SALINA, Ala. (AP) — Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and other adult civil rights leaders are finding it increasingly hard to control the restless teen-agers in their ranks. It has been apparent in recent days in Selma that many of the Negro students who have joined in the march are becoming impatient with the progress of the struggle. There were mutterings from spokesmen from the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee after King had led about 2,000 Negroes across the Alabama River bridges on the road to Montgomery and then turned back to Selma. There was little doubt that a compromise had been worked out by federal mediators and that the players in the civil rights drama had struck closely to the script. Rockville-Vernon Board of Representatives Hold First Talks

The Vernon Board of Representatives met informally last night for the first time since the voters' election, with Mayor-elect Thomas J. McCusker presiding. Discussed at the meeting were: The starting salary range for the administrative assistant. The tax rate under a consolidated town government. The need for a charter revision committee. A 40-hour work week for town employees, similar to the schedule now worked by Rockville police. Need for street lights in rural Vernon. Selection of committees for the new board. Matters on the board's agenda were discussed in the presence of formal guests. The board is expected to meet again on April 12, 1965, to discuss the selection of the town clerk. The state Personnel Department will be used to advertise for applicants, and will then administer tests. Among the items agreed upon last night by the board was to place advertisements in the International City Managers Association journal. The board also selected from a number of preferred tests for the clerk, to score 60 percent on work experience and 40 percent on written and oral tests. Starting salary range for the administrative assistant is tentatively set at between \$8,000 to \$10,000, although members indicated the salary could be raised if it was thought necessary to attract suitable candidates. Costs of the testing for the town clerk will be between \$300 to \$500 plus advertising costs. McCusker, who prior to the election obtained information from the state department, said that the service provided by the state was non-profit and was used by many state municipalities. Other tests will also be administered by the state personnel department. Present department heads will be administered tests to determine the head of consolidated departments. Those who will be tested are the chief of the Rockville and the Vernon police departments; the head of Rockville's Public Works Department and the Vernon Highway Department and the Vernon and Rockville building inspectors. Another set of tests will be administered to applicants for the post of tax collector. Tax Rate Discussed The tax rate for the consolidated town was discussed by members. Two proposals were presented. Thomas Carruthers suggested that "if there is a possibility, hold the mill rate down and do some short-term borrowing if it becomes necessary." The second proposal, presented by Mayor-elect McCusker, was to ask the state legislature to pass a bill which would, if it became necessary, defer the setting of the mill rate from June 1, as required by the charter, to August 1. The reason for the proposal, the representative said, was because of the difficulties involved in determining the total receipts, surplus and deficits of the various town governments. The delaying action would give the board the opportunity to examine the various financial aspects of the town, and at the same time to begin financing of town departments and agencies, a step which would eliminate duplication of expenses. Among the financial considerations discussed were the several proposals in the general assembly to increase state aid to public education which could, if passed, increase state revenue to Vernon. McCusker also noted that he has contacted Chief Constable Edmund F. Dwyer of Vernon police and asked him to prepare a 40-hour work week schedule for his men. Vernon police now work 48 hours, while Rockville police were recently on a 40-hour work week. McCusker said that he has contacted Andrew Tricario of the Vernon Highway Department and asked him to set up costs of the department. Carruthers noted that Douglas Hayes, chairman of the Vernon Board of Finance, has offered his board's aid in financial matters. He accepted with thanks, McCusker said. Also entering the tax setting problem are the special services used by Rockville residents. According to the charter, the

services cannot be added to the regular mill rate, because only users would pay for the services, and the charter provides for "a single taxing district." The special service charges will be computed on a special assessment basis, according to tentative agreement of the board. Lighting for District City resident Amber Brooks, during a discussion of special services, said, "I think we should light the entire fire district. In favoring street lights, Brooks noted that according to his tentative figures, the tax rate under consolidation will go up in the district "about 2 1/2 mills, and should decrease slightly in the city." Brooks said his prediction was based on an increase in the grid load and no increased school costs. Brooks said his prediction was based on the fact that, under terms of the charter, city users of special services, sidewalk street lights, a garbage collection and sewer line s, would still be paid by the residents. The entire town, under the charter, would pay for the bonded indebtedness of the Rockville Fire Station. "According to the city's last budget," Brooks said, "there are costs of about \$68,000 for special service charges which would remain in the city. Everything else, about \$480,000, would be split throughout taxpayers of the entire town." The need for street lights at intersections in rural Vernon was stressed by the mayor-elect. McCusker indicated he would appoint a committee to discuss the problem, and said that this was one of his first objectives. Franklin G. Welles replied to McCusker's proposal, "I feel this is long past due." McCusker named a number of committees. They are: Salary and committee expenses, Finance, Deming, Brooks, Heck, Stewart Naff and Risley; Police, McCarthy, Blow, Thomas Carruthers; Atty. Bernard J. Ackerman; Rockville Police Chief George Trapp; Vernon Police Chief Edmund F. Dwyer; Vernon

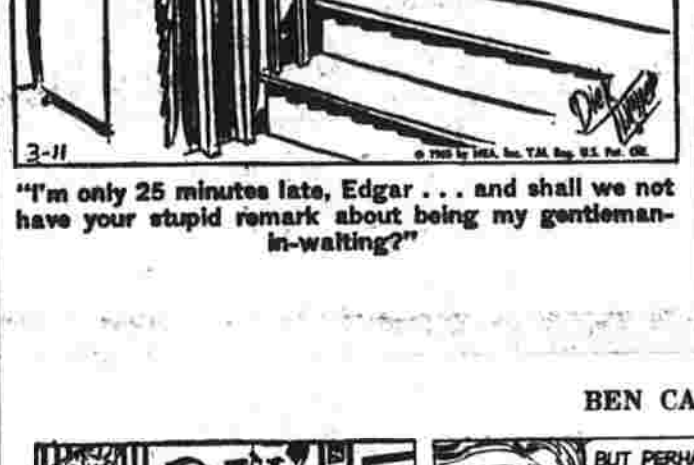
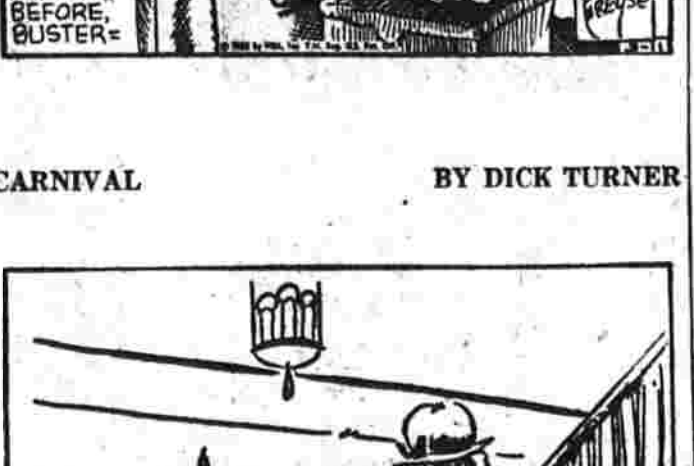
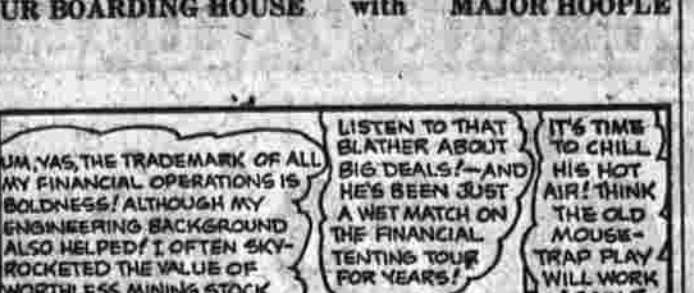
