

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) - B57 air strikes against the Communist Viet Cong have been halted in a Mekong Delta area after the American bombers accidentally killed four South Vietnamese troops and wounded





That was only one part of Thant's ment that day, but the only part hich was emphasized and answered. It s answered, first, by sharp criticism the United Nations Secretary General his insult to the American governent and the American people. It was swered, also, this weekend, by the tate Department release of an official white paper" purporting to give the American people both "facts" and sackground" to the present situation Vietnam.

It so happened, however, that Secreary General Thant, when he was makthe statement in question, had carhis own remarks forward into an anation of what he meant. He told that might be called a fable, but in his view a true fable, of two countries, Vietnam and his own country of Burma. What Thant said, in this comparison, went as follows:

"To my knowledge there was not a ngle instance let me repeat there was not a single instance of North Vietamese providing military assistance or arms to the Viet Cong in South Viet-

After that, Thant implied, somebod else began to get involved in affairs in

Meanwhile, he said, his own Burma, in 17 years of independence, has been ighling its own Communist underground difficut asking for any outside military assistance. The Burmese Communist Party is still underground after 17 years and still illegal.

"But let me tell you: There has not been a single instance of outside help to the Burmese Communists inside Burma. . . Burma has over 1,000 miles of land frontier with mainland China.

If only the Burmese Government had decided at some time to seek outside military assistance to suppress the internal insurrections and revolts, then I am sure that Burma would have experienced one of two alternatives: either the country would be divided into two parts or the whole country would have become Communist long ago. . . . Not one presious American life has been lost in

Secretary General Thant was saying, in this comparison of two countries; was that if we hadn't told the regime in South Vietnam to invite us to come in and help perhaps South Vietnam would have had a better chance of handling its Communist problem. American policy makers would dis-

agree, strongly, with any such infershoe. And the white paper published this weekend, titled "Aggression from the North—the Record of North Vietnam's Campaign to Conquer South Vietnam," people that all sin and all blame has elearly been on one side, and so much so that not only are we justified in doing what we have done already, but also justified in what we may be about to do, which is to make our own waging o war on the mainland of Asia a still more

But if Americans read this white paper with any thought of finding in it the kind of fact and background which Secretary General Thant suspected we might be missing, they will find them-selves disappointed. This is essentially a ene-way propaganda document. Reports from South Vietnam, now regularly quite accurate in their prediction of what new Rubicons President Johnson has decided to cross, say we are on the verge of not only bombing at will across the border, but that we are also about to do the one thing that has been consistently promised us we would not do-put American lane force into this war. The less successful additional commitment proves, the more commitment we make. We are ravaging the country we seek to save, and bombing the people whose freedom we promise to protect. We are within terrible close distance of unifying Russia and Communist China in what they will have to regard as a reconciliation of necessity, and of turning all the peoples of Asia, if not toward them, at least

H some other nation were doing it. we would be seeing clearly enough what deadend idiocy it threatens to become, and we would know it was by no means good enough to provide an acceptable spitaph for civilization.

Good For Cronkite

Walter Cronkite deserves one of those "beam in your own eye" citations for suggesting that, in the next national political conventions, the television networks take it upon themselves to give up or restrain their "walkie-talkie" activities on the floor of conventions. If the networks want to interview personalities on the floor, they could invite them into special booths set over at the side of the hall. But what Cronkite dared suggest, in a forum on the sublect of television news practices the other day, was that something, at least, be done to retreat from that "wild scramble" for on-the-spot participation in every slight detail of a convention abtivity which has featured the last four national conventions, and which, in the eyes of the nation's viewers at least, has developed two weaknesses.

First, the practice often tends to create more confusion and situation than it covers or explains. There have been moments in which television has seemed to be trying to start the trouble or the incident it was seeking to report. Second, the practice almost continually degenerates into an overemphasis of trivia. Frequently, moreover, the atten-

tion to a variety of trivia takes up time which might much better be spent letting the nationwide audience see what is actually happening up on the platform of the convention. It is sometimes possible that the public might rather listen to a real speech, good or bad, than hear to get from one side of the hall to the

Cronkite quite correctly acknowledged that he would probably be assailed as traitor to his trade for even suggesting such things. But he was, in our opinion, in a fairly safe position-on the side of that common sense and practical good taste which will ultimately see to it that some mature moderation comes into television convention coverage.
