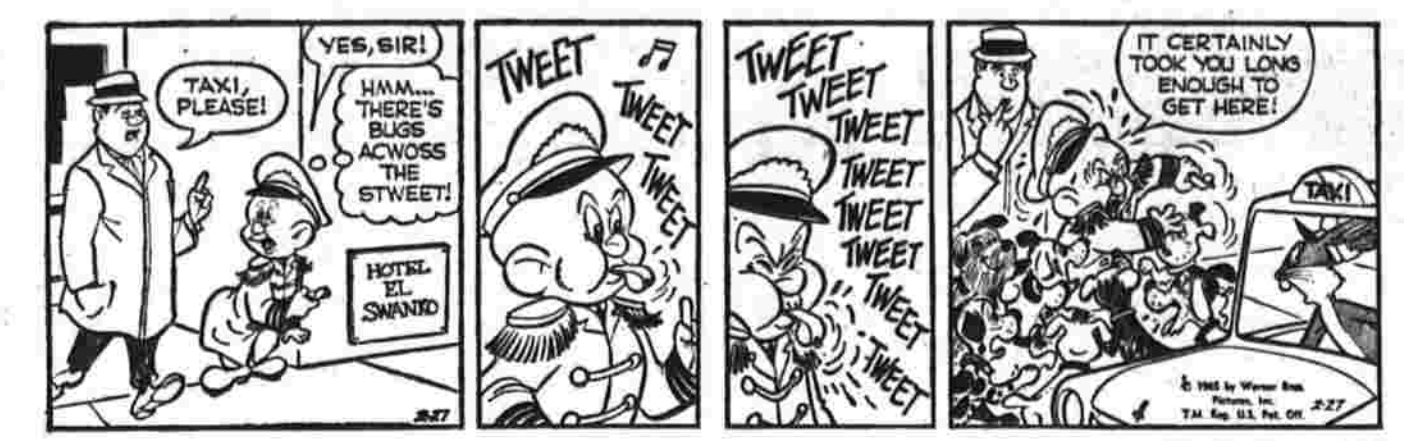

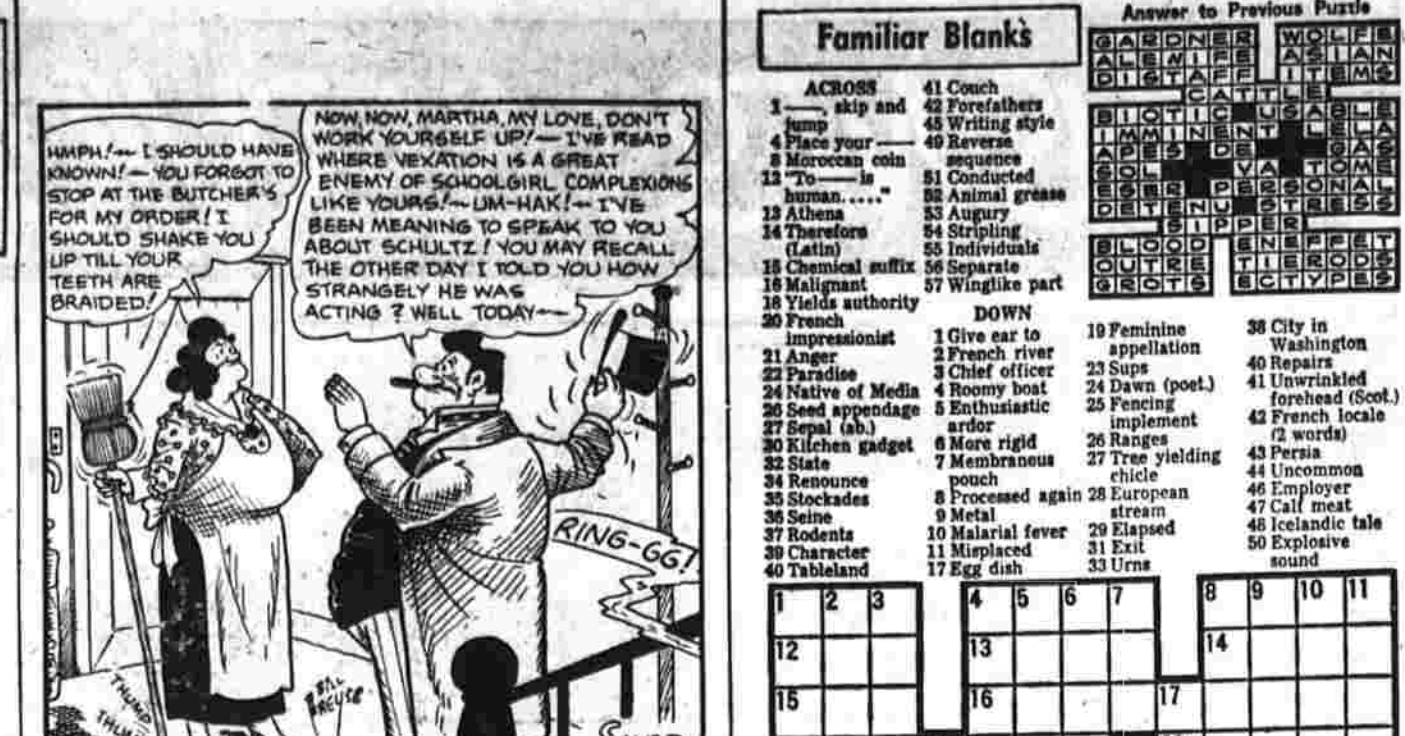

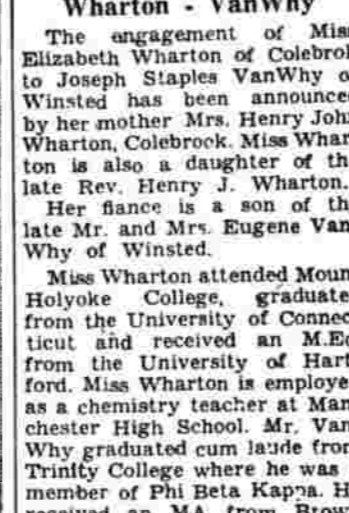

NEW YORK — (NEA) — Fortunately for Michael Tolan, both the quality and quantity of the dialogue given him since his radio acting days in his native Detroit have improved. As Alex Tassinski, the angry young doctor on CBS-TV's *The Doctors and the Nurses*, Tolan's dialogue is supplied by writers who care. When he was a Wayne State University student, moonlighting as a regular performer in both "The Lone Ranger" and "The Green Hornet," he found most of his dialogue went like this: "What th— MASKED?"

"In order to be able to act on either show," he said, "you just had to be able to say that one line well."
A Busy Nonstar
Tolan, a tall soft-spoken, humorous young man, had been one of television's busiest non-star performers before he became a regular on *The Doctors and the Nurses*. Mostly he was cast as a menace, but the work was regular enough to keep him living comfortably in New York.

Over the years, Michael received many series offers, all originating in Hollywood. "All the offers seemed to be those five-year, 80-page contracts that let you make a lot of money, if successful. But I didn't want to move to Hollywood. I manager to keep working during that mass actor exodus to California. But as the work faded out here, I began to weaken."
"Actually, I had agreed to do a pilot for United Artists at the time I was offered a role in 'The Greatest Story Ever Told.' But, because they were both UA projects, they released me from the pilot for the movie."

In Same Role
Shortly after Tolan began work on the George Stevens movie, he was approached about joining the CBS medical series, in the mass role he had played in an episode a year earlier.
"It's funny, but when I was first offered the script in which Tassinski appeared, I wanted to do it very much. But the character was so strong, and had such impact, I figured it would end all chances I had

Fall Shopping Starts
In the Works, a Lot of Offbeat Comedies

NEW YORK — (NEA) — What you will be seeing on television next season is now being determined, as the annual Madison Avenue shopping spree for television series gets under way. This is a frenzied ritual which makes the average person's Christmas shopping seem as peaceful as a tranquilized lamb. Nearly 100 pilots are up for grabs. Some look very hopeful. Some look as if they should never have been made. Among the former is *Get Smart*, a hilarious James Bond spoof with Don Adams (*House Detective* Glick on *The Bill Dana Show*) as a secret agent whose telephone (hidden in the sole of his shoe) is apt to ring loudly and constantly while he is attending a formal symphony concert.

Among the latter is *The Good Old Days*, the Flintstones come to life with Darryl Hickman, a good actor, wasted in a supposedly comic study of a young caveman bachelor.

Situation comedies are in the greatest abundance. And most of them have gimmicks of the Bewitched type.

A Genie Named Jeannie
NBC has already announced that *I Dream of Jeannie* is set. In this, Larry Hagman (*Mary Martin's* son) plays an astronaut who releases a genie named Jeannie (*Barbara Eden*) from a bottle. She is eternally grateful, and a mind reader who anticipates his every little wish for a kiss. This show may set men to dreaming the way *Bewitched* makes a woman think what fun a little power can be.

Also possibilities for NBC: *My Mother, the Car*, with Jerry Van Dyke the owner of an antique car, the reincarnation of his mother; *George Gobel*, in *The Willies*, as a hotel owner who discovers two ghosts from the Revolutionary War. The spirits are Kathy Brown, whose blood has obviously not yet cooled, and Hans Conrard as a man "cut down in the prime of life just because I had the whitest eyes on Bunker Hill."

ABC is offering Thompson's *Ghost*, with Bert Lahr as a

slightly befuddled ghost who can't always make it through the wall. (Shades of the role Marion Lorne plays on *Bewitched*.)

Also in the comedy-fantasy category, but purely by accident, is *Hercules*, a Joe Levine production with Gordon Scott, an ex-Tarzan, as the muscle-bound hero.

Meeting the Monster
A sampling of one film, shown to advertising men and the press, had a beautiful young blond (a man; in this kind of show beautiful young blonds are always male, and exotic brunettes are the females), saying with great sincerity to Hercules, "I cannot stand idly by while you meet the monster tomorrow."

If this show continues to take itself seriously, it could be the comedy highlight of the season.

CBS appears to be offering five comedy-fantasy pilots for sale. But it is very hard to make a definite statement about CBS shows, because they drop a cone of silence (a gimmick used in *Get Smart*) around what they are doing, and send members of the press to the underground for information.

Secret agent OOCBS reports *Heaven Help Us*, with Barry Nelson and Joanna Moore; *Who Goes There?* about a family whose portrait of General Custer and his Indian servant come to life; *Dream Wife*, with Shirley Jones and Donald May; *You're Only Young Twice*, with Ed Byrne and Ethel Waters; and *The Smothers Brothers*, with one brother a businessman and the other an angel.

Western James Bond
Westerns are coming back, at least to the pilot stage, if not the purchase stage. NBC has *Laredo*, a color show with Neville Brand, Peter Brown and William Smith. CBS has *The Wild West*, a James-Bond spoof, they say, with Robert Conrad and Ross Martin. ABC has *A Man Called Shenandoah*, with Robert Horton as an amnesiac. *The Big Valley* with Barbara Stanwyck

Richard Long and Peter Breck, and *The Legend of Jesse James* with Chris Jones as Jesse and Allen Case (who used to be *The Deputy*) as Frank James.

ABC has two soaps, *The Girl From Peyton Place* and *The Long, Hot Summer*. CBS has a serious ghost story in *The Haunted*, and NBC has one in *The Ghostbreaker* with Kerwin Mathews and Diana van der Vlis.

Several pilots are Bond-ed. *I Spy*, a color show set for NBC, stars Robert Culp as a tennis bum who is a secret

agent, and Bill Crosby as his assistant. Henry West stars Anne Francis as a female Bond, with John Ericson as "her man Friday," and Selena Mead has Polly Bergen as the resourceful Washington widow who works for the Q branch of secret service.

Searching, Searching
Drama is present, but not in any great profusion. ABC has announced *The FBI Story* for Sunday viewing from 8 to 9. They also have an anthology.

Moon Effort Is Examined

Col. John H. Glenn Jr., the first American to orbit the earth, will appear as a "guest commentator" in "T-Minus 4 Years, 9 Months and 30 Days," on CBS examining America's effort to land a man on the moon by the end of the decade. The program will be broadcast Monday 10 to 11 p.m.

Col. Glenn, now a consultant to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, will join Walter Cronkite at the Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md. He will provide expert running commentary on remote units cover space training, research, development and operational activities at five of the major space centers throughout the U.S.

Cronkite and Glenn will show viewers the Apollo three-man command capsule in its final stages of development and preparations for next month's Gemini-Titan launch. They also will translate the telemetry sound of satellites charting the path to the moon.

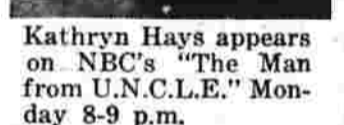
