

There was a time, a few days or weeks ago, when one might have thought that the Johnson administration did not intend to pose to China and to Russia the kind of situation which would leave them

But, as American escalation of the situation has proceeded from one step to another, it begins to appear that President Johnson and his advisers have begun to join and accept, rather than resist, the counsel of these war hawks who say they want us to risk full showdown with China and Russia now.

The depth of the madness in the American position as it has been developed by the deadend strategies of the past few weeks is this: that we have somehow brought about a completely ridiculous state of affairs in which we, who are in Southeast Asia to resist and contain aggression, are beginning to peem the aggressor, and we, who have sought to defend and serve the cause of peace, are beginning to appear to be the ones who banish peace. None of this was ever our real national intent. That it should begin to appear to be our intent is a case of gross mismanagement of our role, our image, our strategy and sur power. The President has listened to those who have succeeded in making him and all our national power helpless. We are becoming completely captive to events. Leadership which can do this to the greatest and presumably most intelligent and powerful nation on earth has, literally, a world to answer-

What they were doing was following one of their own scripts, playing and dmiring the tough, heartless tycoon, and, all the time, setting the thing up for the theatrical kind of ending it has

The tycoon cultivates the kindly father image, the corporation officially practices the pay hology of the big gentle heart, and the only kind of fellow who ever gets into any real trouble, in real big business these days, is the Neanderthal type of guy who is willing to stand on somebody's neck to get himself a little higher up in the world. The way they'd write this particular talent and career in real big business would have been: "Little Aubrey, Boy Failure."

It is proclaimed by the sociologists who say the criminal has no responsibil-ity for his crime. It is evidenced in

countless ways in the responsibility-diminishing efforts of the national Gov-ernment. It is sometimes declared the law of the land by our highest magis-

That so much praise of irresponsibility and thus implicitly of violence should be without effect is an unsafe assumption. And in recognition of this part of the problem a logical cure suggests itself. There may not be much that can be done about an individual's interior important. be done about an individual's interior im-balances to the extent they are condi-tioned by impersonal forces, but there is a great deal that can be done by the molders of opinion, the parents and teachers and makers and administra-tors of the law. They can begin to re-assert the absolute necessity, in a ra-tional society, of emphasizing individ-ual responsibility.

We are not exactly optimistic that those in positions of power or insidence will perform any such turnabout; in many quarters irresponsibility is embraced with a passion worthy of a better cause. But the fact that more better cause. But the fact that more and more questions are being raised indicates that something else may be happening: A developing revulsion toward violence, whether it be directed at our flag abroad or our persons and rights at home. For despite all the unfortunate examples and teachings, most people still manage to resist the easy doctrine of anything goes.

In that growing aversion to indignity, if not in the attitudes of the powerful, lies at least some hope of gradually lifting the incubus of irresponsibility and restoring balance, so that our age may not finally have to be characterized at one of unmittigated violence. — WALL STREET JOURNAL.
