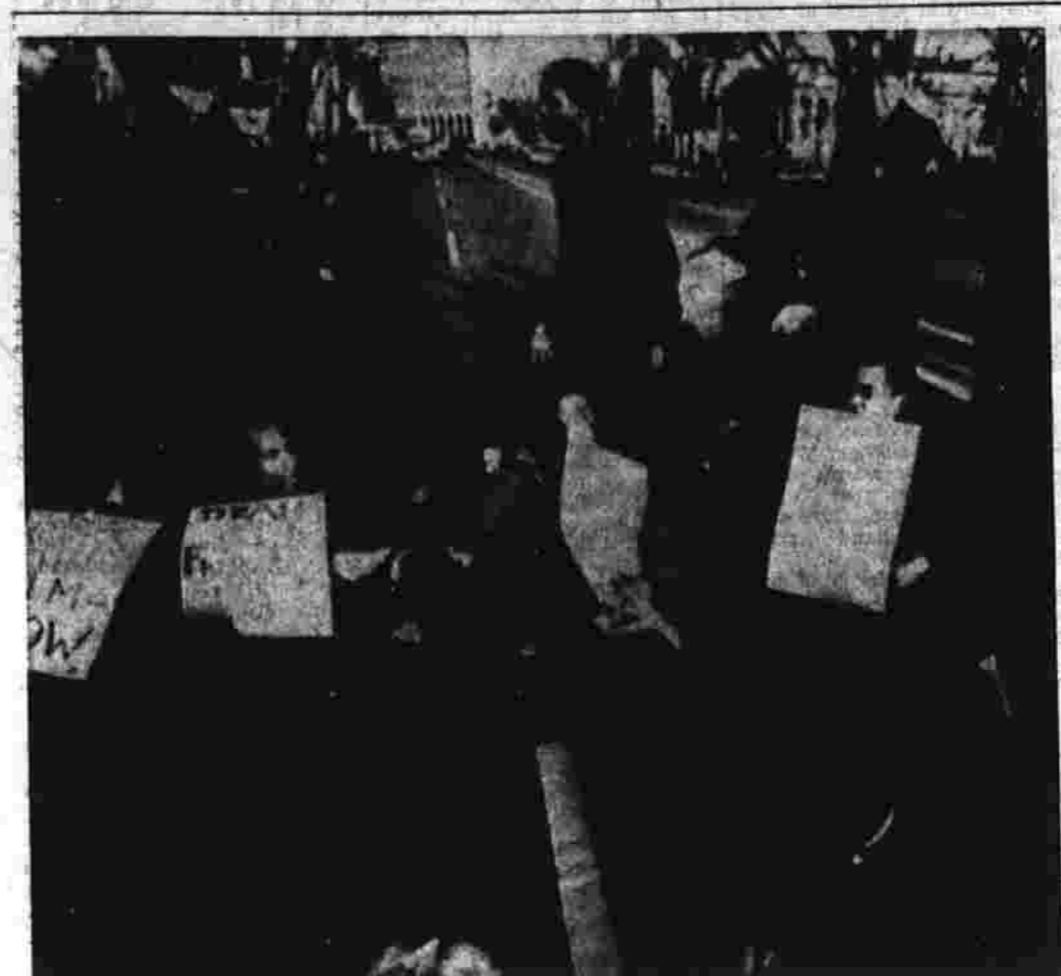

### Teachers Back MEA Stand On Salaries and Contracts

The results of a membership poll conducted last week by the Manchester Education Association (MEA) indicate that about 86 per cent of Manchester school teachers disapprove of the proposed salary schedule and that a majority favor withholding signatures from any agreement.

The vote, announced last night by Robert Wolfert, president of the Manchester Education Association, showed that 330 are dissatisfied with the schedule voted by the board last month. Only 47 teachers approved it.

"Write a letter number voted in favor of withholding signatures—330 said yes, 47 said no," President Wolfert said that the MEA would go ahead with the action.

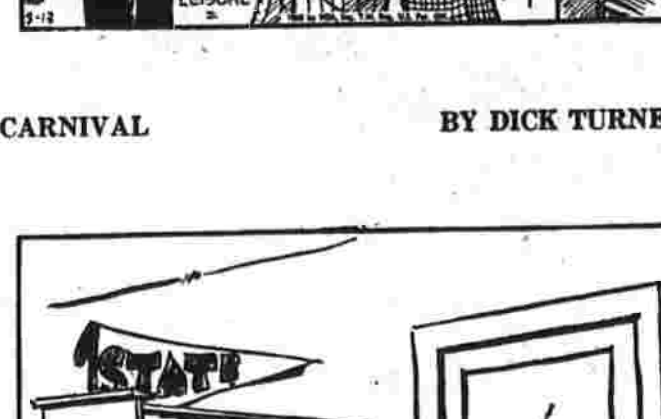

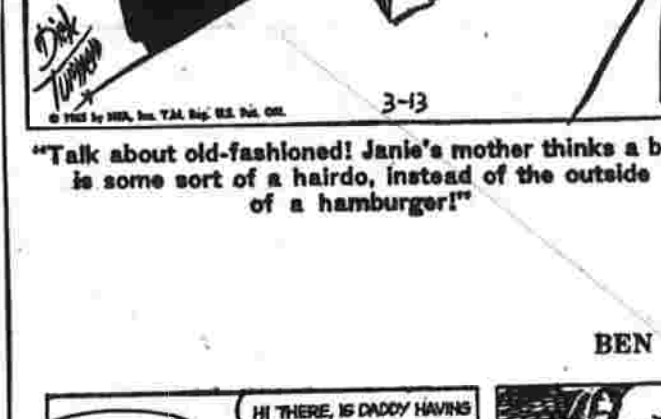

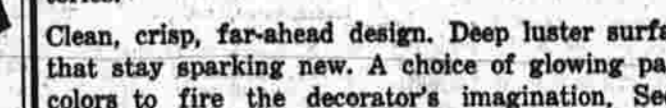

Peter Jennings, ABC's handsome young newsman, is learning it is hard to be a gentleman in New York City.

He tried to give a middle-aged woman a seat in a crowded subway and "she thought I was trying to make a pass. She gave me a filthy look and refused to sit down. I got very embarrassed — everybody was staring — and I finally said, 'I'm from Canada where I would get a worse look than you are now giving me if I didn't offer you a seat.'"

Ink on the Guest

"I'm determined to have guts on the show. Someone once told me that a good mistake is better than a flawless performance. I keep hoping some evening that the world contained in that studio will come crashing down around my shoulders so I can react to it.

"The thought of protecting one's image is appalling. I have made a lot of mistakes and they are always in public. But you survive."

Next Season

Color Breakthrough

NEW YORK (AP) — Tentative schedules of the three major networks sound neither novel nor exciting, but 1965-66 may prove to be a turning point: The year of the big color breakthrough.

NBC announced earlier this week that 27 of its 29 regularly scheduled evening programs next season would be colorcasts — 98 per cent compared with about 70 per cent this season.

ABC has been increasing the number of its color shows over the past two seasons from a point where only its cartoon shows were tinted.

The big foot-dragger in color has been CBS which has had a policy of supplying color shows only when sponsors asked for them. Tuesday there was a change in executive thinking.

John A. Schneider, appointed last week as president of the CBS TV network, said in his first official announcement that both "The Red Skelton Show" and "The Danny Kaye Show" would go to color in the fall. Both are ideally suited to it.

NBC recently declared there were about 2,800,000 color sets in use in the country and predicted the total would reach 5,000,000 by next year.

While this is a respectable number, it still represents a fraction of the more than 50,000,000 TV-equipped homes in the country. But it is enough, obviously, to lead Schneider to state that "the level of color television set ownership now warrants color broadcasts on a weekly basis this fall" on CBS. In addition to the two variety

shows, he said, the network would schedule a number of specials in color. Recently CBS showed "Cinderella" in color.

Not all television stations are presently able to broadcast color. CBS says that 163 of its 208 stations are equipped to handle it.

Color improves a poor program and works miracles with a good one, but it is not a panacea for all television ills.

"The Pope and the Vatican," on NBC Tuesday night, was a good example. The news program underook to illustrate the change in the Roman Catholic church, to shed some light on the personality of Pope Paul VI, to show some of the ancient and beautiful ceremonies of the church and to show some portions of the Vatican — a large order.

Much of the color film was a delight to the eye but most of the time it was accompanied by a dry-as-dust commentary in an expressionless voice by NBC Rome correspondent Irving R. Levine. The result was a long lecture that arrived much too late in the evening to be appreciated.

Red Skelton, introducing Ed Wynn on his program Tuesday night, told how Wynn, an important vaudeville star, was appearing in Vincennes, Ind., and bought all the papers of an eight-year-old newsboy so the boy could attend a performance.

The boy, of course, was Skelton and it was his first exposure to an audience.

The ex-newsboy virtually did a one-man show and Wynn stood by, applauding with affection and appreciation.

Two Days of Rehearsals Enough for Red Skelton

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "Little Red and I have a system of dealing with friends who do something bad to us," said Red Skelton, referring to his wife Georgia. "We go out to our tea house, have some iced tea and think of five things we like about the person.

"If the same friend does something bad again, we consider him dead. And you can't say anything bad about the dead, can you?"

The comedian was sitting in his CBS dressing room during a rehearsal break from his television show and telling how he has insulated himself against the misfortunes that sometimes have afflicted his personal life and profession. He has known them all, from betrayal of business associates to loss of his son by leukemia.

Out of all this has come Skelton the philosopher, a man who leads a monastic life although he entertains millions every week.

Red spends two days of each week at CBS' television city. That is all the time he devotes to the show. He reasons: "All you need is the material to work with and the audience to try it on. They'll tell you if it's any good. If it isn't, you fix it until it is. You don't need more than a day for that.

"I don't understand these shows that take five weeks to put on. Seems to me they get awfully arty."

As soon as the show is taped Tuesday night, he leaves for his home in Palm Springs. He gets there in an hour and 10 minutes by air.

His daily routine for the five days on the desert is a miracle of simplicity. He rises at five, makes breakfast for his daughter,

Valentins, washes the dishes, writes a song, goes into town on errands with Georgia, writes another song and perhaps a short story, works in the gardens. (He has a Japanese garden on one side of the house, an Italian garden on the other). At night he starts and finishes a painting, usually ending after midnight.

The songwriting is a recent kick. He pushed a button and a tape recorder began playing some — a folk ballad, a calypso number, an Irish jig.

"The Irish number will be our production dance on the St. Patrick's show," Red said proudly. "I use some of the others for background music in the 'Silent Spot.' I'll be having a record album of the songs, too."

Red's pursuit of hobbies doesn't mean that he is any less devoted to his career, even though he claims, "those two days I spend on the show louse up my whole week."

During the two days he works with intensity, applying all the knowhow he has accumulated through 40 years of entertaining.

He has firm notions about how his comedy should be presented. When he was shifted to the 8 p.m. time slot last season, he rebelled.

"That's too early for my show," he said. "It takes most families until 8:30 to get their arguments over, finish the dishes and sit down to television. In the Midwest the show was coming on at 7, which is too early for the farmers. Another thing, kids use my show to stay up later, at 8 o'clock that doesn't work."

Red figures it cost him \$6 million to gain back the 8:30 time — he had to relinquish the following half-hour, which he owned. But after a season of up-and-down ratings, he bounced right back into the top 10 this year.

**Some Shows Cut Really Dismal**

 NEW YORK (AP) — Members of television's vast audience are accustomed by this time to the zests, slings and arrows directed toward our taste buds (bad), our mentality (13-year-old) and our entertainment affections (stupid).  
 A quick inspection of current television programs which seem fated to disappear soon, all of them victims of audience inattention, bolts all the charges. For instance, among the casualties in a long list are such dismal entries as "My Living Doll," on CBS, which was such a fragile comedy craft that one of the co-stars, Robert Cummings, deserted in mid-season. NBC mercifully shortened the life of such entries as "Harriet Against the World" and "Tom, Dick and Mary," and probably would have removed "Karen" earlier had it not committed itself to a full season of showrunners. Almost nobody mourned the rapid departure of "Mickey" from ABC, and only rabid Bing Crosby fans will miss the personality situation comedy in which he emerged this season. "Wendy and Me," in spite of George Burns' presence on ABC, turned out to be warmed-over Gracie Allen comedy, just as CBS' "The Carra Williams Show" was warmed-over Lucille Ball.  
 In the list of the 30 or so shows which have been and will be done away with after this season, the majority turned out to be second and third rate shows based on trite, overworked ideas.  
 But in addition to those which fell from their own weight, there are also some that were pushed. Notable in this category is NBC's "The Rogues," which was scheduled in a difficult spot late Sunday evening at a time when the week-end was being dominated by two CBS comedy shows. And, unless there is a last-minute change of heart at CBS, the pending demise of "Alfie Dieterson" must be chalked up as murder by schedule: moving the dramatic series from an early evening to a late Thursday night spot where it languished.  
 A few other programs seem to be expiring from simple, un-complicated old age. "Wagon Train" and "The Alfred Hitchcock Hour" have been around so long their stories and format had lost their excitement. "The Jack Benny Show" was finding it difficult to raise new wrinkles on 30-year-old jokes. "International Showtime" had firmed just about every foreign citrus act.  
 Most of us turn to television for amusement and entertain-ment. It looks as if my judgment and taste are pretty good. Recommended weekend viewing:

## Battle on 'Gomer Pyle' Fanned by Frank Sutton

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — A principal reason for this season's success of "Gomer Pyle — U.S.M.C." is the hot and cold war between Gomer and Sgt. Carter, possibly the best military feud since Quirt and Flagg of "What Price Glory."

They make a prize pair — the ingenious trouble-magnet Gomer as played by Jim Nabors and the harassed sergeant, etched in slow-burn by Frank Sutton.

The series has ended its first season of shooting, so Frank had a chance to catch his breath and tell about his life before and after Gomer. Like Jim, the pride of Sylacauga, Ala., Frank is a Southerner, from Clarksville, Tenn. Unlike Jim, who has been in show business hardly two years, Frank is an acting veteran.

"It started as far back as junior high school, when I appeared in a YMCA play entitled, 'Romance in the Boarding House,'" he recalls. "I got my first line switched, and it was a big laugh. Everything I did drew laughs, and I was hooked. After that, my friends knew me as 'the actor'."

Frank did some radio announcing before entering military service in World War II — not, ironically enough, in the Marines.

"I was colorblind, or at least color-confused," he said. "None of the services would take me — except the Army. They weren't particular."

Frank drew plenty of experience with the Marine Corps. He trained with amphibious forces at Camp Pendleton, Ore., and endured 14 assault landings of the 8th Infantry and 1st Marine Division in the South Pacific including Corregidor.

After the war he studied drama at Columbia University and tried the theater and television. His luck was sometimes good, sometimes nil.

"I don't know how I would have survived except for my wife, who was willing to work and help support us," said Frank. Survive he did, plodding through dreary afternoon television dramas while waiting for stage roles to come along. No leading-man type, he generally was cast several decades older than his real age — "I lost an inch of hairline from putting that white stuff on my hair."

Eventually his roles caught up with his age, and he was able to make a respectable living as a character actor. Sgt. Carter was largely an accident. "Gomer" mentor Aaron Rubin liked his reading of the role. "I had never done comedy before," said Frank. "If he had seen what I had done, I probably never would have been given the role."

## 'Editors' Show Is Extended

"Starring The Editors" has just completed its first six months on the air, and, under the continued sponsorship of Foodmarts of Connecticut and Western Massachusetts and their product suppliers, opened a new 13-week series of programs.

That program is now in its 15th consecutive successful year on television.

Panelists scheduled for appearance on this week's Connecticut Valley program include Webster Gault of the Hartford Courant, Robert Lucas of the Hartford Times, Harold LeVanway of the Greenfield Recorder-Gazette, and Edward O'Dea of the Hampshire Gazette.

Explorations of the sea are the topic on ABC documentary, "Man Invades the Sea," Thursday 10-11 p.m. The noted underwater explorer Jacques-Yves Cousteau will appear.
