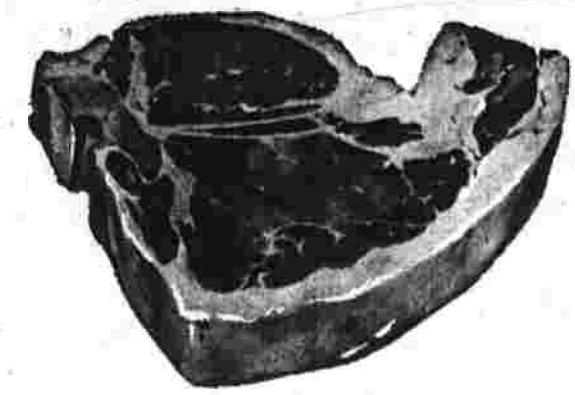

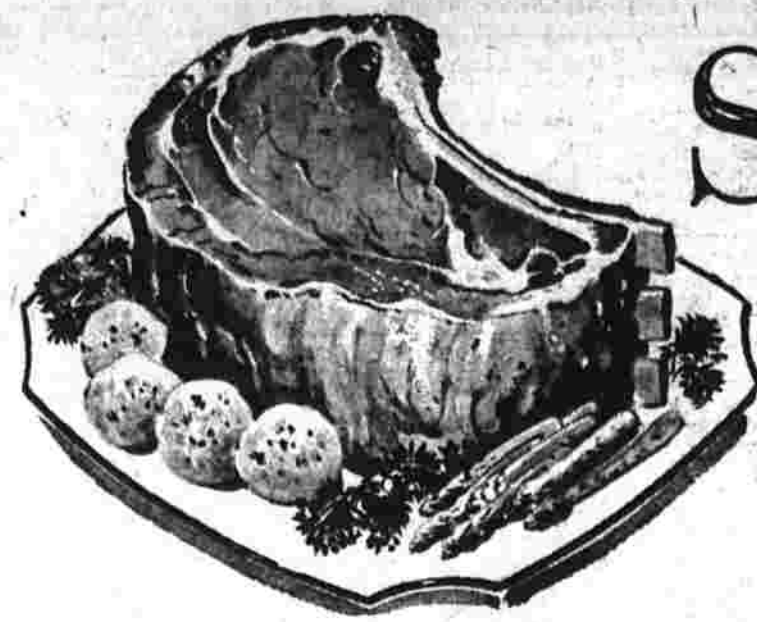

STAFFORD SPRINGS (AP)—A 17-year-old boy loaded his stepfather's shotgun Thursday night and shot him in the back as he slept on a couch, police said. The victim, Alfred A. Cormier, 47, of High St., died at a hospital here today. The stepson, Roger A. Bousley, was arrested at a nearby house in Rockville on a bench warrant charging homicide. Judge Alva Lohelle set a grand jury hearing for March 24. Bousley was ordered held without bond at the Tolland county state jail. Police Chief William F. Silk said Bousley admitted the shooting. Silk said the youth had been watching television while Cormier dozed on the couch. He then went to another room for the shotgun, loaded it and fired one shot at close range, the chief said.

GRASSE, France (AP)—A 15-year-old girl emerged from a cave 240 feet deep, was brought to the surface today. SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Gen. Harold K. Johnson wound up a one-week visit to this war-torn North Vietnam today and he believes that with continued American help, South Viet Nam can defeat its Viet Cong foes.

Johnson said the Viet Cong strikes from the De Nang air base as Johnson and his staff headed back to Washington from the mission which he said was to "look, listen and learn."

Johnson said he has been enormously encouraged by the quality of American performance in Viet Nam and by the quality of the Vietnamese leaders, especially at the Army division level.

He said the United States has all along seen the very best in Viet Nam and he will continue "until the insurance is exhausted."

WASHINGTON (AP)—The automobile industry plans to seek outright repeal of the 10 per cent excise tax on new passenger cars in the proposed mid-year reduction of "conformity" excise taxes, it was learned today.

Industry leaders are studying the possibility of a concerted effort, possibly including the formation of an industry-wide committee with headquarters in Washington, to back legislation along the general lines of the bill submitted about a month ago by Rep. Marsha Griffin, D-Mich.

The industry's major concern is that the reduction be made retroactive to the date of the beginning of congressional consideration, to forestall the possibility of an automobile buyers' strike while the measure is pending.

Full repeal of the excise would mean an average saving of about \$200 per new car. It is estimated by the House Ways and Means Committee last summer that the full amount would be passed on to the public.

Repatriation of the auto excise is scheduled for next year.

Plan Change In Contents Of Coinage

WASHINGTON (AP)—The administration has asked for controls on hoarding and melting of coins to accompany an expected change in silver content, authoritative sources said today. An announcement is expected about April 15 on whether the government intends to eliminate silver in the production of dimes, quarters and half-dollars. There is little chance that the silver content of coins will remain unchanged. Treasury officials have said the present high rate of silver coin production — with no change in the percentage used in each coin — eventually will produce a shortage of the metal. Even spokesmen from silver-producing areas have recommended that the silver content be reduced from 90 to 30 per cent, although they opposed eliminating all silver from coinage.

There are some \$4 billion coins in circulation, of which \$1.5 billion are silver. Mint production soon will be increased to an annual rate of more than 9 billion.

and politician and lawyer, who could and did claim that, during the Nazi days, he had helped some of those persecuted, to escape from the country.

Not every German was legally guilty of these crimes, the speaker said, but the whole nation shared "historic and moral guilt."

When Adolf Hitler had finished his speech, the president of the Bundestag, Dr. Eugen Gerstenmaier, expressed to him "the gratitude of this house for making precise the nature of the crimes with which we are engaged."

Thus another chapter in the self-examination of guilt and conscience by the people of Germany, and by the voting which accompanied the oratory, there will be no immunity, ever, for those Germans who have "legal" complicity in the crimes in question.

One quandary remains. From where and from whom does there ever come forgiveness? Can there be any forgiveness for such crimes? But if there can't be forgiveness for such crimes, how will the cycle ever stop?

Climate For Lyenko? In post-Khrushchev Russia, poor old Lyenko, with his romantic and almost naive ideas, has been read into scientific disgrace for his career-long insistence on trying to prove that environment can have influences equal to or greater than the dictate of heredity.

Down in free New York City, an American scientist, a Dr. Phyllis Erelash, a physical anthropologist, apparently in good standing, made a report to a conference on the biology of human variation.

In this report she compared the physical growth of American children who happened to be living in the climate of Rio de Janeiro with those of their contemporaries born to similar parents, but living in the cooler and drier climate of the United States.

Quite remarkably, the American children in Rio de Janeiro produced their permanent teeth sooner than their counterparts living in this country.

We don't really know what to make of this, except to suggest that, just as Rio de Janeiro is fancied, in television fiction at least, as a place for American financiers to go after they have unloaded too many false bonds or somebody, so perhaps it would be a kindly place for good old Lyenko to take exile, after his career-of-lying to defy the classic law of heredity.

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NRDD in Jeopardy, NRDD Vote Backed by Party Head

The four-town Northeast Refuse Disposal District (NRDD) last night, to all intents and purposes, took the first step toward dissolution and, although it remains a paper organization, its future under its present leadership is in jeopardy.

By falling for two thirds majority vote to endorse its own amended enabling act now in the hands of the General Assembly, it will continue to exist under the 1961 enabling statute, but with no financing power, as required and recommended by its bonding counsel.

The four-town Northeast Refuse Disposal District (NRDD) last night, to all intents and purposes, took the first step toward dissolution and, although it remains a paper organization, its future under its present leadership is in jeopardy.

Down while the White House yesterday was leading its prestige and its awe-making potentialities to expressions of sympathy with the demonstrators down in Alabama, and dedicating itself to action and programs which would insure the right to vote and the right to demonstrate for the right to vote, the White House was having its taste of demonstration.

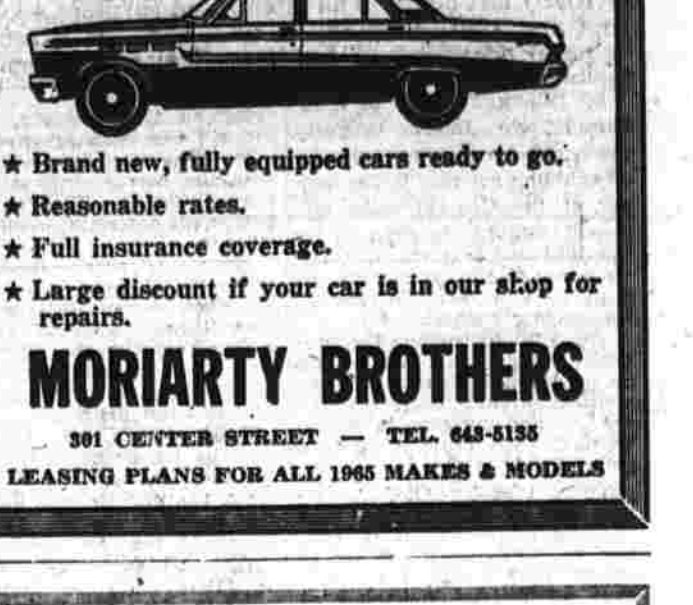

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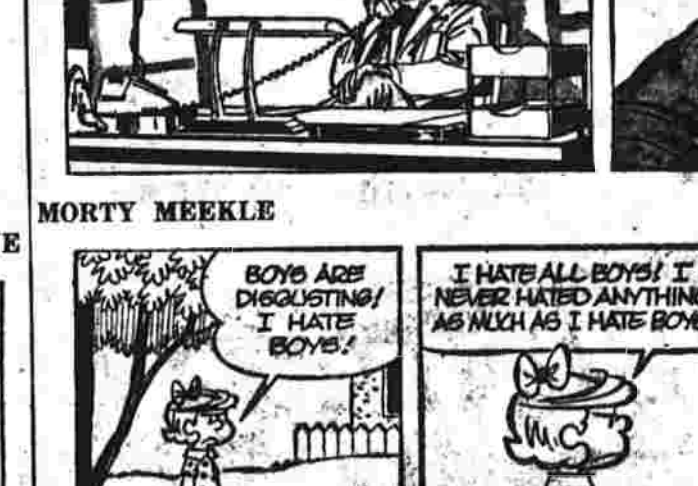
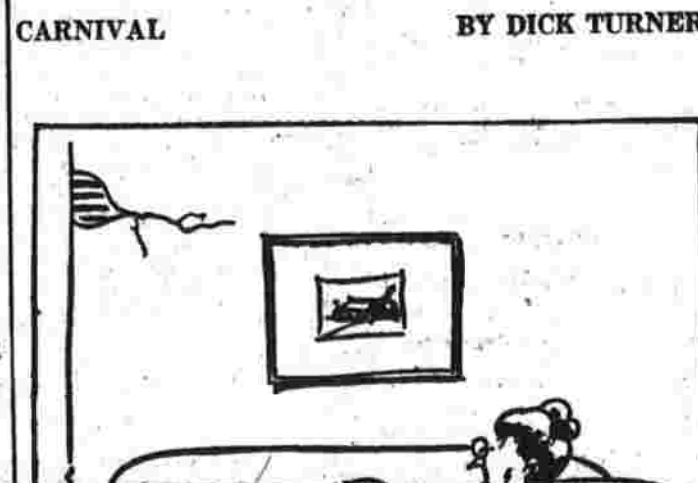
