Transition to 'New Math' Outlined for School Board

A group of mathematicians, teachers and administrators outlined the New Math program to the educational policies committee of the board of education last night.

It was the first of many meetings the committee plans to hold with teachers of all the subject areas in the next months.

The teachers came loaded with workbooks, textbooks, and math studies most of which seemed to have a modern approach—or so their titles would indicate.

Albert Hatahagan, head of the math curriculum committee and teacher at Benedict Junior High School, read a report the committee had prepared, reviewing the progress made in preparing for the introduction of the new math into the school system.

Most of the report dealt with the areas in which the committee had acted on since its inception in the spring of 1963. The first was a study of the modern math textbooks; second, several pilot projects being carried on at all levels; third, the drawing up of a curriculum guide for the elementary schools; and fourth, teacher training.

The report detailed the training program up to the end of this academic year and named a number of alternatives for future training programs.

The one that seemed to arouse the most support was a special course at which the 300 elementary teachers could more firmly ground themselves in modern mathematics.

Such a course is now being given by Williamantic State College to the teachers in Ellington.

But before the session went on too much further, the chairman of the board subcommittee, Dr. Walter Schardt, expressed a desire to ground himself a little more firmly in the new approach. Some of the answers he received to his question "What is the philosophy of the new math," follow.

It is an attempt to get children to see the structure of mathematics. Such an abstract overview would give them more flexibility to enter into concrete situations of any nature.

It is a trend away from the rote learning of facts, the "acclimated" math of counting change and figuring income taxes to a conceptual approach.

It encourages more creativity. It starts with understanding.

She said that the children love it but that it takes the teacher more time to explain the exercises than it does to do them.

The existing discussion on texts revealed that although there were only a few modern math studies, there were many commercial textbooks out now, each vying to introduce their variation of the new math.

The School Math Study Group (SMSG) at Yale University published such a model program ten or 15 years ago. It was developed by experts to inspire the introduction of new math into schools and to offer to commercial textbook publishers a program of study based on the new math.

One of the pilot project teachers, Mrs. Joan Rogers, said that her fourth grade class at Wadsworth was using the SMSG study this year and that the enthusiasm and understanding of the kids is much greater than it has been in the past.

With the money allotted for textbooks in next year's proposed budget, the curriculum committee plans to purchase transitional texts.

The selection will be made on basis of surveys of the competing modern math texts and the results of the pilot projects.
