The press could not live, democracy could not live, and justice itself could iot live in any county, state or nation where the public could not have access to that information which would lead it to judge how the enforcement of law being handled.

Between the just goals of a protection of the rights of an accused, the guarantee of conditions for fairness of trial, and the crude, sweeping letter of the prohibitions State's Attorney La-Belle has been talking about, there is a world of difference—the difference between open democracy and closed toalitarianism. No one who knows the State's Attorney has the slightest doubt which world has his own ultimate allegiance. But in that good democratic world there has to be some portion of live and let live between two mutual watchdogs, and never any serious attempt by the one to forbid the

watch to the other. As for this particular newspaper, we claim credit for at least a moderate display of discretion and responsibility in our reporting of news of arrests in the past, and we intend to continue to find access to, and to publish, such news facts as the public requires and deserves in order to keep a third watch of its own. If we have to, we shall not hesitate to ask reasonable factual questions of State Police Commissioner Leo Mulcahy, Police Chief James Reardon, or State's Attorney John LaBelle, and we shall expect, as in the past, answers which are reasonable in the light of the particular circumstances of the particular case. If there is one blanket rule to be applied to the relationship between free institutions and free servants of one common democracy, it is that there can he no blanket rules.

## The Score: Any Coercion?

It was last August when we first openly sent planes to bomb North Vietnam, to warn that country it wasn't dealing with any soft pushover. Nonetheless, a few weeks later, just

before election, the Viet Cong committed the crime of making a fairly successful attack against an American installation in South Vietnam. Presumably because we didn't want to extend the war around voting day, we did noth-

surprised even themselves by the ease with which they created midnight havoc n another American camp, we inaugurated the official policy of retaliation, and we sent bombers openly to North etnam. The policy of retaliation, at first just retaliation for any success the merrillas might attain against Amerians, and then, retaliation for success the guerrillas might have against South nese too, soon evolved, in Washington language into something that was not retaliation but attack at will. We on't think there is a new official name or it yet, but we think it might be

alled a war of coercion. The theory is, that if we hit North Vietnam often enough and hard enough, we can corree North Vietnam into cut-

tions of the guerrillas down in South

That is the theory, and we have been bombing across the border at will, and we have been bombing more severely and we have been bombing closer to Hanol the capital city of North Viet-

After each bombing, or each group

of bombings, we have paused and wait-, to assess the situation anew. We have, after each bombing, been looking for three particular things. First, nervously, we have been looking for signs that either Communist China or Soviet Russia or both together might be on the verge of really coming to the

veler, North Vietnam. So far, our official judgment has obviously been, after each bombing, that we continue safe from that peril and its big threat of making World War III materialize for us and everybody.

The second thing we watch, after each bombing exploit, is the behavior of North Vietnam. Has it used a lot of Have there been Communist planes in the air anywhere? Do we observe any great movement of North Vietnam's army toward the border?

It seems quite apparent that, so far, North Vietnam has been reacting as if it were not able to do much more than make public complaints over our "ag-

So far, then, our observations or these two points-the behavior of Russia and China, and the behavior of North Vietnam inside North Vietnam-have been reassuring, and indicate that we have been getting away with our policy of pounding North Vietnam whenever and wherever it pleases us.

All this time we have, as well, been watching a third thing, and this is the thing which directly concerns our own professed purpose in bombing North Vietnam. We have been watching the behavior and the strength of the guerrillas in South Vietnam.

We have been watching the guerrillas in number, whether they have more or fewer and bigger or smaller guns and equipments, whether their tactics are more or less aggressive. This is the crucial part of the score-

keeping in Vietnam. When we hit something up in North Vietnam, the result is supposed to be that the guerrillas in South Vietnam stop fighting, or disappear, or come out of the jungle with their hands up, or throw away their guns, or stop receiving supplies or arms or reinforcement from any outside

So far as one can judge from the continued worry at Washington, together with the continued action th Vietnam, the score is not yet proving anything like what it is supposed to be.

Instead of ceasing their operations. they are trying to extend them. Instead of showing up with less equipment, they seem to have more equipment than ever before. In fact, they no longer seem dependent on the American arms and ammunition we have been sending them, these many months, courtesy, of course, of our South Vietnamese allies.

So far, then, after every "retaliation" or "strike at will" on our part, all we have been able to observe in South Vietnam is that the guerrillas are more numerous, and bolder, and better armed. Instead of acting as if they were getting ready to give up the war, as per the instructions delivered by our bombers in

North Vietnam, they act as if they were just beginning to warm up to the fight. Washington reports a few days ago, during one of our longest pauses between bombings, had it that our experts were puzzled by it all, and couldn't quite decide why our policy waan't working as it should. One possibility under consideration was that there hadn't been time for the word to seep down from North Vietnam to the guerrillas out in the jungles of South Vietnam.

Now, apparently, we have decided that isn't the trouble. We have resumed bombing, more heavily, and closer to Hanoi. We have decided, apparently, that our previous messages weren't heavy enough. Will the war of coercion work? Does

the nation which starts it as a theory and a tactic ever find the point where it can halt its own escalation without having achieved its announced goal? Where, in short, does President Johnson go, if the guerrillas never heed his

So far, this administration's great tac tic, its war of coercion, has not worked, It begins to look as if the pattern might not change in regulation time, and as if the thing might go into sudden death overtime.






