

Welfare Costs

Town welfare payments is sued during February of this year topped by more than \$1,000 those issued during January involving 50 persons. Part of the increase is a result of the altered state regulations.

Much of the increase attributable to the change in the regulations is reimbursable, however.

Payments for the first two months of 1965 were considerably below payments issued during the same period in 1964, despite the jump in February.
