





A 1955 Decision In Retrospect one frequently hears the view that a great nation cannot afford to be morallatic in its foreign policy, or try to place deslistic principle above its hard national interest. And what one hears so frequently is, in actual practice, the way most great nations do behave.

But the fact that great nations do behave this way, refusing to accept a moral law when they see the need for realism, never constitutes an audit on the re-For the results, one has to take the

instance in which the great nation makes its choice, and then follow through toward the consequences. At the present moment, it is an inberesting sidelight on the crisis over Vietnam that time and circumstance and present day analysis and comment seem to be magnifying a particular decision which was made way back in

Geneva Accords, negotiated in 1954, reelved their first outright violation. This violation occurred when the govnment of South Vietnam, with the cking and probably on the advice of United States government, decided t would not comply with the provision in Geneva Accords which stipulated that free national elections should be held in both North and South Vietnam the year following the agreement at

One can speculate, today, just as oth Vietnamese and American consulspeculated in 1955, that free iona would have been dangerous nd bad because the Communists would hably have won them, and proceeded o unify Vietnam into one country again. And one can speculate whether, if this had ever been permitted to happen, Vietnam would have developed into an Asian Yugoslavia, or merely into a link in a chain of further extensions of Chi-

nese Communist power. Perhaps, in view of such possibilities, the 1955 decision was realistically

What cannot be escaped, however, is the fact that, right or wrong, that 1955 decision is now beginning to yield heavy and persistent results. There is much more frequent mention, in discussion and analysis today, of that 1955 decision than there was in 1955 itself. Then almost nobody paid any attention to the fact that the United States was advising its little Asian friend to renounce treaty word and principle. Today the fact that we were, in that advice and policy, the first to violate the Geneva Accords is being brought up again and again, at a time when our State Department at Washington is talking about the sanctity of the Geneva Accords and calling upon North Vietnam to cease its vio-

lation of them. The realistic difference, at the moment, between our 1955 violation of the Geneva Accords, and the current violations by both ourselves and the North Vietnamese in the operations now going on, is that we can't play 1955 over again, but that we can, both of us, stop doing what we are doing now. But suppose that, as we call for North Vietnam to observe the Geneva Accords again, North Vietnam asks whether we are now willing to have free national elections conducted in both halves of the country. Could we somehow manage to consent to that, fearing the result as we most certainly would? Or are we still locked into the chain of conseguences of our decision, back in 1955, that a treaty word need not be kept, and that a great power has to play the world game not by wistful moral principles, but by a practical idea of what serves its own national interests? Any realistic answer—discarding for the monent the right or wrong of it—has to cede that, aside from or in addition e all the trouble we are in, South Vietfam is today even more conclusively in the control of the Vietcong than it was

Real Big Deal?

Enspicion has grown almost to certainty, among the lower level politicians of New York state, that some very high evel shenaniguns are rounding out into ne of the greatest political deals of all

the New York State Legislature for the first time in many, many years—their 1964 gift from Barry Goldwater—they proceeded to divide themselves into two factions, each of whom wanted all the positions and all the plums at Albany. The division between the Democrats looked strangely like a division between one party faction led by Mayor Wagner of New York and another faction led by Senator Robert Kennedy.

The deadlock at Albany was resolved by a deal between Mayor Wagner's Democrats and Governor Nelson Rockefeller's Republicans, a deal which left Senator Kennedy's friends and supporters out in the cold. It was reckoned a natural part of the

arrangement that, in addition to agree-

ing upon which Democrats should get the leadership posts in the Legislature, Mayor and Governor had also agreed upon a certain degree of harmony between themselves on financial matters involving the city-state relationship. In recent days, however, the possible extent of the understandings between Democratic Mayor and Republican Governor has been enlarged. These have been the days when the Republican party leadership in city and state has been has concerning itself with the problem of finding some candidate to run against Wagner for Mayor of the city of New York this fall. What had happened, at last reading, was that United States Senator Javits, Congressman John Lindsay, and Businessman David Rockefeller had all been nobly proposed and all had graciously declined. This seemed to be a process in which the top Republican leadership was going through a lot of motion but winding up leaving the prospect that only some mere nobody would eventually be found

to run against Wagner. To put what is being suggested as plainly as possible: the political dopesters figure it out that, as another part of their mutual dealing, the Republican Governor is arranging to concede the reelection of the Democratic Mayor. It might then, in the next phase of

so pleasant a relationship, become the role of the Democratic Mayor to concede the reelection of the Republican Governor, even if, in order to do that, he had to try to run for Governor himself. None of the political gossip which goes on like this feels required to produce any clear, factual, documentary proof or record of any of this. That kind of documentation is seldom available in such matters. You merely watch what happens, and draw your own wildest con-

Milk, Virtually

We notice that a British dairy claims to have accomplished something that the American milk industry would have done well to accomplish before it went around the country getting the states to repeal laws which required dates on milk bot-

What the British dairy claims is that it has perfected a process for bottling milk that will stay fresh and not turn sour for at least six months. That, if true, will be a noble achievement. What Connecticut consumers have been hoping for, ever since the Legisla-

ture, in a careless and illogical moment, repealed the law requiring that milk be dated, is merely for a milk product that wouldn't begin to turn off-flavor in its first week on the market. Never mind six months. One phase of the British announce-

ment, however, leads us to doubt whether the new milk is anything we wish to import or imitate. The process seems all right. It involves passing the milk over steam-heated plates and then into plastic-coated cartons invented in Sweden, and the sponsors of the process say, in prophetic tones: "We can't hold back progress, and this is unquestionably progress. Milk can now be stored in a country where only one person in three

has a refrigerator." But then a piece of what may be typical British understatement, perhaps coupled with a well known British deficiency in taste buds, invades the discussion and frightens us far, far away, back to our own undated milk, which has that habit of getting just slightly ancient in flavor after it has had two or three days on the shelf. The long-lasting milk, said the Brit-

lahers aponsoring it, could be described as "virtually indistinguishable" from the normal product. What a beautiful adverb-that virtu-

ally, so full of spelling suggesting truth and purity, and yet such a sly carrier of evasion and deceit!





### Critic Says U.S. Schools Spread Thin

By G. K. HODENFIELD CHICAGO (AP) -American leges and universities must guard against getting so inthey forget their real purpose of siducating students, a noted educator said today.

Dr. Logan Wilson, president of the American Council on Education, said, "if all the outside demands were met, nobody would be left on many cam-

would be left on many campuses except students and custodial workers."

Wilson, in a prepared address
to the 20th National Conference
on Higher Education, added:

"Whether it be eliminating
moverty, reducing unemployment, improving morals, or getting a man on the moon, institutions of higher education are
being drawn into a multitude of
public concerns. public concerns.

"Administrators and many faculty members are likely to be drawn into a gamut of peripheral service activities having to do with everything from the second chamber of commerce to

al chamber of commerce to most distant foreign coun-Wilson said higher education should not "engage in the futile endeavor of trying to be all things to all men."

There are some things, he said, that colleges and universities just can't do:

They can't transform native ability. In any cross section of the population, there are some for whom higher education is simply beyond their mental grass.

simply beyond their mental grasp.

They can't substitute for families, neighborhoods and churches in reconstructing society morally and esthetically while leading it intellectually.

The real problem of colleges and universities, Wilson said, is knowing how to serve contemporary society without becoming subservient to it.

"If they become mere knowledge factories geared solely to increasing human productivity and improving standards of material living, their time-honored commitment to the pursuit of truth, the advancement of higher learning, and the enrichment of our cultural heritage may fall into neglect."
